MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN, MICHAEL USLAN

The film and television industry is ever-evolving, influenced heavily by outside factors, technological advancements, market dynamics and consumer behavior. And while demand for original content from platforms like Netflix, Amazon Prime and Disney+ has surged, there have been numerous hurdles, and states that once thrived as filming hubs now face economic challenges and declining production numbers.

In stark contrast, New Jersey's film and television industry has experienced remarkable growth. Despite the pandemic and a series of labor disputes, our state has successfully weathered several storms and positioned itself as a prime location for film and television production, thanks to several key factors: our competitive financial incentives, diverse locations, skilled workforce, growing infrastructure and the hard work of our dynamic and experienced Film Commission. All of this points to New Jersey as a premier filming destination.

FILMING DESTINATION



How do we do it? Innovation has been a major focus, and outreach has been key to our efforts to attract production to New Jersey. Whether it's traveling to Los Angeles to meet one-on-one with studio executives, conducting sit-down conversations with filmmakers at the Toronto International Film Festival or taking meetings with key industry leaders at Cannes, we're delivering one simple message: There's no good reason to say "no" to New Jersey.

The Commission's Film Ready program provides essential training for county and municipal leaders, empowering them to host

film and television crews. The program has been instrumental in attracting both national and international productions to the state.

As a result, 2024 was a standout year, with productions such as the Academy Award-nominated *A Complete Unknown*, Adam Sandler's long-awaited sequel *Happy Gilmore 2* and a film about The Boss himself, *Springsteen: Deliver Me from Nowhere*. Make no mistake: This production momentum is absolutely one of the key factors contributing to Netflix's progress toward building their production studio right here, in Fort Monmouth.



If you're searching for another measuring stick, take note of our state's first-ever NJ Film Expo, produced by the Screen Alliance of New Jersey and sponsored by the NJEDA and the NJMPTVC. Held at the Meadowlands Arena, it was a joy to witness the wealth of energy and enthusiasm that the state's production industry has inspired. In closing, while some states grapple with the negative impacts of industry-wide shifts, New Jersey, and the New Jersey Motion Picture & Television Commission, have been hard at work building a Garden State success story.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

My first year as Executive Director of the New Jersey Motion Picture and Television Commission (NJMPTVC) has been one of extraordinary learning and growth, made possible through the mentorship of our dedicated Commissioners. With that same spirit of collaboration from our partners across State government, organized labor and local elected officials, New Jersey's entertainment industry is also experiencing tremendous growth, as evidenced by its emergence from the nation's eighth largest production hub in 2021 to nearly the fourth busiest location for film and television production in the country. Because of the groundwork laid by the Governor, the legislators in Trenton and the leadership at the New Jersey Economic Development Authority (NJEDA), New Jersey's

film industry is poised to make even greater gains in the years and decades to come.

Despite a slow start due to the threat of work stoppages, 2024 closed with record-breaking results: Production spending rose 41% year-over-year, from \$592 million in 2023 to \$834 million* in 2024. What makes this especially remarkable is that nearly all of our top competitors—California, Georgia, Illinois, Louisiana, New Mexico, Texas and Toronto—experienced declines (with only New York remaining flat).

Employment growth told the same story: The number of crew members hired in New Jersey nearly doubled, climbing from 17,000 in 2023 to 31,000* in 2024.

Looking ahead, the momentum shows no signs of slowing: More than **50 productions are confirmed for 2025** and eligible for the State's incentive program—setting the stage for another record-breaking year. At the same time, long-term infrastructure investments are transforming New Jersey into one of the premier production hubs in the world and will ensure continued growth in the State's estimated total in-state spend:

Lionsgate Newark, 1888 Studios in Bayonne, and Netflix Studios Fort Monmouth will deliver more than 800,000 square feet across 32 world-class soundstages.

70+ stages statewide, ranging from 5,000 to 36,000 square feet, now offer flexible options for productions of every size.

The results speak for themselves: From 2022-2024, **nearly 1,800 productions** —

— have filmed in New Jersey, delivering **\$1.7 billion in economic impact** and supporting more than **63,000 crew hires**.

With an unmatched variety of “lookalike” locations, a competitive tax-incentive program, rapidly expanding studio infrastructure, a concierge-like Film Commission and a skilled and growing workforce, New Jersey is no longer simply an alternative to the nation's traditional production hubs. 2024 proved that New Jersey, the birthplace of film, is the industry's future.

