The History of the New Jersey National Guard (Part 2)

"The Jersey Blues"

New Jersey's colonists had ample opportunity to acquaint themselves with warfare. Incursions by bands of Indiana and French from Canada were not uncommon, and the colony responded often with men and money.

Early in 1755 the provincial government of New Jersey authorized the raising of five companies for service against the French. By May their organization was complete, and they were combined into a regiment. Shortly thereafter they were ordered to the northern frontier under command of Colonel Peter Schuyler, a provincial officer who had commanded the troops from New Jersey during campaigns in 1746-1748. Since the new Regiment wore blue uniforms they were named "The Jersey Blues".

Apparently the Regiment returned to New Jersey for the winter 1755-1756. In the spring of 1756 it returned north where half of it was stationed at Schnectady, New York., and the other half at Oswego. This latter part which was captured, along with Schuyler himself, by Montcalm's army on 14 August. The command then went to Captain John Parker Along with the ill-luck. On 21 July 1757, the Regiment lost heavily in an affair at Sabbath Day Point, and the following month all the men and officers who remained (301) were captured at the fall of Fort William Henry and placed on parole for eighteen months.

In the spring of 1758 the Regiment was augmented, or re-raised, under command of Colonel John Johnson, and took part in a disastrous campaign against Fort Ticonderoga. At this time the unit consisted of almost 1,000 men. In 1759, it was again recruited up to this number and the command was once more given to Peter Schuyler (who had been released). It served until November, 1959.

It was raised by the act of 25 March 1760 to 1,000 men and employed chiefly at Oswego with a company of rangers attached. In 1761, it was raised to a strength of 600 men and officers and served until November. One company continued in service through the winter, and the following spring the Regiment was recruited up to 665 men and officers. It is not clear if the command served in 1763, but the next year the Regiment was raised once more to 600 men and served that summer at Oswego. Apparently it was then finally disbanded.

The New Jersey Regiment was a superior unit in all ways. It enjoyed a splendid reputation for discipline, character of personnel, dress, and general reliability. After the regiment passed through New York in June 1758, a newspaper called them "the likeliest well-set Men for the purpose as has perhaps been turned out on any Campaign...their uniform blue, faced with red, grey stockings and Buckskin Britches." Governor Barnard of New Jersey wrote William Pitt in March of the next year that "...these men are sent into the field in a different manner from those of most other provinces; they are completely clothed in a handsome uniform & furnished with all necessaries and they are muster'd to a Man: in both which articles several of the other provinces are greatly deficient."

The Act of the New Jersey Assembly which authorized the regiment in 1758 provided

for a "blue Coat, after the Highland Manner, Lappell'd and cuff with red, one pair of Ticken Bretches one Blue ditto of the same cloth of their Coat, one Check Shirt, and one white ditto, two pair yarn Stockings, two pair of Shoes, one Hat to each Man, bound with yellow binding, one blanket, one knapsack, one hatchet, one can teen, one Camp Kettle to five men, a pair of White Spatterdashes and also one hundred Grenadiers Caps for one hundred of the said soldiers and two felling axes for the whole Regiment".

New Jersey still raises and maintains the "trained bands and companies", and while today they are called the New Jersey Army and Air National Guard, they still have within them the spirit of the colonial Jersey Blues.

Deployed Military Spouses Assistance Program Award

Governor Jon S. Corzine awarded \$150,000 through the Deployed Military Spouses Program to benefit families of New Jersey's deployed military. The Governor was joined by Department of Community Affairs (DCA) Commissioner Susan Bass Levin and Maj. Gen. Glenn K. Rieth, the Adjutant General of New Jersey at the Burlington County YMCA in Mount Laurel.

"The least we can do for the brave men and women who are serving our country is help ensure that their families are taken care of while they are away," said Governor Corzine. "It is important for these families to understand that they have the full support of New Jersey."

The Deployed Military Spouses Assistance Program provides direct assistance and referrals to existing programs for spouses of deployed military personnel (Active Duty, Reserve and National Guard) who face unusual financial and emotional stress as a result of the deployments. High levels of deployment have contributed to an increased need for services to spouses who are experiencing financial and emotional stress.

The DCA awarded \$100,000 to the Women's Opportunity Center in early 2006. As of September 30, 2006, the program awarded 69 grants to 64 families from bases and armories throughout the state. The awards ranged from \$76 to \$2500.

"Few citizens of New Jersey will fully understand the sacrifices that the families of our deployed service members make every day," said Maj. Gen. Rieth. "This program helps to ensure that those National Guard and Reserve service families have the financial resources to keep the home front going while their Soldier, Airman, Sailor, Marine or Coast Guard members are away."

The Deployed Military Spouses Program is administered through the Division on Women at the DCA. The \$150,000 grant is part of a federal Community Services Block Grant and, to qualify, applicants must meet federal income guidelines.

Maj. Gen. Glenn K. Rieth, The Adjutant General of New Jersey has issued an Environmental Policy Statement listing objectives of the New Jersey Army National Guard (NJARNG) Environmental Management System (EMS).

This System requires commanders and supervisors at all levels to emphasize the importance of compliance with environmental policies and procedures before, during and after training exercises.

The New Jersey Army National Guard is required to implement an Environmental Management System (EMS) to establish a consistent, logical and intuitive organizational structure for EMS information that will meet the requirements of Executive Order 13148, the Department of Defense EMS implementation criteria and Army EMS implementation guidance and schedule.

The System is a process that involves policy, planning, implementation and operation, checking and corrective actions and management review. Awareness of the EMS is the responsibility of all personnel that support the NJARNG.

"Troops to Teachers" program helps service members become teachers

Pensacola, Fla. - Troops to Teachers, the government program helping former military members become public school teachers, has broken the 9,500 mark in hires. Latest data shows that 9,502 teachers have been hired through the program since 1994, with Troops to Teachers represented in more than 3,000 school districts across the country.

Troops to Teachers (www.ProudtoServeAgain.com) is administered by the Department of Defense and Department of Education and managed by the Defense Activity for Non-Traditional Education Support (DANTES). The program helps eligible military personnel begin second careers as public school teachers by providing referral assistance, placement services, and - for those electing to teach at high-need schools - financial stipends and bonuses.

Members of the National Guard and Reserves with 10 or more years of service are eligible for the program, provided they commit for an additional three years.

- Army Emergency Relief: Provides emergency financial assistance to active duty military personnel, retirees, National Guard and Reserve Component on active duty for over 30 consecutive days and their family members (with ID card and power of attorney).
- Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP): Entitles member to additional benefits through TRICARE's Extended Care Health Option (ECHO) Program. Provides information, referrals, crisis intervention, community support and assistance to meet individual needs.
- <u>Family Advocacy Program</u>: Provides for the identification, reporting, prevention, and treatment of child abuse and domestic violence.
- <u>Employment Readiness Program</u>: Offers information and referral for employment, education (resume writing, interviewing), volunteer & training opportunities.
