For information or to make a donation, call 609-530-7049 and Ethics rules prohibit persons from being employed in the unclassified service of the civil service in any office or position of the State over which a relative exercises authority, supervision, or control. Unclassified employees may not work for relatives under any circumstances.

Further, employees, officers, and special state officers may not supervise or exercise any authority with regard to personnel actions with respect to any relative, cohabitant or person with whom the officer or employee has a dating relationship. When such a relationship exists with a classified employee, the "senior" person must formally remove her/himself from supervisory and personnel action authority.

from any person or entity under circumstances from which it might be reasonably inferred that the thing was given or offered in order to influence the discharge of official duties. Some things of value are obvious, such as money, real estate, or automobiles. But less obvious things also have value, including offers of employment, loans, price discounts, entertainment, and meals.

State employees are required to disclose and turn in to the Department's Ethics Officer any offer or receipt of a thing of value from any person or entity. If keeping the gift is allowed it will be returned to you. If it is inappropriate under the ethics rules to accept the gift, the Ethics Officer will return it directly to the donor or, if it is perishable, give it to a nonprofit entity in the name of the donor.
