Historic first: Falca-Dodson becomes state's first female two-star

New Jersey Air National Guard Brig. Gen. Maria Falca-Dodson was promoted to the rank of Major General at a ceremony at the Joint Force headquarters on Fort Dix on Monday, June 22. She is the first woman in the New Jersey Army and Air National Guard to become a general officer.

Falca-Dodson is the commander of the state's Air Guard which has 2,300 Airmen and includes the 108th Air Refueling Wing at McGuire Air Force Base and the 177th Fighter Wing at Egg Harbor Township. Before taking command of the Air Guard in November, Falca-Dodson served for six years as the Deputy Adjutant General. She was the first woman to hold that position as well.

Maj. Glenn. K. Rieth, the Adjutant General was the first to add the star to her uniform and then her husband, Col. William "Buck" Dodson, who just recently returned from a deployment to Iraq, placed a second star on her service coat.

Avalon now has drop off for "Cell Phones for Soldiers"

Avalon, N.J., is joining the effort to support the brave men and women in the United States military by providing a "Cell Phones for Soldiers" drop off location at the Avalon Public Safety Building, on Dune Drive between 30th and 31st Streets, in Avalon. "Cell Phones for Soldiers" is a collection drive for used, unwanted cell phones. A collection box for the unused cell phones has been placed in the lobby of the new Avalon Public Safety Building. "Cell Phones for Soldiers" was founded by teenagers Robbie and Brittany Bergquist from Norwell, Mass., with \$21 of their own money. Since then, the registered 501c3 non-profit organization has raised almost \$1 million in donations and distributed more than 500,000 prepaid calling cards to soldiers serving overseas. The donated phones are sent to ReCellular, which pays "Cell Phones for Soldiers" for each phone; enough to provide an hour of talk time to soldiers abroad.

State employees who move, marry must contact HR department

If you are a state employee, working for DMAVA, Vets Haven, and the Cemetery, and you have an address change and/or a name change, it is extremely important that you contact Lisa Dandrea in the Human Resources Office. There have been a lot of issues with tax W2s, pension statements and pay checks being returned to our office, as well as some employees not receiving their new health cards, all due to incorrect addresses. Your address change is not automatic and it is not limited to completing a new W4. There are specific forms for employees to complete that updates their new information statewide. Your change of address or name affects your paycheck, your pension statements, W2s, loans, any information sent out by your health care provider, promotional announcements from Dept. of Personnel, etc. If you have had an address/name change and have not updated your information, please make sure you Dandrea in HRD-ESB at 609-530-6888 contact Lisa Lisa.Dandrea@njdmava.state.nj.us.
