### SECFOR deployers finish training

#### Soldiers, families ready to spend time together before long deployment

"Rollover! Rollover!" were the shouts that echoed through the speakers from the Mine Resistant Ambush Protected Vehicle Egress Trainer area at the Joint Training and Training Development Center at Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, N.J., as other Soldiers donned elbow and knee pads in preparation to be the next group to be inverted in the simulator.

The training offers a realistic simulation to develop the proper skills and confidence in all service members' ability to safely egress from an overturned vehicle and survive on a battlefield.

And that's exactly what the Soldiers from the 2nd Battalion, 113th Infantry were doing on Friday Feb. 28.

The infantrymen had been in pre-deployment training for three weeks at JBMDL and were ready to savor their final days with their families before deploying to Afghanistan.

Although their heads were in their helmets and they were focused on the training, their hearts were with their families, as they knew that soon they would be separated for a significant period of time.

"Let's get this training done right so we can get out of here," Staff Sgt. Ethan Letz belted out in front of the group. "That is our motivation for today."

Pvt. Cardon Edwards, 20, was also eager to get back to his mother and one-year old daughter.

"I want to get home and spend as much time with my family as possible," the East Orange native said. "The hardest part of the deployment will be missing everyone during Christmas time."

But that thought did not distract him from his current mission.

"This training is excellent," said Edwards.

"This is my first time going overseas and I am confident that our leadership is preparing us well."

"I'm not scared, at all, of going over there," concluded Edwards.

Sgt. Nestor Villamar, preparing for his fourth tour, will do his best to be Edwards' new family.

"What's important is the bond you build," said Villamar, a team leader at the battalion. "I'm having my whole team do all of our training together so we can build that bond before we even get over there."

"We are all we have in country so we're going to have to lean on each other now," said Villamar.

Relationships in theater are important,

Villamar said, because he's not leaving much behind. "I'm a single man. All I'm leaving behind is a dog and he'll be fine with my parents."

The family and friends at home is what motivates Sgt. Trident Villanueva for this upcoming deployment.

"I serve so the mothers and fathers can be safe," said Villanueva proudly. "I do this, so brothers and sisters don't have to."

As a combat veteran with experience on his side, Villanueva is comfortable with the mission he is about to undertake.

"You have to expect the worst and hope for the best," Villanueva said. "When things get crazy, that's when experience and training kicks in."

## Division of Pension, Benefits to implement new procedure

The Division of Pensions and Benefits is implementing a significant change to the purchase of service credit and withdrawal application process for all members effective April 1.

Effective April 1, all requests to purchase service credit and/or pension withdrawals must be submitted online using the Purchase Application program and/or the Application for Withdrawal program of the Member Benefits Online System (MBOS).

Consequently, the application to purchase service credit and/or pension withdrawal will no longer be available as a printed form or on the Division of Pensions and Benefits' Web site. Paper applications received by mail as of April 1 will be returned to members with instructions to submit the requests using MBOS.

MBOS is a set of Internet applications that allow current registered members secure access to their pension account information. In addition, MBOS provides members with fast and efficient methods for requesting purchase of service credit and/or pension account withdrawals.

New members should register to this free application, which requires registration at MyNewJersey and MBOS Web sites. Both of these Web sites are accessible at <a href="https://www.state.nj.us">www.state.nj.us</a>.

This requirement applies to all eligible members of the Public Employees' Retirement System; Teachers' Pension and Annuity Fund; Police and Firemen's Retirement System; and State Police Retirement System who wish to purchase service credit and/or terminate their employment and choose to withdraw from their pension account.

## Retroactive Stop Loss Special Pay extended until March 4

The deadline for eligible service members, veterans and their beneficiaries to apply for Retroactive Stop Loss Special Pay (RSLSP) has been extended to March 4, allowing personnel more time to apply for the benefits they've earned under the program guidelines.

The deadline extension is included in the continuing resolution signed by President Obama, providing funding for federal government operations through March 4.

The RSLSP was established to compensate for the hardships military members encountered when their service was involuntarily extended under Stop Loss Authority between Sept. 11, 2001, and Sept. 30, 2009. Eligible members or their beneficiaries may submit a claim to their respective military service in order to receive the benefit of \$500 for each full or partial month served in a Stop Loss status.

When RSLSP began on Oct. 21, 2009, the services estimated 145,000 service members, veterans and beneficiaries were eligible for this benefit. Because the majority of those eligible had separated from the military, the services have engaged in extensive and persistent outreach efforts over the past 14 months. Outreach efforts including direct mail, engaging military and veteran service organizations, social networks and media outlets, will continue through March 4.

### National Guard Militia Museum Celebrates Women's History Month

Exhibits at Sea Girt, Lawrenceville focus on pioneering role

SEA GIRT, N.J. - The National Guard Militia Museum of New Jersey (NGMMNJ) will open two Women's History Month exhibits celebrating the service of New Jersey's female Soldiers, sailors, Marines, and Airmen. From the American Revolution forward, "Volunteering for Service: New Jersey Women in War" will highlight more than two centuries of service through photographs, primary source correspondence, period uniforms, and video excerpts from the museum's award-winning Center for U.S. Veterans' Oral Histories.

The free exhibit opens March 1 and runs until March 31 at the National Guard Militia Museums in Sea Girt and Lawrenceville.

"Be it on the battlefield or the home front, the contributions of women in the major conflicts of American history must not be underestimated," said 1st Lt. Vincent Solomeno, museum curator and historian of the New Jersey National Guard. "In many ways, they are the unsung heroines whose dedication and bravery are examples to us all."

The museum at Sea Girt presents a chronological account of the contributions of New Jersey women to the U.S. Armed Forces. From the Battle of Monmouth Court House to female soldiers deployed in Iraq, the exhibit focuses on, among others, New Jerseyans Clara Barton, Clara Maass, and Maj. Gen. Maria Falca-Dodson, current commander of the New Jersey Air National Guard. Falca-Dodson holds the distinction of being the first woman promoted to the rank of general officer in the New Jersey National Guard.

The Lawrenceville Field Artillery Annex exhibit focuses on the ground breaking career of Col. Christine Haycock, who in 1952 became the first woman officer to serve as a physician in the U.S. Army Medical Corps. Following the Korean War, she became the first woman to hold a major command in New Jersey, with responsibility for the Army's 322nd General Hospital. The exhibit features photographs, memorabilia, and uniforms from Haycock's 38 years in military service.

The museum in Sea Girt is open Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., and the first, second, and third weekends of the month from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The Lawrenceville Field Artillery Annex is open Tuesdays and Fridays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. For more information, please visit the NGMMNJ Web site at <a href="http://www.state.nj.us/military/museum/">http://www.state.nj.us/military/museum/</a> or call 1st Lt.