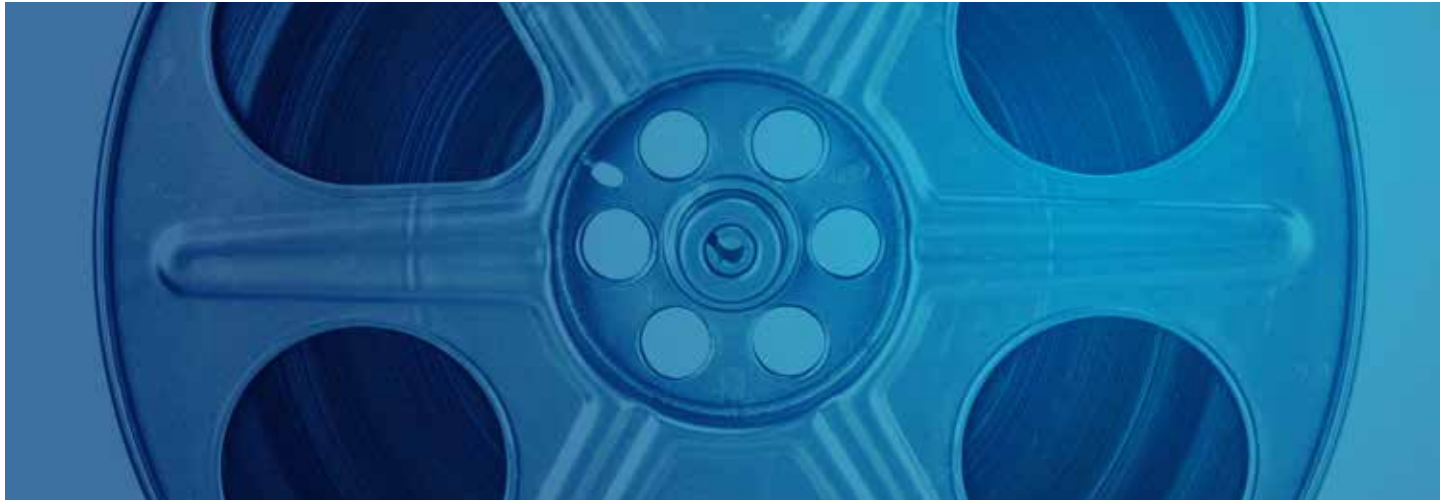

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The New Jersey Film Commission is pleased to present its 2024 Economic Impact Report, showcasing the resilience and growth of the film and television industry in our state. After overcoming the challenges posed by the Screen Actors Guild – American Federation of Television and Radio Artists (SAG-AFTRA) and Writers’ Guild of America (WGA) strikes of 2023 (and a slow start in 2024 due to threatened work stoppage,) New Jersey’s film industry has not only recovered, but has also achieved a new milestone in economic impact: In 2024, the industry generated an impressive

\$834 million* in estimated total in-state spend revenue, surpassing the previous record of \$701 million set in 2022. This remarkable achievement highlights New Jersey’s growing reputation as a premier location for film production, driven by our competitive tax incentives, diverse locations, concierge-style Film Commission, large and experienced workforce and expanding infrastructure. This report delves into the financial impact, employment opportunities and community benefits resulting from the robust slate of projects completed over the past year.

INDUSTRY GROWTH AND REVENUE

In 2024, New Jersey hosted 555 film and television projects, resulting in 2,422 filming days and \$834 million* in estimated total in-state spend revenue, an impressive 41% increase from the previous year. The average daily spend was \$335,564, up from \$215,688 in the previous year and, considering that the average daily spend in 2017 (the last full year before Governor Murphy signed the Garden State Film and Digital Media Jobs Act into law,) was \$24,089, this surge underscores the growing appeal of New Jersey as a prime location for filmmakers. The projects included a wide range of categories such as feature films, television series, commercials and music videos, showcasing the state’s versatility and capacity to support diverse production needs across all budgetary spectrums. Multiple projects, including *Springsteen: Deliver Me from Nowhere*, *Echo Valley*, and *Millers in Marriage*, considered filming in other states but ultimately decided on New Jersey based on the factors outlined above.

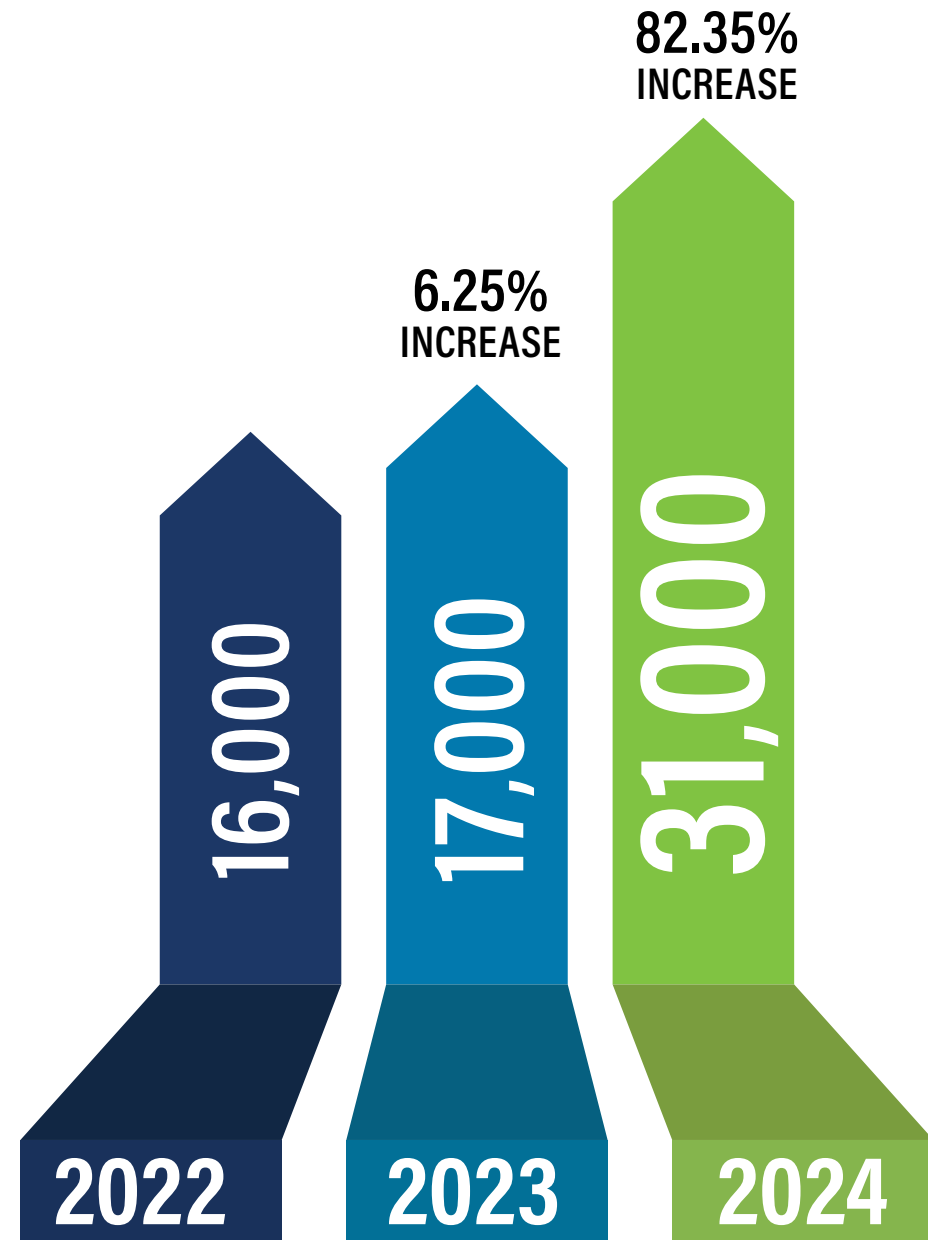

EMPLOYMENT IMPACT

The film and television industry has been a significant driver of job creation in New Jersey, with 31,000* hires for tax credit projects in 2024, almost double the number hired in 2023. The industry's expansion has opened a broad spectrum of employment opportunities, ranging from creative and technical roles in production, postproduction and within the permanent entertainment infrastructure. This growth has not only supported existing professionals but also attracted new talent, fostering a dynamic and thriving creative community in the state.

