Farewell ceremony honors 50th

Pfc. Saul Rosa, 444th MPAD

Anxiety, excitement, fear and pride could be used to describe the emotions that emerged during the 50th Infantry Brigade Combat Team's (IBCT) Farewell Celebration held at Fort Dix on Saturday, June 14.

Family, friends and supporters gathered on Doughboy Field to honor the Soldiers deploying to Iraq.

Alexis, the 10-year old daughter of 2-113th Infantry commander Lt. Col. Mark Piterski, sang the national anthem. As she finished, a trio of F-16 fighter jets from the 177th Fighter Wing roared overhead.

"Each and every Soldier on this parade field is an American hero not because of this deployment," said Maj. Gen. Glenn K. Rieth, the Adjutant General of New Jersey, "but you raised your right hand in an all-volunteer army to make a difference and protect our way of life."

Governor Jon S. Corzine spoke of the sacrifices the Soldiers have endured and focused on the sacrifices the families have made to support the Soldiers.

"Most New Jerseyans understand that this sacrifice is not yours alone that it is your loved ones," said Corzine. "To each we express our gratitude for the sacrifice that you make to make sure our troops are supported abroad."

Corzine then gave his word that the families of the Soldiers would be taken care of while they were deployed.

"It is our responsibility to stand with you while you're away serving us and our pledge is to be certain and clear that it will be there," he said.

After the ceremony the families were able to spend the rest of the day with the Soldiers. Many families had different feelings about the deployment.

"I have no worries. I'm glad for him. I think this is the best thing for him," said retired drill sergeant David Lipscomb, father of Pfc. Brian Lipscomb. "I'm confident in the training he received," he added.

"I'm very proud of him and I support him in everything he does," said Linda Menew, mother of Pfc. Shane Weddle. "I'm very positive and I hope he returns home safe," she added.

Others appreciated the support the Governor showed.

"I'm really glad he came out," said Sunday Pittman, as she gathered her grandchildren Lindsy, Charleigh and Kylie Atkinson, daughters of Pvt. Russell Atkinson, after they had their picture taken with the governor. "I really appreciate him taking a picture with the kids; they don't understand what it means right now, but they will one day and appreciate it then," she added.

The following identification documents should be available for issuance of your ID card: Birth certificates, marriage license, drivers' license or state issued ID, passport, legal and military specific documentation (Power of Attorney, changes in marital status or guardianship, current orders, promotion orders) any currently held state or federal ID card. The service member must appear in person with dependent with a signed DD Form 1172 (Application for DEERS enrollment) or the same form from another ID card facility signed by the sponsor within a 90 day period.

Basic fuel saving techniques

Here are some ideas for increasing the fuel efficiency of your car. **Warning:** some of these may require behavioral changes on your part.

Avoid quick acceleration or braking heavily. This reduces fuel economy by as much as 33 percent at highway speeds and five percent around town.

Avoid idling excessively

Avoid driving at higher speeds. This is for people who drive above 65 mph. Driving at higher speeds increases wind resistance and mechanical friction which reduces fuel economy.

In a related item, **remove cargo racks**: Cargo racks on top of your increases your car's aerodynamic drag and lowers fuel efficiency.

Avoid short trips. On short trips, your car operates a smaller percentage of time at the desired engine temperature, which reduces fuel economy. **Here is the solution: combine trips.** This requires planning on your part. Figure out where your furthest destination is; go there then stop at the closer destinations in order from furthest to closest as you work your way home. This allows your car to operate at the optimum engine temperature.

Minimize the use of mechanical and electrical accessories. For example, operating your air conditioner at "Max" can reduce your fuel efficiency by roughly five to 25 percent.

And finally, maintain your car. A poorly tuned engine, improperly aligned or under inflated tires and a dirty air filter can all reduce fuel efficiency.

 - Their family members, and
 - U.S. citizens residing outside the U.S.

