NJARNG STATE SAFETY AND OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH COUNCIL (CoS)

- 1. This Bulletin establishes the NJARNG's Safety and Occupational Health Council and Council membership IAW AR 385-10, paragraph 4-5.
- 2. Purpose: To advise The Adjutant General (TAG) on all safety and occupational health matters and their effect on the readiness of the New Jersey National Guard. To achieve, foster and sustain a safe operating environment throughout the New Jersey National Guard through committed leadership, operational risk management, timely and accurate reporting and consistent safety practices.

3. Duties and Responsibilities:

- a. To review NJARNG accidents and occupational illnesses experience and prevention programs.
- b. To review reports of fatal or other serious accidents and occupational illnesses
- c. Review of national and state statistical safety and occupational health data to identify barriers to safety and successful practices that enhance operational safety and the work environment.
- d. Prepare minutes, briefings and recommendations for presentation to the TAG, Senior Leadership and staffs, NGB and DOD as necessary to inform, advocate and raise safety and occupational health issues and awareness.
- e. Develop and recommend for implementation any special emphasis training / programs / plans / policies / surveys deemed necessary or appropriate to facilitate progress in the safety and occupational health arena.

4. Council Meetings:

- a. Will be conducted quarterly, ideally on the first week of the last month in a quarter.
- b. An Agenda will be published and distributed to members for each meeting.
- c. The Safety Office will publish and distribute the results of each meeting, ideally within fifteen working days from the meeting date. TAG-NJ, council members, staff sections and commands will receive electronic copies of each meeting.
- d. Location will be determined based on the needs of the Council.
- e. The Chair may call special meetings of the Council as necessary. Meetings may be open to observers as deemed appropriate by the Chair.
- f. Only one representative from each command or staff function needs to attend the meetings.

- 5. Council Membership: Commands and Staff Sections will provide a primary and alternate representative to represent, speak and commit for their area of responsibility for review by the Chair. The Chair reserves the right to dismiss non-participants.
 - a. Ex-Officio Council Members: by virtue of their position, some key leaders cannot routinely attend meetings. The Safety Office and/or Council Chairman will ensure that they maintain situational awareness, issue guidance and support the program.
 - b. The following commands, staff sections and agencies make up the council's membership. A separate appointment memorandum will list the actual members.
