Re: OPRA request received May 14, 2026

Dear Mr. Smith:

The New Jersey Educational Facilities Authority (“NJEFA” or the “Authority”) received your Open Public Records Act (“OPRA”) request on May 14, 2026. The official Records Custodian, Jamie O’Donnell, also received your OPRA request on May 14, 2026. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request is May 25, 2026. However, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 47:1A-1.1, since the records are being sought for a “commercial purpose” the Authority has fourteen (14) business days to respond to this request. This response is being provided on the third business day.

Your OPRA request sought access to the following:

“Any document that details payments to vendors issued for goods and contracted professional services rendered to Educational Facilities Authority (NJEFA) from 7/1/2025 through February 28, 2026.



Please be advised that NJEFA is an independent state authority and assists New Jersey colleges and universities in obtaining low-cost financing through the issuance of municipal bonds for development of their campus facilities. NJEFA is not a property manager of educational facilities. Generally, the Authority does not make any purchases on behalf of any colleges and universities.

It is our understanding that the Board Meeting minutes satisfy your request.

If your request for access to a government record has been denied or unfilled within the fourteen (14) business days required by law, you have a right to challenge the decision by the NJEFA to deny access. At your option, you may either institute a proceeding in the Superior Court of New Jersey or file a complaint with the Government Records Council (GRC) by completing the Denial of Access Complaint Form. You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
