Jersey engineers turn swamp into road

ABERDEEN PROVING GROUND, Md. – What happens when a mucky patch of Maryland swamp meets the 150th Engineer Company?

A road capable of carrying 80,000 pound trucks begins to emerge foot by painstaking foot.

More than two dozen Soldiers from the New Jersey Army National Guard unit are spending their Annual Training at this sprawling Army installation north of Baltimore building a road strong enough to carry ammunition trucks.

“This is great training -- it’s exactly the kind of work we would do if we deployed,” said Capt. Becky Lapidow, the company commander. “There are a lot of roads being built in Afghanistan.”

The AT is a milestone, the first since the unit stood up in October. Several members of the 160th Engineer Detachment are taking part as well.

As he grinned through a cloud of gravel dust on a recent morning, Staff Sgt. William Cook, a 150th member who once listed his top three military job preferences as engineer, engineer and engineer said progress on the road – nearly 2,000 feet in two weeks -- surprised him.

“When we got here, we had a swamp,” he said. “Now, it’s starting to look a lot like a road.”

In addition to the digging, grading and laying the stabilizing sand and gravel for the road, all of the Soldiers trained on the safe operation of five- and 20-ton dump trucks.

Spc. Reggie Pharel, a supply clerk, enjoyed the driver training so much he volunteered to get behind the wheel of a five-ton dump truck every day for the rest of AT.

After several 10-hour days of driving the same two-mile loop, he still wasn’t bored.

“Good training,” he said with a big smile as he backed up to drop yet another load of gravel.

177th Airmen fill key roles at European health hub

RAMSTEIN AIR BASE, GERMANY--Airmen from the 177th Medical Group got their first taste of working at Ramstein Air Base this week.

The 34 New Jersey National Guard Airmen comprise all the major sections in the Medical group – laboratory, logistics, technicians, public health, dental, optometry, administration, nursing and flight surgeons. The Airmen will be deployed from July 20 through August 2.

The 177th Airmen began serving with the 86th Medical Group, which operates the largest overseas Air Force clinic.

“They will get a lot of training that is often hard to come by,” said Col. David J. Mellish, 177th Medical Group commander. “In addition to training, they will be working alongside their active-duty counterparts.”

Five 177th Airmen received some very special training on Tuesday.

Master Sgt. Harry Waugh, Tech. Sgts. Melissa Blackledge and Marie Paggi, along with Staff Sgts. Chantel Bullock and Valerie Chiola were assigned to the Contingency Aerospace Staging Facility or CASF.

The CASF is responsible for transporting Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom wounded warriors from the flightline to the hospital then back to the flightline for return to the United States.

More than 65,000 wounded Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom Soldiers, Airmen, Sailors and Marines have come through Ramstein.

Waugh, Blackledge, Paggi, Bullock and Chiola prepared for their duties by undergoing refresher training transporting volunteers around on stretchers.

That training was tested at noon when the 177th Airmen were assigned to moving a group of wounded warriors.

The 177th team moved the injured warriors from the CASF building to a bus specially designed to carry stretcher-borne patients. They were then driven to the Ramstein flightline where they were loaded onto a C-17 Globemaster III attached to the 172nd Airlift Wing, Mississippi Air National Guard.

“It was an honor to help get the wounded home,” Waugh said.

Afterwards the entire CASF team got together at the bottom of the C-17 to give a cheer for the warriors.

“This is a real world event, it was exciting,” said Chiola. “It’s not just another exercise.”

Most of us want to do our part to do some good for the environment, but many times, beyond thinking, "Can I recycle this container or not," the actions of doing our part seems like, well, work.

Here are some relatively easy ways to help the environment.

Check your local recycling rules. While on my town's Web site recently, I found that there is a central recycling point for those plastics that I cannot place in the curbside bucket every week, like yogurt cups and the plastic on my new toothbrush. Go to <http://www.nj.gov/nj/gov/county/localgov.html> and find your local Web site. Most have their recycling rules.

Return your plastic bags to the grocery store for recycling. There are some reports that show the average American family can gather as many as 60 plastic bags in only four trips to the grocery store. Many grocery stores have recycling bins by the front door. Or check with your local thrift store; they may be able to use them.

Turn the water off while brushing your teeth. If you have the faucet spouting water down the drain, you can lose an estimated 1.5 gallons per minute (depending on age and model of your faucet).

Use one less plastic bottle a month. Americans buy an estimated 28 billion plastic water bottles every year. The U.S. population was estimated at 306,976,362 as of July 22, 2009. That means every person buys about 91 or so water bottles per year and more than 80 percent of those will end up being disposed of rather than being recycled.

