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Public Assistance Policy Changes

On August 3, 2022, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) published a final rule Federal Register: Public Assistance Program's Simplified Procedures Large Project Threshold. This will increase the simplified procedures threshold (also known as the small project threshold) to \$1 Million. The new rules apply to funding obligated after August 3, 2022.

Mitigation Grant Awards

For FY2021, NJ received the 3rd highest Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) funding in the country behind Louisiana and Texas. In addition, five competitive Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC) applications were awarded. Below is a breakdown.

BRIC Total Award: \$36,887,108.39 FMA Total Award: \$25,077,378.66

Emergency Response Bureau

The Emergency Response Bureau (ERB) continues outreach on behalf of the NJ State Emergency Response Commission. Pursuant to Executive Order 284 (Murphy 2022), the redistricting of Local Emergency Planning Committees (LEPC) is underway to ensure compliance with federal mandates. Many counties are on board to be designated as Emergency Planning Districts.
