## BOATING VIOLATIONS

# Penalties for breaking boating laws include:

# The penalties for boating under the influence of drugs or alcohol and/or the refusal to submit to chemical test include: a

### First Offense:

the age of 17 years, three months. (N.J.S.A. 12:7-46) loss of privilege to operate a moped from sentencing until offender has reached months, loss of privilege to operate a vehicle for three months to one year\*, Fine of between \$250 and \$500, loss of privilege to operate a vessel for 12 and

### Second Offense:

Fine of between \$500 and \$1,000, loss of privilege to operate a vessel for 24 months, loss of privilege to operate a vehicle for 2 years, and loss of privilege to operate a moped from sentencing until offender has reached the age of 17 years, three months. A second offense will also result in 30 days of community service and between 48 hours and 90 days in prison. (N.J.S.A. 12:7 -46)

- 1 year (boat)/7-12 months (motor vehicle) and \$300 to \$500 fine

10 years (boat and motor vehicle) and \$1,000 fine (N.J.S.A. 12:7-57)