“HAPPY GILMORE 2”

Netflix brought five productions to New Jersey in 2024, with the major contributor being Adam Sandler’s long-awaited sequel to the 1996 comedy *Happy Gilmore*. *Happy Gilmore 2* hired 1,655 for its cast, crew and background actors and spent more than \$164.4 million in-state, a record amount for any tax-credit project since the legislation was signed into law in 2018. This project exemplifies how large-scale productions can have a profound economic impact on local economies.

“A COMPLETE UNKNOWN”

Walt Disney Studios’ Best Picture nominee *A Complete Unknown* was the second most significant project in New Jersey in 2024, employing 4,700 individuals over 61 filming days and amassing an estimated total in-state spend of \$80.9 million. The film’s spending was widespread, providing substantial benefits to local businesses and services.

Additionally, the production made charitable contributions, including \$7,500 to the Hoboken Educational Foundation and \$2,500 for the city’s neighborhood block association block party, reflecting a commitment to community engagement.



“A HOUSE OF DYNAMITE”

Netflix’s second largest project of the year, Kathryn Bigelow’s *A House of Dynamite*, contributed more than \$74.8 million in estimated total in-state spending over 37 filming days. The production actively sought extras with military experience, further engaging with New Jersey’s diverse talent pool.

COMMUNITY AND CULTURAL IMPACT

We expect that the influx of film and television projects will significantly boost tourism and cultural enrichment in New Jersey. Productions have utilized local landmarks, such as *A House of Dynamite*’s use of the State Capitol Complex and *Happy Gilmore 2*’s use of multiple golf courses around the state, enhancing the state’s visibility as a cultural hub. This increased activity has fostered a sense of pride and involvement among residents, who have welcomed the opportunity to participate in film-related events and activities.

Film industry auteurs who visited the state and created stories we’ll talk about for years to come include Pedro Almodóvar, who directed his first English-language film here; Kathryn Bigelow, who made her first film in eight years; and Jim Jarmusch, who brought his fifth film to New Jersey.

Also, productions filmed in New Jersey have gone on to receive international acclaim, with *A Complete Unknown*’s eight Academy Award nominations, including Best Picture, Best Director and Best Actor, and a host of productions that have played at major international film festivals, including *The Room Next Door* at the Venice Film Festival; *Americano* and *Millers in Marriage* at the Toronto Film Festival; *Kiss of the Spider Woman* at the Sundance Film Festival; *The History of Sound* at the Cannes Film Festival; and *Tow, Queens of the Dead* and *Lemonade Blessings* all premiering at the Tribeca Film Festival. Additionally, *A House of Dynamite*, *Springsteen: Deliver Me from Nowhere*, *Song Sung Blue*, and *Marty Supreme* are all premiering in the fall of 2025 during the lead-up to awards season, a strong indicator that the studios believe each film has a chance to capture some nominations at next year’s Academy Awards ceremony.

NOTABLE COMMUNITY CONTRIBUTIONS

The History of Sound asked us to post a crew call for entry level and assistant positions across many departments, and to engage diverse candidates.

Queen Latifah's documentary feature, *You Can Go Home Again*, focused on the actress and Newark native partnering on a real estate development meant to revitalize a neighborhood of her hometown with affordable housing.

A Complete Unknown made numerous \$500 to \$1,000 inconvenience agreements with merchants and businesses along Commerce Street in Newark while the production filmed in the city.

Following a great experience hosting the Hugh Jackman and Kate Hudson film *Song Sung Blue*, Garwood Mayor Jen Blumenstock is now pursuing the Commission's Film Ready certification to attract more productions to the borough.

CONCLUSION

The film and television industry's robust expansion in 2024 has solidified New Jersey's position as a premier production destination. The economic impact, job creation, and community contributions underscore the value of supporting this industry through continued investment and strategic incentives. As we look to the future, the New Jersey Film Commission remains committed to promoting the state's unique advantages and facilitating further growth in the film and television sector.

2024 PRODUCTION HIGHLIGHTS



18 The seeds for 2024's record-breaking economic impact were set early as all the projects that went on hiatus during the twin SAG-AFTRA and WGA strikes of 2023 finished filming in the first months of the year.

Despite the slow start to 2024, because of the threatened IATSE and SAG strikes, the year goes down in the record books as the best in estimated total in-state spend for the State.

Sony's *It Ends with Us*, starring Blake Lively and directed by Justin Baldoni, completed principal photography at the very end of January and premiered in August, making \$349 million worldwide at the box office.

FX's *American Sports Story: Aaron Hernandez* (and the second half of the third season of *American Horror Stories*, both from Ryan Murphy Productions) finished filming by the end of February before premiering later in the year. The former went viral, particularly for Norbert Leo Butz's performance as Bill Belichick.

On Apple TV+, the psychological thriller series *Before*, starring Billy Crystal playing against

type as a grieving widower trying to counsel a troubled young boy, filmed extensively around northern New Jersey. Ben Stiller's mind-bending hit, *Severance*, converted Holmdel's Bell Works back into the show's Lumon Industries. The second season received rave reviews when it premiered in early 2025, and the thriller *Echo Valley*, with Julianne Moore, Sydney Sweeney and Domhnall Gleeson, returned to Hunterdon and Morris Counties for about two weeks in June to finish filming. The film premiered on the streaming platform a year later, with critics praising Moore's committed turn and the relatable premise of how far a parent will go for their child.

Once these productions wrapped, there was an apprehension that production would slow down or cease completely. Fortunately, for New Jersey this was not the case, as more production came to the state than in the previous year and generated a historic amount of revenue. Here are some of the highlights of the 555 projects that were filmed in New Jersey in 2024.

