Dear Mr. Kraft:

The New Jersey Educational Facilities Authority ("NJEDA" or the "Authority") received your Open Public Records Act ("OPRA") request on August 20, 2026. The official Records Custodian, Jamie O'Donnell, also received your OPRA request on August 20, 2026. As such, the seven (7) business day deadline to respond to your request is August 31, 2026. This response is being provided on the second business day.

Your OPRA request sought access to the following:

1. *All current copier, printer, and multifunction device (MFD) lease agreements, including the vendor/dealer, the leasing or finance company, the lease start and end dates (or term), the monthly or per-copy (cost-per-copy) cost, the number of devices, and the equipment make/model.*
2. *All current service or maintenance agreements for that equipment, including the service provider and the contract term.*
3. *Any resolution, board authorization, or approval adopted by the agency's board or governing body within the past five (5) years authorizing the award of a copier/MFD lease, a copier/printer purchase, or a managed print services (MPS) contract.*
4. *The awarded vendor's bid, proposal, or quote for that contract, including any cooperative-purchasing or state-contract reference (for example, a New Jersey State Contract T-number, Educational Services Commission of NJ, or Sourcewell) under which the equipment was leased or purchased.*
5. *Any record identifying the official title and official work contact information for the person or office responsible for purchasing or administering the agency's copier/printer/MFD contracts.*

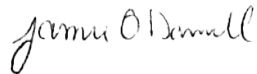

You may contact the GRC by toll-free telephone at 866-850-0511, by mail at P.O. Box 819, Trenton, NJ, 08625, by e-mail at grc@dca.state.nj.us, or at their web site at www.state.nj.us/grc. The GRC can also answer other questions about the law. All questions regarding complaints filed in Superior Court should be directed to the Court Clerk in your County.
