
NJDMAVA Office of Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging

Since 2006, the month of May honors American Jews and their contributions to the US. <u>Did you know?</u>

- \Rightarrow In 1654, 23 adults and children from Brazil formed the first US Jewish community
- ⇒ The Jewish American Businessman, Adolphus Simeon Solomons joined Clara Barton and others to form the American Red Cross in 1881
- ⇒ The poem at the base of the Statue of Liberty, "The New Colossus," was written in 1883 by a 34year-old Sephardic Jewish American Poet named Emma Lazarus.
- ⇒ Jewish immigrant Irving Berlin wrote the iconic anthem "God Bless America" while serving in the US Army in 1918 during WWI.
- \Rightarrow More than 500,000 Jewish Americans served in the armed forces during WWII.
- $\Rightarrow~$ In 1993, Ruth Bader Ginsburg became the first Jewish American woman appointed to the US Supreme Court
- ⇒ Albert Einstein, a Jewish American mathematician and physicist, was named "Person of the Century" by *Time* magazine in 1999.