FEATURE FILMS



In 1961, a Minnesotan named Robert Zimmerman hitchhiked to New Jersey to visit his childhood hero, Woody Guthrie, who was slowly dying of Huntington's disease at the now-demolished Greystone Psychiatric Hospital in Morris Plains. So begins James Mangold's *A Complete Unknown*, a retelling of the formative years of the musician known as Bob Dylan in New York's folk music scene. The biopic culminates with the 1965 Newport Folk Festival, filmed at Echo Lake Park in Mountainside, where Dylan famously plugged in an electric guitar to the consternation of the festival attendees. The film went on to be nominated for eight Academy Awards, including Best Picture, Best Director, Best Actor for Timothée Chalamet, Best Supporting Actor for Edward Norton playing Pete Seeger and Best Actress for Monica Barbaro playing Joan Baez. (A couple of New Jersey-born actors rounded out the cast: Charlie Tahan *Ozark* grew up in Glen Rock and P.J. Byrne *The Wolf of Wall Street* is from Old Tappan.) The entire production was, but for a single day, filmed in New Jersey, with Cape May doubling for Newport, RI, Jersey City doubling for Greenwich Village and Stillwater doubling for Beacon, NY.



Spanish auteur Pedro Almodóvar *Talk to Her*, *Bad Education* had never made an English-language feature-length film but that changed when he directed Tilda Swinton, Julianna Moore, John Turturro and Alessandro Nivola in *The Room Next Door*. The drama, based on the novel *What Are You Going Through* by Sigrid Nunez, won the Golden Lion at the 2024 Venice Film Festival for its story exploring the rekindling of a friendship between two women under extraordinary circumstances. Almodóvar shot the film at the Montclair Book Center, Westfield's police station, Montclair State University's Red Hawk Diner and Palisades Interstate Park.



At the tail-end of 2023, producer Ellen Schwartz, who has worked in New Jersey going back to 1986's *Streets of Gold*, asked the Commission to recommend locations for a film starring, written and directed by Edward Burns *Saving Private Ryan* called *Millers in Marriage*. Three months later, the film went into production in New Jersey, filming at the Columbia Club and Sorelina in Hoboken, St. Elizabeth University in Florham Park, the Madison Hotel and Convent Station in Morris Township and Hartley Farm in Harding. This dramedy, exploring universal questions about marriage and fidelity, professional success and failure and the challenge of finding a second act, went on to premiere at the 2024 Toronto International Film Festival. Joining Edward Burns in front of the camera were Julianna Margulies, Gretchen Mol, Minnie Driver, Morena Baccarin, Campbell Scott and Montclair resident Patrick Wilson.

The New Jersey Motion Picture & Television Commission prides itself on working with productions across all budget spectrums, especially when they go on to merit international attention. Such was the case with NJ director Deny Gallagher's *Americano*, a low budget feature shot in about 12 days with a mostly New Jersey cast and crew. The film, based on the director's feelings of frustration upon entering the job market after graduating college, also premiered at the Toronto International Film Festival.



William Hurt won his first Best Actor Academy Award for the 1985 drama *Kiss of the Spider Woman*, based on the renowned novel by Manuel Puig about a dialogue between a hardened leftist revolutionary and an apolitical gay man in a Brazilian prison during the military dictatorship. In 2024, *Dreamgirls* director Bill Condon adapted the Broadway musical version back into a film starring Jennifer Lopez in the title role alongside Diego Luna *Andor* and Tonatiuh the soap opera *Promised Land*, with Matt Damon and Ben Affleck on board as executive producers through their production company Artists Equity. The film, shot almost entirely on the soundstages of 10 Basin Studios in Kearny and Cinelease Stages in Jersey City, premiered at the 2025 Sundance Film Festival to generally positive reviews, with Lionsgate on board to release it in the fall.



New Jersey has always been able to play as different parts of the world and different time periods. This was fully on display in Oliver Hermanus's *The History of Sound*, starring Paul Mescal *Gladiator II* and Josh O'Connor *Challengers*. Based on the Pushcart Prize winning story by Ben Shattuck, *The History of Sound* follows the relationship between two men who meet in 1917 while attending the Boston Music Conservatory and, after World War I, travel together recording folk songs of their countrymen in rural Maine in the summer of 1920. The film premiered at the 2025 Cannes Film Festival and was nominated for the Palme d'Or. Jersey City and Hoboken played as Boston; Ramapo State Forest, Wawayanda State Park and Double Trouble State Park stand in for Maine; Hillview Farm in Gillette, Brook Valley Farm in Madison and Long Pond Ironworks State Park portrayed Kentucky; and Giralda Farms in Madison, Drew University and the Castle at Skylands Manor played as England.



George A. Romero, best known for popularizing the flesh-eating zombie in his 1968 film *Night of the Living Dead*, only worked once in New Jersey, on 1982's *Creepshow*. Not long before he died, his daughter, Tina Romero, approached him with the idea of an LGBTQ zombie horror-comedy that her father encouraged her to pursue and *Queens of the Dead* was born. Premiering at the 2025 Tribeca Film Festival, the film stars trans actor Jack Haven *I Saw the TV Glow*, Jaquel Spivey *Mean Girls*, Margaret Cho and special effects wizard Tom Savini, and was filmed primarily at the Art Factory in Paterson, an almost 200-year-old former rope factory in the heart of the city's Old Great Falls Historic District.



Yet another New Jersey production that premiered at the 2025 Tribeca Film Festival, *Tow* tells the true story of Amanda Ogle, a homeless Seattle woman who fought her way out of a dead-end job to reclaim her life. The film stars Ariana DeBose, Rose Byrne, Demi Lovato, Octavia Spencer and Cherry Hill's Dominic Sessa. Produced by Rose Byrne and directed by Stephanie Laing, the drama had Perth Amboy stand in for the Seattle waterfront, Bayonne play as Seattle's streets and the Essex County Courthouse and North Plainfield municipal court appear as Washington State's King County Courthouse.



