23rd Annual Review at Sea Girt is a success

On Oct. 14, New Jersey Governor Jon S. Corzine visited the National Guard Training Center at Sea Girt for the 23rd Annual Military Review.

With great autumn weather overlooking the Soldiers, Airmen, TAG, DAG, DCVA, distinguished guests, family members and other visitors that dotted the field and bleachers, the ceremony was filled with the pomp and circumstance that goes with a military ceremony.

Three different aircraft from the New Jersey Guard flew over the field, impressing the spectators – a KC-135E Stratotanker from the 108th Air Refueling Wing, a F-16C Fighting Falcon from the 177th Fighter Wing and three UH60A Blackhawks from the 1-150th Aviation. Giving honors to Gov. Corzine, the Commander-in-Chief of the New Jersey National Guard, was Battery A, 3rd Battalion, 112th Field Artillery with a Nineteen Gun Salute. They used antique 105mm salute guns from the Lawrenceville National Guard museum which were made in the 1950's.

"We expect Americans will see our decorated heroes unite in spirit at ceremonies, in parades and elsewhere as a compelling symbol of courage and sacrifice on Veterans Day, the day we set aside to thank those who served and safeguarded our national security."

The campaign is modeled after a tradition in Australia and New Zealand, countries who honor the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps (ANZAC) on April 25. ANZAC Day sees veterans wearing their military decorations whatever they are doing on that day. Nicholson said he hopes a U. S. tradition will ensue to emulate this pride in being a veteran and in honoring our veterans.

On October 8, 21 known runners from the NJ Guard participated in the 22nd Annual Army Ten Miler in Washington, D.C. Of the 24,000 registered runners a total of 15,589 participants crossed the finish line on the sunny fall Sunday in October.

Of the two competitive teams fielded, the New Jersey Devils Team (Guard Male Competitive Division, Team Captain – Sgt. 1st Class Donald Brandinelli) won their division with a total team time of **5:02:12** in a division of five teams. The WOCS-RC is a 9-month course and is conducted at a rate of one class per year. To attend you must be in a technical service MOS, be an E-5 or above and have completed Warrior Leadership Course.

Collectively they completed the course with an Academic Average of 90.91 percent and an APFT average of 241. The pink ribbon, symbolizing the fight against breast cancer, is visible virtually everywhere to raise awareness in both men and women about breast cancer.

FAST FACTS about Breast Cancer:

1 out of every 8 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer at some time during her lifetime.

More than 200,000 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer in the United States this year.

More than 43,000 women will die from the disease in the United States this year.

Breast cancer is the most common malignancy in women.

It is the second leading cause of cancer death.

50 percent of all invasive breast cancers are diagnosed in women over age 65.

Breast cancer is much more aggressive when it develops in younger women.

Breast cancer also occurs in MEN. In fact, 1 in every 100 breast cancer patients is male.

A woman's best chance for surviving breast cancer is detecting it early. When found early, the survival rate is 96 percent.

TAKE CHARGE of your Health - Screening Guidelines:

For all women - perform breast self-examination every month. Become familiar with the size, shape and texture of your breasts. In this way, you will be able to notice any changes quickly and alert your physician.

Risk Reducing Strategies:
