The History of the New Jersey National Guard (Part 6)

Reorganization

It has been the destiny of the National Guard that after every war, it has been completely reorganized. In most instances the reasons learned in battle were remembered and the new units were to be trained and equipped to be ready for the next war.

The Civil War forcibly demonstrated the need for state and national control of the militia, and in 1868 the Legislature passed an act creating the National Guard. Under this act the militia, the county companies of troops, the New Jersey Rifle Corps, all the sundry armed units, raised and maintained by well-intentioned individuals, were brought under the direct command of the Governor and the control of the Adjutant General. The militia units were organized into one division of two brigades, with one Artillery and one Cavalry company attached to each brigade. This organization remained the same with only minor changes throughout the period 1869 to 1917.

The New Jersey National Guard, ready to answer the calls of the Governor in local emergencies, was indeed called. Election riots in Camden County in 1871 provided the opportunity to restore law and order. That same year in Jersey City, troops were again used to guell riots.

In 1877, the year of the railroad riots, the efficiency of the guard was again tested. Rioters from out of state tried to seize important terminals and facilities along the main lines of the Pennsylvania, Erie, and the Delaware-Lackawanna and Western railroads. Guard units were called and fanned out from Jersey City and Hoboken to Phillipsburg and Camden preventing loss of life, destruction of property and insuring the uninterrupted movement of trains to New York and Pennsylvania.

These were the days before efficient and capable state and local police forces existed as we know them today. The National Guard was the Governor's only force capable of maintaining law and order over a wide area of the state under a central control.

JT2DC Receives New Simulator

The Joint Training and Training Development Center (JTTDC) recently received a Virtual Interactive Combat Environment (V.I.C.E.) simulator.

The system is currently in use at Fort Benning, Ga., by Army Basic Combat Training to train new recruits to learn their warrior tasks and drills. The JTTDC is currently testing and training on this device. Unlike previous teambuilding simulations such as the Engagement Skills Trainer, the V.I.C.E. allows Soldiers to control their own movement, which increases greater development of teamwork and communication.

Microsoft software available for Army Guardsmen

The Microsoft Home Use Program (HUP) is eligible to all Army personnel including, active duty, reserve, Guard, and civilians currently employed by the Army.

The program allows individuals to get a licensed copy of Microsoft Office desktop applications to install and use on a home computer.

The Army awarded a six – year Enterprise License Agreement (ELA) for Microsoft products on May 30, 2003. The MS ELA established by the Army is a "Volume License" agreement with Software Assurance, and as a "Volume License" owner, the Army is entitled to exercise the Home Use Program.

Army Guard members taking advantage of this offering are responsible for paying the administrative costs for obtaining the software and may use the software as desired. Guard members can only obtain one version of the software at any given time.

Army Emergency Relief: Provides emergency financial assistance to active duty military personnel, retirees, National Guard and Reserve Component on active duty for over 30 consecutive days and their family members (with ID card and power of attorney).

Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP): Entitles member to additional benefits through TRICARE's Extended Care Health Option (ECHO) Program. Provides information, referrals, crisis intervention, community support and assistance to meet individual needs.

Family Advocacy Program: Provides for the identification, reporting, prevention, and treatment of child abuse and domestic violence.

Employment Readiness Program: Offers information and referral for employment, education (resume writing and interviewing), volunteer and training opportunities.

Family Readiness Council offers Tier I and II grants

The New Jersey National Guard State Family Readiness Council has expanded its Family Grants Program to include an additional grant. There are now two levels of Family Grants; TIER I is the \$2,500 grant that has been in place for the past couple of years. The TIER II opens family grants to New Jersey Army and Air National Guard non-deployed service members who were on State Active Duty or State Missions (e.g., hurricanes, floods, border missions) for more than 20 consecutive days. Service members meeting these criteria are eligible to apply for a financial hardship grant up to \$1,500. Applications are available at all New Jersey Army and Air National Guard Family Assistance Centers.

Bill Extends Education Eligibility

A bill which extends eligibility for higher education tuition assistance to certain former members of New Jersey National Guard and increases the number of tuition-free credits available to National Guard members and their dependents was signed into law by Governor Jon. S. Corzine on Jan. 24.

The legislation would allow National Guard members who are called into active duty to utilize state tuition assistance credits after their enlistment expires.

Under the old law, active members of the New Jersey National Guard may receive up to 15 credits per semester tuition free from public institutions of higher education in

in the performance of his duties may also receive this benefit.

This bill, A-2542, amended the law to extend eligibility for this higher education tuition benefit to members of the New Jersey National Guard whose use of the free tuition benefit is interrupted by a deployment to active duty. The change would permit these soldiers to receive their earned educational benefits should their enlistment expire, or should they be medically discharged, prior to completing their studies.

The new law will also increase the number of credits eligible for funding under this program from 15 to 16 per semester.