A third New Jersey film going to the Tribeca Film Festival, *Lemonade Blessing* stars *Asteroid City* breakout Jake Ryan in a coming-of-age story about the awkwardness of adolescence in a religiously strict household, especially once he starts dating a classmate, played by Skye Alyssa Friedman. Chris Merola's raunchy dramedy filmed at Lodi Lanes, The First Congregational Church in Montclair and Palms Plaza Catering in Old Bridge, with additional photography in Howell, Middletown, Montclair and Park Ridge.



Famed avant-garde filmmaker Jim Jarmusch has filmed in New Jersey four times, beginning with his initial hit *Stranger Than Paradise* in 1984, so it should come as no surprise that he decided to bring a new feature to the state this year. *Father Mother Sister Brother* is a triptych of stories exploring the challenges of familial bonds. The New Jersey segment, shot at Two Pond Farm in West Milford, stars Adam Driver, Tom Waits and Mayim Bialik and will be distributed on Mubi after premiering in competition at the 2025 Venice Film Festival.



Netflix's biggest project was *Happy Gilmore 2*. The original 1996 comedy was a box office hit and became so synonymous with Adam Sandler's brand that he named his production company Happy Madison Productions (a combination of this film and his earlier hit, *Billy Madison*). In September 2024, Netflix and Happy Madison Productions began production on the much-anticipated sequel to *Happy Gilmore*, with Sandler reprising the hockey-player-turned-golfer alongside returning cast members Christopher McDonald, Ben Stiller and Kevin Nealon, and joined by newcomers Bad Bunny, Benny Safdie, Julie Bowen and Margaret Qualley. Kyle Newacheck,

known for directing and producing episodes of comedy television shows *Workaholics* and *What We Do in the Shadows*, directed the film in a multitude of locations around the state, including Fiddler's Elbow Golf Course in Bedminster, Fairleigh Dickinson University, Pleasantdale Chateau in West Orange and Newark International Airport. *Happy Gilmore 2* became the state's largest production ever.

Kathryn Bigelow, the first woman to win an Academy Award for Best Director for *The Hurt Locker*, has not made a movie since 2017's *Detroit*. Her upcoming collaboration with Netflix, *A House of Dynamite*, signals a return to the politically charged storytelling that has defined her most successful work. The film centers on a single, unattributed missile launched at the United States and the ensuing race to determine who is responsible and how to respond. Idris Elba, Rebecca Ferguson, Gabriel Basso, Jared Harris and Greta Lee star, with a script by Noah Oppenheim Netflix's *Zero Day*. New Jersey plays as Washington, DC, with the NJ State House standing in as the Pentagon and the Capitol Building and the USGA Golf Museum in Bernards as the West Wing, while the Trenton State Police Airport hangar in Ewing appears as Joint Base Andrews in Maryland and Monmouth University plays as the Kremlin. Filming also took place at Cinelease Stages.



Matt Damon and Ben Affleck, friends since elementary school, will appear next together on screen in their new Netflix crime thriller *The Rip*, from writer-director Joe Carnahan *Narc*, *Smokin' Aces*. In a story co-starring Steven Yeun, Kyle Chandler, Teyana Taylor, Catalina Sandino Moreno, and Sasha Calle, the film concerns a group of Miami police officers discovering a stash of millions in cash. Filming took place primarily at 10 Basin Studios in Kearny, along with additional locations in Bayonne, Elizabeth and the former Toys R Us headquarters in Wayne.



A Complete Unknown was not the only film that Timothée Chalamet shot in New Jersey this year; he also played a character loosely based on professional table tennis player Marty Reisman in Josh Safdie's film *Marty Supreme*. A24's film follows Marty Mauser, a young man with a dream no one respects, going to hell and back in pursuit of greatness. Gwyneth Paltrow co-stars in filming that took place in downtown Paterson, the Ritz Theater in Elizabeth, Meadowlands Arena in East Rutherford, and a house in Chesterfield.



In 1982, while working on his seminal album *Born in the U.S.A.* with the E Street Band, Bruce Springsteen holed up in a rented house in Colts Neck and recorded songs processing his feelings about the dark periods of his life. *Springsteen: Deliver Me from Nowhere* is an adaptation of Warren Zanes' book helmed by *Crazy Heart* director Scott Cooper. Jeremy Allen White, star of FX's *The Bear*, plays a young Springsteen, supported by Jeremy Strong as his manager, Stephen Graham as his father, Gaby Hoffmann as his mother and Odessa Young as his love interest. The film shot in Springsteen's hometown of Freehold, on the Asbury Park boardwalk and downtown Newark.



Milwaukee in the late 1980s and early 1990s was home to a well-known Neil Diamond cover band called Lightning & Thunder. Despite never finding success outside Wisconsin, the group, consisting of the couple Mike and Claire Sardina, was documented in the 2008 documentary *Song Sung Blue*, a title taken from Neil Diamond's 1972 Grammy-nominated song. *Hustle & Flow* director Craig Brewer retained the documentary's title in his retelling of Lightning & Thunder's tragic story, starring Hugh Jackman and Kate Hudson (joined by Michael Imperioli, Jim Belushi, and the musician King Princess in supporting roles). The film shot extensively in New Jersey, including at the Keansburg Amusement Park, St. Joseph's Wayne Hospital, Crossroads Bar and Grill in Garwood and downtown Denville, among others.



Among the critical infrastructure attracted to New Jersey in the wake of the passage of the Garden State Film and Digital Media Jobs Act was the production and post house Phippen Studios, which moved to Englewood Cliffs several years ago. They followed their first in-state production, the 1918 influenza epidemic comedy *Coup!*, with a romance directed by Julia Stiles *10 Things I Hate About You* called *Wish You Were Here*. Filming took place at The Art Factory in Paterson, Phippen's offices and various locations in East Orange and Maywood.



Trenton native Zach Woods, known for the American version of *The Office* and HBO's *Silicon Valley*, makes his feature directorial debut with *The Accompanist*, a touching story about the power of music and friendship. The director's grandmother is the inspiration for one of the main characters, a witchy yet funny foster parent played by Edison's Susan Sarandon, who takes in a young girl, played by newcomer Everly Carganilla. Aubrey Plaza co-stars as the girl's child welfare agent in a film produced by production company Caviar *Sound of Metal*. The film shot in the Branch Brook Park Skating Rink in Newark, Harold's NY Deli in Edison, Morris View Healthcare Center in Morris Township and several locations in Teaneck, where the director's grandmother used to live, including Teaneck Cinemas and Sagamore Park.