The New Jersey National Guard State Family Readiness Council has increased the amounts of family and business grants up to \$5,000 and \$10,000, respectively. Both are known as TIER I grants. Service members meeting these criteria are eligible to apply for a financial hardship grant up to \$1,500. 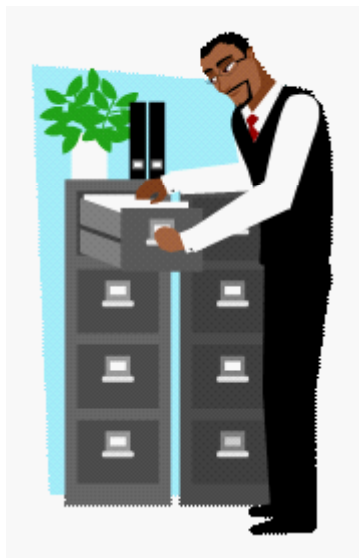
This is just a reminder that the convenience of direct deposit is offered to all state employees. It is encouraged that our employees consider taking advantage of direct deposit with all that it has to offer.

Enrolling into direct deposit means having your money directly deposited into your checking or savings account. You're going to be on vacation on pay day? Tired of waiting for Postal Service to deliver your money? Eliminate that with direct deposit. It is a convenient and reliable way to receive your pay and know it is safe in your account, when you need it to be. And the service is free!

To get enrolled you must complete the "Authorization Agreement for Automatic Payroll Deposits" form, and turn it in to your Human Resources Payroll Department. A copy of this form is available on DMAVA.net under "Human Resources – Helpful Forms." Just print, fill out and send to Human Resources. Please

allow up to three pay periods (six weeks) for your direct deposit to take effect.

Information to remember:

DMAVA employees can use the employee ID card or NJ military ID for admission to the beach.

Passes can be issued to family members and friends, but each pass is to be issued to only one person.

Each pass will admit all occupants of one car to the beach. The pass is good for the entire season.

On the back of the pass there are two lines to fill in:

First line: You or the person **who will be using** the pass (name/guest) must **print** his/her name on the first line. Guests may also be asked to show a driver's license or other photo ID.

Second line (unit/sponsor): You must **print** your name and DMAVA division or unit.

Veterans with conventional home loans now have new options for refinancing to a Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) guaranteed home loan. These new options are available as a result of the Veterans' Benefits Improvement Act of 2008. It will allow the VA to assist a substantial number of veterans with subprime mortgages by refinancing into a safer, more affordable VA guaranteed loan. As a result of the new law, VA can now assist veterans in refinancing their subprime or conventional mortgage up to 100 percent of the value of the property. The following is **tentative information** and an **agenda of events**. Soldiers and families should check with their units and chain of command for additional details.

- Pay Status: IDT
- Report time: 9 a.m., Aug. 16 at the Convention Center.
- Uniform: Business Casual (no jeans, shorts, sandals, sneakers or inappropriate T-shirts).
- Travel and per diem is not authorized.
- Spouses and children are encouraged to attend but it is not mandatory.
- Overnight accommodations will be provided for soldier and family members.
- Limited day care for infants will be available, along with youth activities.
- Three meals will be provided (Aug. 16 lunch and dinner and Aug. 17 breakfast).
- Any other costs incurred are the soldier's responsibility.
- Transportation requirements from home station to Atlantic City must be requested, if required.

- All personnel should park at their assigned hotels and take shuttles to the Convention Center. Convention Center parking is not free.

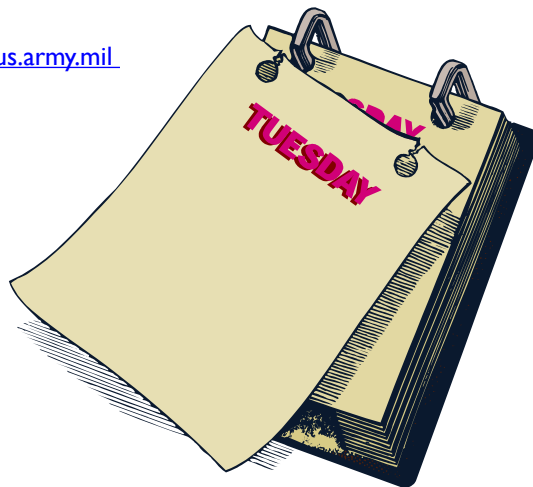
