President's proclamation honors military spouses

WASHINGTON, May 5, 2008 - Military spouses embody the courage, nobility of duty, and love of country that inspire every American. On Military Spouse Day, we pay tribute to the husbands and wives who support their spouses in America's Armed Forces during times of war and peace.

The legacy of military spouses began when colonial Americans were fighting for independence. Martha Washington boosted the morale of her husband's troops by visiting battlefields and tending to the wounded. Since then, members of our Armed Forces have served our Nation accompanied by the steadfast love and support of their spouses and families.

While our men and women in uniform are protecting our country's founding ideals of liberty, democracy, and justice, their spouses live with uncommon challenges, endure sleepless nights, and spend long periods raising children alone. Many military spouses are also committed volunteers, serving other military families and local communities. Our Nation benefits from the sacrifices of our military families, and we are inspired by their courage, strength, and leadership.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GEORGE W. Reduced rates on NJ Transit for military, dependents

Here is another benefit offered to military members, retirees and their dependents by the state of New Jersey.

Eligible passengers may ride at reduced fare rates on any NJ Transit bus, rail or light rail service at all times, without restriction, upon presentation of authorized identification.

All military personnel and their dependents will be permitted to purchase transportation at the senior citizen/passengers with disabilities reduced fare rate upon showing their military or military dependent ID card. The following military personnel are entitled to this fare: Active Duty, Reserve, National Guard or Retired for Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or Coast Guard.

Battlemind supports Soldiers, families through deployment cycle

Battlemind is a term used to describe combat readiness. The first Battlemind product was a mental health post-deployment briefing. It quickly became a training system supporting Soldiers and families across the seven phases of the deployment cycle. The Battlemind system includes separate pre-deployment training modules for Soldiers, unit leaders, health-care providers and spouses. Psychological debriefings are given in theater and upon redeployment. There is also a post-deployment module for spouses and several post-deployment modules for Soldiers. Pre-deployment Battlemind tells Soldiers what they are likely to see, to hear, to think and to feel while deployed - by describing the worst-case scenario. Post-deployment Battlemind addresses safety concerns, relationship issues, normalized combat-related mental health reactions and symptoms -- along with teaching Soldiers when they should seek mental health support for themselves or for their buddies. - 2. Accountability: They demonstrate personal responsibility and hold themselves and others accountable. Team players can be counted on to do what they say they will do and encourage others to meet the same standard.
- 3. Teamwork: An effective team member organizes tasks, people, and resources to deliver most effectively. By facilitating the team's efforts and getting them to work together, synergy is created where the sum is greater than the individual parts.

Five Related Competencies Categories:

- 1. Attitude: A successful team member maintains a friendly, positive, and enthusiastic outlook. They recognize they can't control all of the circumstances that happen but they can control how they react to them. They are a stabilizing force and provide an even keel for the team dynamic.
- 2. External Awareness: A successful team member sees things from multiple points of view. They recognize the impact they are having on others, as well. They keep up to date with issues that affect responsibility.
- 3. Results Oriented: A successful team member is passionate about winning. They are dedicated to achieving a win-win solution to situations. They are driven to achieve the outcome the team is tasked with accomplishing.
- 4. Interpersonal Skills: A successful team member displays a consistent ability to build solid relationships inside and outside the organization. They possess an extensive skill set for dealing with different personalities and building consensus.
- 5. Communication: A successful team member practices active listening skills supported with meaningful oral and written information. They know how to analyze the appropriate level and amount of communication and balance their participation accordingly.

New Jersey Vietnam Veterans Remembrance Day 2008

Since 1991, as created by State legislation, May 7 is recognized each year in New Jersey as Vietnam Veterans Remembrance Day. This is a day to honor all those from New Jersey who served in the military during the Vietnam Era, from 1959 to 1975, when more than 200,000 residents served.

At 11 a.m. on Wednesday, May 7, the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Foundation, with assistance from the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs, held its annual Vietnam Veterans Remembrance Day ceremony at the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial in Holmdel.

Approximately 600 people attended the commemorative event, which was held on the upper tier overlooking the Memorial's courtyard and surrounded by the circular, black granite wall bearing the names of 1,562 New Jerseyans whose lives were lost in the Vietnam War.

The ceremony began with a welcome address by Vietnam Veteran Jim Cusick, president of the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Foundation. The colors were posted by the Plainfield High School Air Force Junior ROTC Color Guard. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by a group of students from Collier High School, Wickatunk. The National Anthem was sung by VFW State Vocalist, William F. Mead. The invocation was given by Joe Formola, Chaplain of the VVA New Jersey State Council. Remarks in honor of New Jersey's Vietnam Veterans were given by Assemblyman Jack Conners of the N.J. State Legislature.

Following Conners' remarks, a ceremony to award New Jersey State medals was held with presentations by DMAVA representatives — Deputy Commissioner of Veterans Affairs retired Col. Stephen G. Abel, Director of Veteran Services Gary Englert, retired Sgt. Joe Nyzio, with Ms. Kimberly Bruss serving as Mistress of Ceremonies. Approximately 160 of New Jersey's military veterans were presented with medals, which included the N.J. Distinguished Service Medal, N.J. Meritorious Service Medal, N.J. Vietnam Service Medal, N.J. Korean Service Medal, and the N.J. POW/MIA Service Medal.

Various organizations, including DMAVA, then placed wreaths beneath the New Jersey state tree, the Red Oak in the central courtyard of the memorial. Wreath placement was accompanied by a musical interlude, including a song sung by William F. Mead and

one played on bagpipes by Vietnam Veteran Tim McCabe of Woodbridge.

Joe Formola gave the benediction and the Plainfield High School Air Force Junior ROTC Color Guard retired the colors to end the day's special commemorative program.

Following the ceremony, attendees enjoyed an open house at the adjacent Vietnam Era Educational Center, which includes a museum and research library.

The New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial and the Vietnam Era Educational Center are located on the grounds of the PNC Bank Arts Center, Holmdel, Monmouth County (Garden State Parkway exit 116). The Memorial and the Educational Center are maintained through a partnership between the New Jersey Vietnam Veterans' Memorial Foundation and the New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans Affairs. The Memorial is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The Educational Center is open Tuesday through Saturday, 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Regular admission to the Center is free for veterans and active-duty military personnel. Regular adult admission is \$4; student and senior citizen admission is \$2 and children under 10 are admitted free.