The City of Newark is the hometown of many famous actors, including Joe Pesci, Ray Liotta, Ice-T, Jason Alexander and Dana Owens (known to the world as Queen Latifah). The latter has filmed extensively in her home state, but in 2024 she returned to her home city for a different kind of project. The documentary feature *You Can Go Home Again* follows Queen Latifah on her passionate quest to build an affordable housing project in Newark.

SCRIPTED TELEVISION

A project that had been in the works since 2021, 20th Century Studios and Netflix's *The Beast in Me* assembled several luminaries from the era of Peak TV: Claire Danes *Homeland*, Matthew Rhys *The Americans* and Jonathan Banks *Breaking Bad*. The miniseries, created by Gabe Rotter of the 2015 revival of *The X-Files*, co-written by Howard Gordon of *24* fame and directed by Antonio Campos Netflix's Southern Gothic *The Devil All the Time*, follows a grieving author finding new purpose in unraveling the mystery behind her new neighbor's missing wife and his suspicious dealings. Production was based out of Mile End Stages in the Kearny Point Industrial Complex and the show filmed all around northern and central New Jersey, including Blairsden Manor in Peapack & Gladstone, G. Thomas DiDominico 16th Street Park in Bayonne, Branch Brook Park in Newark, downtown Red Bank and Tamaques Reservation in Westfield.

Another Netflix project arrived early in the year in the form of the second season of *The Night Agent*, created by Shawn Ryan *The Shield*. The story picks up as the main character, played by Gabriel Basso, finds himself fully immersed in the mysterious world of Night Action, a top-secret organization rife with lethal threats. Although filming was not exclusively in New Jersey, the production shot at Essex County Airport in Fairfield, the Warren Corporate Center in Warren and private residences in Mountainside and Plainfield. The show will be returning to New Jersey for its third season in 2025.

Étoile is an Amazon Prime Video series created by Amy Sherman-Palladino and Daniel Palladino, the team behind Amazon's immensely popular *The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel*. Their new collaboration with the streaming giant stars Luke Kirby, Charlotte Gainsbourg and Simon Callow, centering on two world-renowned ballet companies, one in New York City and one in Paris, swapping their most talented stars. Filming took place at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center and Newark International Airport.

Considering that Jon Hamm's most iconic role was in the long-running AMC series *Mad Men*, it should have come as no surprise when Apple TV+ brought him back to the world of television to lead their newest dark comedy, *Your Friends and Neighbors*, from creator Jonathan Tropper Cinemax's *Banshee*. This series, about a divorced hedge fund manager resorting to burglarizing his wealthy neighbors after losing his job, features a storyline about his son wanting to get into Princeton University. The production shot in the Mercer County college town at the Yankee Doodle Tap Room and Thomas Sweet Shop, with additional filming at the Bergen County Sheriff Station in Paramus and BlueMercury and The Valley Hospital in Ridgewood.

UNSCRIPTED TELEVISION

New Jersey had a typically robust year in the unscripted world as well. A variety of unscripted series filmed in-state, including *The Kitchen* and *Hard Knocks* (both of which benefited from the State's new reality incentives), *This Old House*, and with a standout presence from *On Patrol: Live*, which filmed locally for an impressive 90 days.

The world of true crime was full of interesting stories set in New Jersey. For example, the British channel U&W premiered a three episode miniseries, *Back from the Dead: Who Kidnapped Me?*, about the extraordinary story of Delimar Vera, a baby reported dead in a Philadelphia house fire in 1997 but found alive six years later in Willingboro.

A pilot for a Discovery ID show called *Bodies in the Water* covers the 2003 murder of 16-year-old Delaware resident Kimberly Holton, whose body was dropped from a private plane into the Atlantic Ocean and recovered less than 5 miles off the coast of Cape May Point.

The 9th season of Sky Crime UK's *World's Most Evil Killers* spotlighted Charles Cullen, the serial killer nurse who possibly murdered hundreds before finally being arrested in 2003 at the Somerset Medical Center in Somerville.

Season 2 of the Discovery+ show *Feds* covered the 2016 terrorist attack on 23rd Street in Chelsea, NY, and at the Seaside Semper Five Marine Corps Charity 5K run.

The British production company Raw TV, responsible for such buzzy documentaries as *The Hatchet Wielding Hitchhiker* and *Don't F*** with Cats*, produced *Mob War: Philadelphia vs The Mafia* about the Philadelphia mafia's dealings in Atlantic City, centering around gangsters Nicky Scarfo and Joey Merlino.

Hulu's docuseries *Scamanda* is based on the hit Lionsgate Sound podcast of the same name about Californian Amanda C. Riley, who claimed to have lymphoma and scammed people out of \$100K between 2012 and 2019. NBC News produced a docuseries about the Night Stalker, Richard Ramirez, who terrorized Los Angeles from 1984 to 1985, called, simply, *Ramirez*.

Netflix's *Cold Case: The Tylenol Murders*, concerns the deaths in Chicago from cyanide-laced Tylenol capsules in the 1980s; the perpetrator is still at large.

Discovery ID also returned their show *A Body in the Basement* to NJ for an episode about the case of Linda Weston, who kidnapped, tortured and murdered mentally disabled people in her Philadelphia basement.

In the food tourism subgenre, Guy Fieri has found Flavortown in New Jersey dating back to 2007 for his long-running show *Diners, Drive-ins and Dives*. This year, he once again rolled out to the Garden State, heading down the shore to visit Cavé Bistro and Seed to Sprout in Avon-By-The-Sea, Skratz Kitchen in Bradley Beach, Heights 167 and Jersey Shore BBQ in Point Pleasant Beach and Mutiny BBQ in Asbury Park, with a return visit to the Ritz Diner in Livingston, one of his first-ever stops in NJ, thrown in for good measure.

