Congratulations to the United States Coast Guard, today is their 216th birthday

The United States Coast Guard traces their history back to August 4, 1790, when the first Congress authorized the construction of ten vessels, called cutters, to enforce tariff and trade laws, prevent smuggling, and protect the collection of federal revenue. They were known variously as the Revenue Marine and the Revenue Cutter Service and expanded in size and responsibilities as the nation grew.

These responsibilities included aiding mariners in distress, enforcing laws against slavery, piracy and preventing smuggling. They were also responsible for protecting the marine environment, exploring and policing Alaska, and charting the growing nation's coastlines, all well before the turn of the twentieth century.

The service was renamed in 1915 under an act of Congress when the Revenue Cutter Service merged with the Life-Saving Service. They began to maintain the country's aids to maritime navigation, including operating lighthouses, when the Lighthouse Service was transferred to the Coast Guard in 1939. In 1946, Congress transferred the Bureau of Marine Inspection and Navigation to the Coast Guard.

In times of peace the Coast Guard operates as part of the Department of Homeland Security, serving as the nation's front-line agency for enforcing our laws at sea, protecting our coastline and ports and saving life. In times of war, or on direction of the President, the Coast Guard serves under the Navy.

The Coast Guard's motto is "Semper Paratus" – Always Ready.

Did you know: In 1790, when the Revenue Marine/Revenue Cutter Service was established by the First Congress of the United States these ships were the only maritime force available to the new government under the Constitution (the Continental Navy had been disbanded in 1785). So, between 1790 and 1798, there was no United States Navy and the cutters were the only warships protecting the coast, trade and maritime interests of the United States.

What is a Freedom Loan?

- * Up to \$10,000
- * Annual APR 6%
- * Term: 5 years (no pre-payment penalty)
- * Unsecured Loan (no collateral required)

Who is eligible to apply?

NJ residents who are:

- * Members of the National Guard or Reserve
- * Mobilized for one year or longer to fight in the Global War on Terrorism (GWOT) - excluding routine training.

Or

- * Served 90 or more consecutive days in the GWOT on federal or state active duty (excluding routing training) and have received orders extending cumulative active duty a year or longer.

How do I apply?

- * Contact participating banks. Call or visit your local branch office to obtain an application.

General policy. As a matter of long-standing policy, DoD personnel acting in their official capacities may not engage in activities that associate DoD with any partisan political campaign or election, candidate, cause or issue.

Public commentary by military personnel. All military personnel, including National Guard and Reserve forces, acting in their official capacities may not engage in public commentary, including speeches and written submissions offered for publication, concerning political campaigns or elections absent prior clearance.

Vets' federal hiring preference changes for Guard, Reserve

Beginning June 9, National Guard and reserve members released from active duty will get the same veterans' hiring preference for federal jobs as those who are separated or retired from regular active-duty assignments.

Under the new rules, which Congress approved last year as part of the 2006 Defense Authorization Act, the definition of a veteran expands for the purposes of getting extra credit when seeking a federal job. Previously, veterans' preference applied only to people "separated" from active duty under honorable conditions.

Under the new policy, hiring preference would extend to any person discharged or released from active duty if they had more than 180 consecutive days of duty since Sept. 11, 2001, served in a war or in a campaign for which a campaign badge or expeditionary medal was authorized. Also, the person who is discharged or released must have received an honorable or general discharge.