Please remember if you have an address change and/or a name change, it is *extremely* important that you contact Lisa Dandrea in the Human Resources Office. There have been a lot of issues with tax W2s, pension statements and pay checks being returned to our office, as well as some employees not receiving their new health cards, all due to incorrect addresses. Your address change is not automatic and it is not limited to completing a new W4. There are specific forms for employees to complete that updates their new information statewide. Your change of address or name affects your paycheck, your pension statements, W2s, loans, any information sent out by your health care provider, promotional announcements from Dept. of Personnel, etc. If you have had an address/name change and have not updated your information, please make sure you contact Lisa Dandrea in HRD-ESB at 609-530-6888 or e-mail Lisa.Dandrea@njdmava.state.nj.us.

Battlemind supports Soldiers, families through deployment cycle

Battlemind is a term used to describe combat readiness. The first Battlemind product was a mental health post-deployment briefing. It quickly became a training system supporting Soldiers and families across the seven phases of the deployment cycle. The

Battlemind system includes separate pre-deployment training modules for Soldiers, unit leaders, health-care providers and spouses. Psychological debriefings are given in theater and upon redeployment. There is also a post-deployment module for spouses and several post-deployment modules for Soldiers. Post-deployment Battlemind addresses safety concerns, relationship issues, normalized combat-related mental health reactions and symptoms -- along with teaching Soldiers when they should seek mental health support for themselves or for their buddies. Reduced rates on NJ Transit for military, dependents

Here is another benefit offered to military members, retirees and their dependents by the state of New Jersey.

Eligible passengers may ride at reduced fare rates on any NJ Transit bus, rail or light rail service at all times, without restriction, upon presentation of authorized identification.

All military personnel and their dependents will be permitted to purchase transportation at the senior citizen/passengers with disabilities reduced fare rate upon showing their military or military dependent ID card. The following military personnel are entitled to this fare: Active Duty, Reserve, National Guard or Retired for Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or Coast Guard.

N.J. licenses, registration extended for deployed troops

New Jerseyans who are on active duty military, in the National Guard or the military reserves, serving in the war on terrorism, are eligible for automatic extensions of a valid driver license, registration or inspection expiration dates. Go to www.nj.gov/mvc/ for more information.

Families urged to be aware of Casualty Phishing Scam

The HRC Casualty and Mortuary Affairs Operations Center (CMAOC) has asked that the field be advised that a phishing scam concerning families of fallen Soldiers has been identified. The scam purports to be from DFAS and Army Human Resources Command and informs the families of deceased Soldiers that they are entitled to monetary compensation in excess of \$12 million that will be available to them in one week. Those families receiving the correspondence are instructed to provide sensitive personal information, such as SSN, DOB, addresses, etc., and are instructed to come to either visit the Army Human Resources Command Offices in Alexandria, Va., or email the information to an overseas Yahoo account. A copy of the bogus solicitation is attached at the below link on S1NET. Recommend that any staff, CAOs, CNOs, chaplains, and any other members that may be in contact with families review and be aware of this phishing scam.

Pennsylvania looking for Desert Shield/Storm vets for benefit program

The Pennsylvania Department of Military and Veterans' Affairs is trying to locate veterans who may be eligible for the Commonwealth's Persian Gulf Veterans' Benefit Program. We believe that many Desert Shield/Storm participants who were residents of Pennsylvania during this conflict may be entitled to this benefit have since moved to other states. In an effort to inform them of the benefit, we request that you share the following information with your veterans.

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania signed into law (House Bill 1820, Act 29 of 2006) a benefit program for veterans of the Persian Gulf Theater of Operations during the time period Aug. 2, 1990 through Aug. 31, 1991. Veterans are likely to be eligible for the benefit if they:

- 1. Served with the U.S. Armed Forces, a reserve component of the U.S. Armed Forces or the Pennsylvania National Guard during the period Aug. 2, 1990-Aug. 31, 1991;
- 2. Received the Southwest Asia Service Medal; and
- 3. Were a resident of Pennsylvania during the period Aug. 2, 1990-Aug. 31, 1991.

A surviving family member(s) of a veteran who was killed as a result of the conflict, or died following the conflict may be eligible for the benefit.

Veterans or a surviving family member(s) may either request an application by calling the toll-free telephone number below, or by down-loading the application from the webpage.