A couple fun lifestyle shows filmed in New Jersey as well. Amazon Prime's *Octopus!*, narrated by Phoebe Waller-Bridge (*Fleabag*), explores the mysteries of the titular cephalopod and the growing legion of people who happily admit to being a bit obsessed with the creatures, including Alpine resident, actor and comedian Tracy Morgan. And *Joe Lycett's United States of Birmingham* is a British TV series exploring the United States for cities, towns and villages named after Birmingham, England. He visited the unincorporated community of Birmingham in Pemberton Township, with a stop at the White Dotte Diner while he was in town.

NFL Films, based in Mount Laurel, had a busy year in-state as well. Their Netflix documentary miniseries *Aaron Rodgers: Enigma* captures the quarterback's return to the New York Jets after a devastating Achilles injury that ended his 2023 NFL season. The production highlighted Rodgers' unconventional approach to playing the quarterback position, as well as the events that ended his season in MetLife Stadium the year prior. HBO's long-running *Hard Knocks* series usually follows teams in the preseason but changed the formula this time around. *Hard Knocks: Offseason with the New York Giants* is the first-ever version of the series to focus on the NFL offseason, providing fans with an inside look at the Giants' operations during the NFL Draft, Scouting Combine and minicamps.

PROJECTS OUTSIDE THE INCENTIVE PROGRAM

How Total Estimated Yearly Spend Is Calculated: Of 2024's total film and television in-state productions, 8% participated in the New Jersey film tax incentive program and accounted for \$785 million of the year's total \$834 million* estimated total spend. The remaining 92% of in-state projects did not use -- or did not qualify -- for the incentive program; the total spend for these non-tax incentive productions was \$48 million. For non-tax incentive productions, the NJMPTVC gathers the total number of filming days directly from the production companies or from the 200 municipalities that issue film permits. The total estimated in-state spend is then calculated using the widely adopted Association of Film Commissioners International (AFCI) production revenue calculator and adjusts for inflation using data obtained from the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics' Consumer Price Index (CPI).

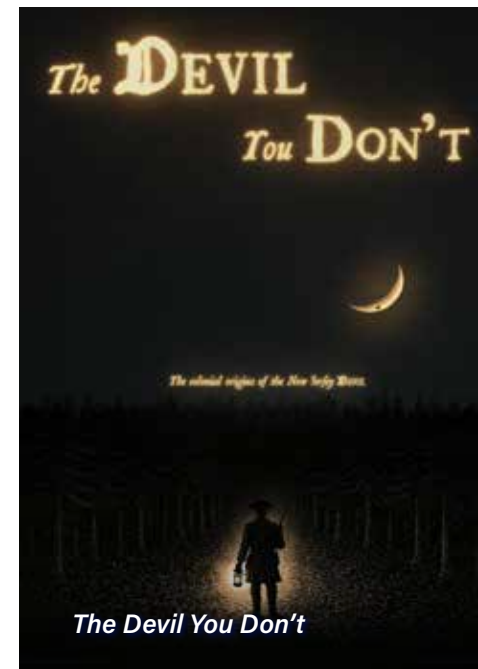
COMMERCIALS

Several notable commercials shot in New Jersey: Newark's Michael B. Jordan returned to his hometown to film a promo for *Propel* at Riverbank Park. Beyoncé, hot off the success of her country album *Cowboy Carter* that would go on to win several Grammys, starred in two ads for *Levi's Jeans*, one in a laundromat in Nutley and the other at the historic Bendix Diner in Hasbrouck Heights. *Napoleon Dynamite* actor Aaron Ruell has directed a number of

commercials since co-starring in the 2004 indie comedy, the latest being a series of spots for *Hershey's*, filmed at a house in Montclair. And after an eight year hiatus, *Doritos* resumed its "Crash the Super Bowl" contest, asking anyone with a camera to make their own 30-second spot and compete for cash prizes and the ability to work with famous directors. Two separate spots filmed in NJ for the competition, one in a house in Upper Montclair and the other in Eatontown.

SHORT FILMS

The industrial, educational, documentary and short films category rose sharply from previous years, partly driven by a surge in short films with evocative titles like *Swans Weep in Silence*, *Doves Under a Crescent Moon*, *Provisions of the Empty* and *The Distance Between Two Points*. Some additional standout titles include Jill Letteney's *Scout*, which won awards from Bergenfield's Northern Horror Festival, Edison's NJ Horror Con and the Jersey City Horror Festival; NB Cinema's *Kindred*, a powerful short film on the issue of human trafficking; *Silent Bliss*, the latest installment in JoeBert Entertainment's horror anthology series; Retro Dream Films' *A Creature Was Stirring*, about the German Christmas demon Krampus; and, for mythological creatures closer to home, Catfish Studios' *The Devil You Don't*, about the Jersey Devil.

New Jersey's vibrant music scene was captured in several music videos. ***New Kids on the Block***, the 1980's boy band that set the template for many of the boy bands to come, filmed a music video for their song *Kids* at a house in Midland Park. Rapper ***Cardi B***, whose breakout hit *Bodak Yellow* filmed its music video in Paterson back in 2017, returned to NJ, this time featured on the track *On Dat Money* for New Orleans rapper ***Rob49***. Jersey City deathcore band ***Fit for an Autopsy*** filmed two music videos in New Jersey: *Hostage* at Pyramid Mountain Natural Area in Montville and the Deserted Village of Feltville in Watchung Reservation, and *Savior of None/Ashes of All* at an abandoned house in Eatontown. Director John Decker filmed a music video for a favorite of the Asbury Park music scene, ***Renee Maskin***, at the Strauss Mansion Museum in Atlantic Highlands.

