When Spc. David Maldonado deployed to Iraq, his mother, Carmen Ruiz, wanted him to come home safe – and be recognized by his hometown of Elizabeth for his decision to serve.

Maldonado shipped out with the 1-150th Assault Helicopter Battalion in January 2009 and as the weeks and months passed, Ruiz got to thinking. She knew she wasn't the only mother in Elizabeth to send a son or daughter off to war.

"Something big. We've got to do something big for these kids when they come home," Ruiz remembers thinking.

That something came on Saturday at a ceremony in the city's Winfield C. Scott Park. It was anything but small.

A crowd of more than 150 showed up to honor 20 veterans of Iraq and Afghanistan. Maldonado was there along with a dozen other New Jersey Army National Guard Soldiers and several Sailors and Marines recently returned from the combat zones. A banner with the pictures of all the honorees was unfurled and will hang in Elizabeth City Hall.

Mayor J. Christian Bollwage told the crowd that the city was proud to be able to recognize its sons and daughters for their service.

"This is a special day and these are special people we've gathered to recognize," Bollwage said.

Ruiz said she'd pulled off the ceremony and run down the names of the recently returned service members by making a lot of phone calls and with a lot of help from her city's expansive veterans community. After the ceremony, she hosted a barbeque for the honorees.

"I'm so proud of those guys. I'm so proud their day was special," she said. "I want to see people in every town work hard to figure out who they should be honoring and then go out and do it."

Retirement workshops for PERS, TPAF members

The Division of Pensions and Benefits is offering Retirement Workshops to members of the PERS and TPAF who plan to retire between July 1, 2010 and January 1, 2011.

- Workshops are being held at the New Jersey Forensic Science Technology Center in Hamilton Township (Mercer County), N.J.

- Workshop times are at either 9 a.m. or 1 p.m. and are currently scheduled for June 4, 7, 11, 15, 18, 21, 25, and 30.

- Members interested in attending must register online using the link on the Division's Web site. Go to: www.state.nj.us/treasury/pensions and click the link for "Retirement Workshops". Seating is limited – additional dates may be added but cannot be guaranteed.

During the workshops, our representatives will take a step-by-step approach to explain topics that include retirement benefits, beneficiary options, group life insurance, the taxability of your pension, and health benefits in retirement.

If attending, members must print an Estimate of Retirement Benefits using the Member Benefits Online System (MBOS) and bring it to the workshop (retirement estimates will not be provided at the workshop). To register for MBOS go to: www.state.nj.us/treasury/pensions/mbosregister.shtml and follow the registration instructions. Estimates obtained from MBOS are the same estimates obtained when visiting the Division's offices and use identical salary and service information.

Due to the recent increase in retirement applications, members must use the online Retirement Application available in MBOS. Submitting the application through MBOS reduces the chance of any delays in receipt of your application and provides for the fastest processing. Please also note that paper retirement applications will not be available and will not be accepted at the workshops.

Keeping green and keeping your green can oftentimes seem to be working against each other. As in – I know I will save money in my energy costs if I replace my old windows, but who can afford new ones? But there are a few ways you can raise your greening of the environment without taking a hit to the pocketbook.

Be careful with the water when brushing your teeth or washing dishes. Make sure your dishes and clothing are dirty before washing and rinsing them. While you are doing the wash, if you have the space and time – hang your clothes out to dry instead of using that dryer – the second largest consumer of home power. In wet and cold weather, indoor racks will do the same job.

It is suggested that you unplug chargers for phones and cameras, and your televisions and computers when not in use as they continue to use power even after you have hit the off button. Or, plug it into a power strip that you can turn off when you are not using the appliances.

Before tossing that old T-shirt, towel or sheet – tear or cut it into smaller pieces and use it for rags, thereby cutting down on your need for paper towels.

Buy fresh fruit and veggies from your local farm market. You are not only saving on transportation costs – for yourself and the farmer – you are getting local produce and supporting your local farmer.

Find a way to reuse whatever you can. Before tossing something in the trash, ask yourself if there is a way you can use it in another way. Save something saved from the landfill, YEAH!!

Memorial Day events

The 112th Field Artillery Association invites you to attend a Memorial Day salute for the men and women who have given their lives in uniformed service to the country. The salute will be held at the Lawrenceville Armory at 11 a.m. on May 31. There will be a brief ceremony and a 21-gun howitzer salute fired by the Soldiers of the Army National Guard's 3rd Battalion of the 112th Field Artillery.

The National Memorial Day Concert from the West Lawn of the U.S. Capitol in Washington, D.C., will be broadcast live on all PBS stations from 8:00 to 9:30 p.m., on Sunday, May 30. The concert will include performances from country music star Brad Paisley, the National Symphony Orchestra as well as various bands, orchestras and choral groups from all of the armed services.

The New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Foundation will hold its Memorial Day ceremony on May 31 at 11 a.m. at the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial in Holmdel. The guest speaker at this year's ceremony will be Maj. Gen. Glenn Rieth. The ceremony will also include the presentation of two scholarships to New Jersey high school seniors and the induction of two Vietnam Veterans into the Memorial's "In Memory" Program.

The New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Foundation will award two \$2,500 college scholarships to: Alexander Rentschler of Robbinsville, graduating from Robbinsville High School, and Samuel Tanner of Linwood, graduating from Mainland Regional High School.

During the ceremony, the Foundation will induct two Vietnam Veterans into its "In Memory" Program. "In Memory" honors New Jerseyans who served and died as a result of the war in Vietnam but whose names are not on the Memorial. The inductees' names will be placed on an engraved stone inside the Memorial so that all who visit will know that they are with their honored comrades.

The two "In Memory" inductees are:

- Dennis M. Duffy of Elizabeth, N.J., who served in U.S. Marine Corps in Vietnam from 1967 to 1968. He died on March 5, 2009.
- Michael T. Lyon of Kendall Park, N.J., who served in the U.S. Army in Vietnam from 1967 to 1969. He died on November 17, 2008.

The Marlboro (Township) Memorial Day Parade will take place on Sunday, May 23, starting at 2 p.m. The parade route will start in front of the Marlboro firehouse at the corner of Route 79 and School Road West and proceed along School Road West to the Veterans Memorial at the Marlboro Municipal Complex on 1979 Township Drive.

The annual parade honors military veterans, active and reserve service members and all fallen military service members who have paid the ultimate price for our country's freedoms and way of life.

On the behalf of Deputy Commissioner for Veterans Affairs, retired Col. Stephen G. Abel, you are invited to attend the Department's annual Memorial Day Observance on May 29 at the Brig. Gen. William C. Doyle Veterans Memorial Cemetery. The Parade of Veterans begins at 10:30 a.m. and the Memorial Ceremony begins at 11 a.m.
