DMAVA Celebrates the Life of Martin Luther King, Jr.

(January 15, 1929 - April 4, 1968)

The Martin Luther King, Jr. Day celebrates the life and legacy of a man who brought hope and healing to America. The holiday commemorates the timeless values he taught us through his example -- the values of courage, truth, justice, compassion, dignity, humility and service that so radiantly defined Dr. King's character and empowered his leadership. On this holiday, we commemorate the universal, unconditional love, forgiveness and nonviolence that empowered his revolutionary spirit.

We commemorate Dr. King's inspiring words, because his voice and his vision filled a great void in our nation, and answered our collective longing to become a country that truly lived by its noblest principles. Yet, Dr. King knew that it wasn't enough just to talk the talk, that he had to walk the walk for his words to be credible. And so we commemorate on this holiday the man of action, who put his life on the line for freedom and justice every day, the man who braved threats and jail and beatings and who ultimately paid the highest price to make democracy a reality for all Americans.

The King Holiday honors the life and contributions of America's greatest champion of racial justice and equality, the leader who not only dreamed of a color-blind society, but who also led a movement that achieved historic reforms to help make it a reality.

On this day we commemorate Dr. King's great dream of a vibrant, multiracial nation united in justice, peace and reconciliation; a nation that has a place at the table for children of every race and room at the inn for every needy child. We are called on this holiday, not merely to honor, but to celebrate the values of equality, tolerance and interracial sister and brotherhood that he so compellingly expressed in his great dream for America.

It is a day of interracial and intercultural cooperation and sharing. No other day of the year brings so many peoples from different cultural backgrounds together in such a vibrant spirit of brother and sisterhood. Whether you are African-American, Hispanic or Native American, whether you are Caucasian or Asian-American, you are part of the great dream Martin Luther King, Jr. had for America. This is not a black holiday; it is a peoples' holiday. And it is the young people of all races and religions who hold the keys to the fulfillment of his dream.

In a continuing effort to celebrate Diversity in the workplace and in the communities we serve, DMAVA celebrates the contributions of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and their importance to the nation in the past, present and future.

The History of the New Jersey National Guard (Part 1)

Peace And Safety

The New Jersey National Guard or Militia pre-dates the state of New Jersey and the formation of the United States. Its roots go back to 1664 when the General Assembly of New Jersey was granted self-government privileges by Governor Philip Carteret, the first English Governor of New Jersey. The Assembly immediately moved... "to constitute trained bands and companies,...for the safety, strength, and defense of the said province...To suppress all mutinies and rebellions; to make war, offensive and defensive, with all Indians, strangers, and foreigners".

When the General Assembly met again in 1668, the first law they passed was one relating to the Militia:

"In order to the better providing for the Peace and Safety of the Inhabitants of the Province, and the more ready accustoming our Soldiers to an expert handling of their arms. It is enacted, that the soldiers in every Town within this Province from sixteen [years] old to sixty, shall train or be mustered, at least four days in the year, and oftener if the chief military officer in the Place shall see it needful, vix., two days in the Spring, and two days in the Autumn, and there shall be at least ten days, between each training day: and in case any chief officer, constituted and commissioned, for that purpose, shall wittingly or willfully neglect the same, shall forfeit for every day's Neglect twenty Shillings, to the Public, and for every Soldier not exempted and freed in this Law, who shall neglect to attend their Duty, when required and according to their accustomed Manner, agreed upon in every Place for sufficient Warning of their training Days, by their chief military officer, appointed and allowed according to their Concessions, either by his Absence or Refusal to bring his Arms into the Field, for every day's neglect, five shillings, and for half a day, two Shillings and Sixpence, and for late coming, one Shilling, unless their Reasons be satisfactory to the Officers of train'd bands in every Place. And to the Clerk of each Band shall have Power to Collect the said Fines of their defective soldiers..."

Not only was every male within the province from 16 years to 60 required to serve in the militia, but furthermore, he had to provide "at his own cost and charge, a good and sufficient firelock gun, one pound of powder, 24 bullets fitted to the gun..., powder horn to carry afore-said powder".

New Jersey Freedom Loans

What is a Freedom Loan?

- * Up to \$10,000
- * Annual APR 6%
- * Term: 5 years (no pre-payment penalty)
- * Unsecured Loan (no collateral required)

Who is eligible to apply?

NJ residents who are:

- * Members of the National Guard or Reserve
- * Mobilized for one year or longer to fight in the Global War on Terrorism (GWOT) - excluding routine training.

Or

- * Served 90 or more consecutive days in the GWOT on federal or state active duty (excluding routine training) and have received orders extending cumulative active duty a year or longer.

How do I apply?

- * Contact participating banks. Call or visit your local branch office to obtain an application.

"Troops to Teachers" program helps service members become teachers

Pensacola, Fla. - Troops to Teachers, the government program helping former military members become public school teachers, has broken the 9,500 mark in hires. Latest data shows that 9,502 teachers have been hired through the program since 1994, with Troops to Teachers represented in more than 3,000 school districts across the country.

Troops to Teachers (www.ProudtoServeAgain.com) is administered by the Department of Defense and Department of Education and managed by the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES). The program helps eligible military personnel begin second careers as public school teachers by providing referral assistance, placement services, and - for those electing to teach at high-need schools - financial stipends and bonuses.

Members of the National Guard and Reserves with 10 or more years of service are eligible for the program, provided they commit for an additional three years.

Family Readiness Council offers Tier I and II grants

The New Jersey National Guard State Family Readiness Council has expanded its Family Grants Program to include an additional grant. There are now two levels of Family Grants; TIER I is the \$2,500 grant that has been in place for the past couple of years. The TIER II opens family grants to New Jersey Army and Air National Guard non-deployed service members who were on State Active Duty or State Missions (e.g., hurricanes, floods, border missions) for more than 20 consecutive days. Service members meeting these criteria are eligible to apply for a financial hardship grant up to \$1,500. Applications are available at all New Jersey Army and Air National Guard Family Assistance Centers.

Two \$2,500 scholarships will be awarded by the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Foundation. Defense Commissary Agency offers scholarships

The Defense Commissary Agency (DeCA) announced last week that the application process for its Scholarships for Military Children program has now begun for 2007. Applications for the \$1,500 scholarships are available at 264 commissaries worldwide, or can be downloaded through links at <http://www.commissaries.com/>, <http://www.militaryscholar.org/>, or <http://www.dodea.edu/>. The program is open to unmarried children under the age of 21 (23 if enrolled in school) of military active-duty, Reserve, Guard and retired personnel. Eligibility will be determined using the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System database. Applicants should ensure that they, as well as their sponsor, are enrolled in the DEERS database and have a current ID card. The applicant must be planning to attend, or already attending, an accredited college, or university full-time in the fall term of 2007 or enrolled in a program of studies designed to transfer directly into a four-year program. Applications for 2007, which includes an essay on "how and why" the applicant would change an historical event, must be turned in at a commissary by close of business on **February 21, 2007**. At least one \$1,500 scholarship will be awarded at every commissary location with qualified applicants.