WEBCASTS

The number of web series and webcasts were also up over 2023. Eva Nosidam Productions shot a YouTube-style show called ***Sports Therapist*** in the courtyard of Mulligan's Pub in Hoboken. ***The New Jersey Hall of Fame*** shot interactive exhibit footage at Wreck'd Productions in Tinton Falls for their museum in American Dream, featuring Sayreville's Jon Bon Jovi. German production company Webentertainment GmbH shot a web series on the Seaside Heights boardwalk called ***Us Boys in New Jersey***. The educational web series ***Thor's Science Academy***, hosted by archaeologist Thornton Giese, filmed webisodes at his home's outdoor studio in

Clinton Township. Trenton-based upcycling company TerraCycle, which had its own reality TV show for a couple of seasons in the last decade, filmed a social media video on Wildwood Crest's beach for Netflix's documentary ***Our Oceans***, featuring an upcycled beach sculpture made from 2,000 pieces of beach and ocean plastic called Coco the Octopus. And, as a multimedia promotional tie-in to the Warner Bros. sequel ***Beetlejuice Beetlejuice***, Airbnb constructed a replica of the infamous Deetz residence from the original movie in Hillsborough and invited social media influencers to tour the installation.

CONCLUSION

Though the year might have started slow, with apprehension over work stoppage, 2024 marks the biggest year in New Jersey's entertainment sector with the largest amount in estimated total yearly spend. New Jersey led the country's production hubs in YoY growth with of a whopping 41%.

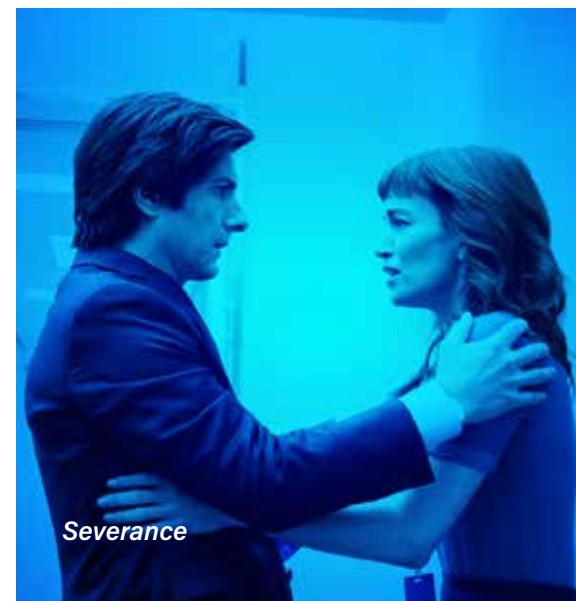

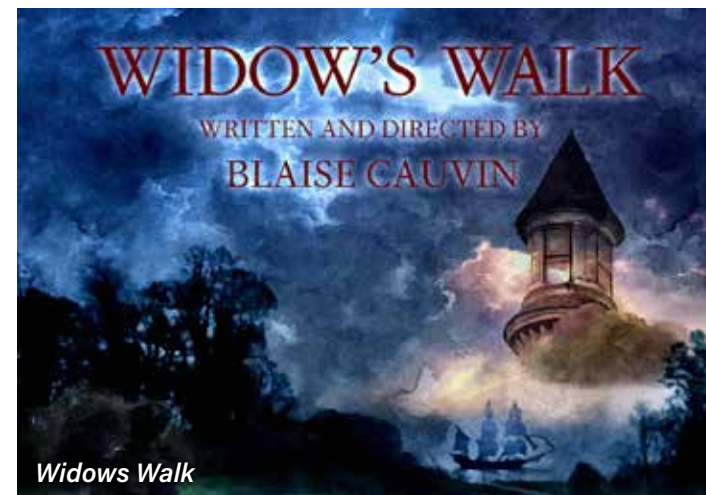

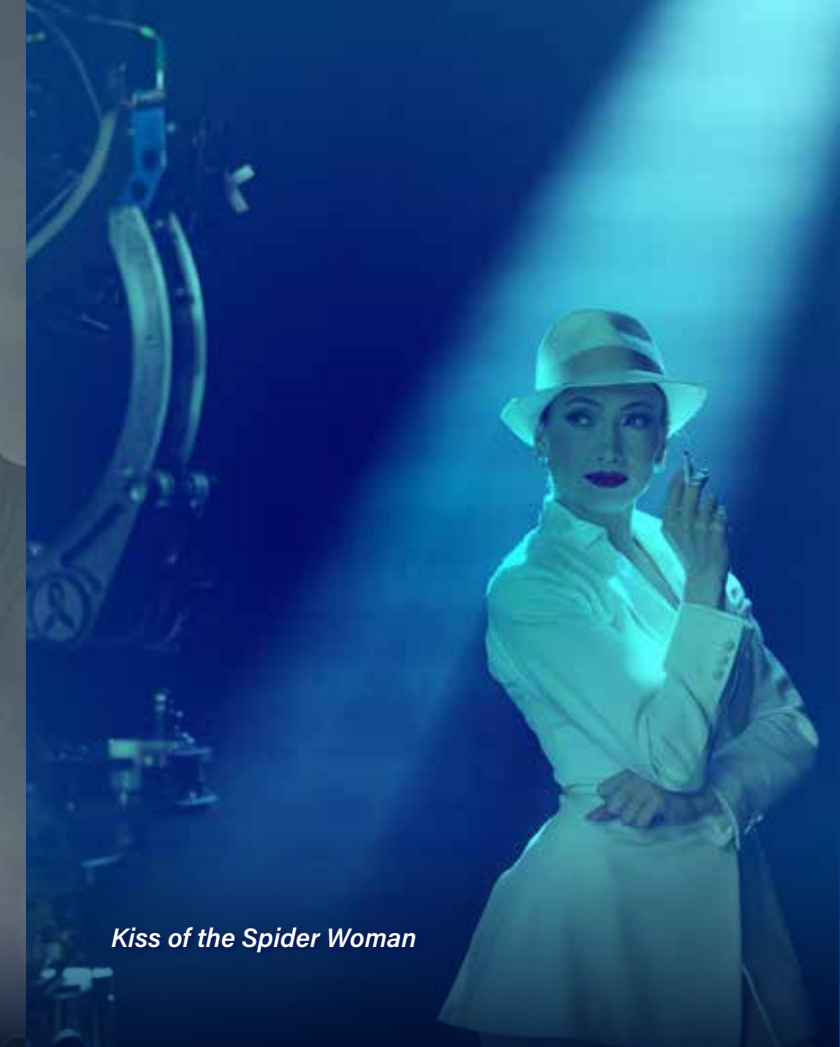
