

# **Post Permanency Services**

The New Jersey Adoption Subsidy Program provides support and assistance to families after their adoption is finalized. Although a caseworker is no longer assigned to your child, your family now has an assigned Subsidy Specialist to assist you with concerns or questions, and obtaining community resources. Your Subsidy Specialist can help with Medicaid, subsidy payments, address changes, and other issues important to your family.

#### **Casey Family Programs and Foster Care to Success**

Since 2000, The Casey Family Programs and Foster Care to Success Scholarships have helped thousands of foster youth and former foster youth attend and graduate from college and post-secondary training programs.

Undergraduate scholarships range from \$1500 to \$6000 annually and are renewable for up to five years.

Applicants must have been adopted from care after their 16th birthday, or have been in care for the consecutive 12 months prior to their 18th birthday. Scholarship recipients are eligible to participate in the Foster Care to Success Academic Success, Senior Year Coaching and Aim Higher Fellows programs, and to receive care packages.

There are now free in-home therapeutic support services available to post adoption and post kinship legal guardianship families. The goals of AKLG Clinical Services are for children to gain relationship experience to grow and heal emotionally and for families to build stronger relationships with increased feelings of attachment, trust, and safety. Treatment is available for pre-and post-adoptive and kinship families who live in New Jersey and whose child was placed through New Jersey's Child Protection agency. Children and teenagers aged 20 years old and younger are eligible. #### Adoption and Kinship Legal Guardianship Clinical Services (AKLG)

Children who have experienced abuse, neglect, or abandonment while in the care of their birth families often suffer from the effects of significant trauma. Their early experiences with loss cause them to struggle to feel safe with a parent or caregiver. As a result, they may behave in ways that appear unpredictable, oppositional, and even extreme.

Adoptive parents or caregivers may find it hard to manage the behaviors and connect with their children emotionally. Providing supportive care and effective treatment is crucial to help children recover from trauma and encourage healing within adoptive or kinship families.

#### We're here to help

Children's Aid and Family Services has extensive experience supporting pre- and post-kinship and adoptive families on their unique journeys. Unlike traditional treatment, our therapists work with you and your family in a collaborative partnership to help your child recover from trauma as well as strengthen your relationships.

Our therapists are trained in Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy, an attachment-focused treatment for families with kinship, foster, or adopted children. It emphasizes families working together with the therapist to help their children who experienced neglect, abuse, and trauma while with their birth families.

#### Goals for you and your family

The goals of AKLG Clinical Services are for children to gain relationship experience to grow and heal emotionally and for families to build stronger relationships with increased feelings of attachment, trust, and safety.

#### **Eligibility:**

- Treatment is available for pre-and post-adoptive and kinship families who live in New Jersey and whose child was placed through New Jersey's Child Protection agency.
- Children and teenagers aged 20 years old and younger are eligible.

#### Location:

Our therapist meets weekly with you and your family in the comfort of your home. The focus is on you -- the parent or caregiver -- and helping you build a solid relationship with your child.

#### Cost:

There is no cost for our services.
