

Our History...

NJ-TF1 was established in 1996 to address a Technical Rescue void in our State's emergency response plan. The team currently resides within the Division of State Police, Homeland Security Branch, Emergency Management Section, Emergency Response Bureau, USAR Unit.



ince its inception, NJ-TF1 has responded to many structural collapse incidents and natural disaster events Some include the NYC World Trade Center attacks, the Atlantic City parking garage collapse, the '04 Warren County flood/swift water rescue events, the Eatontown commercial building gas explosion, Hurricane Katrina, the Southampton trench rescue, the Passaic County floods, the Hackensack collapse, and Hurricane Irene. In addition to operational deployments, NJ-TF1 participated in the TOPOFF 3 Exercise in New London, CT. NJ-TF1 has also been requested to provide Technical Rescue equipment and assistance during the 2000 Republican National Convention in Phila., PA and the Democratic National Convention in NY, NY. The team is divided into six distinct components, Search, Rescue, Planning, Logistics, HazMat and Medical. All components train regularly in their respective discipline at the NJ-TF1 Training Facility in Lakehurst, NJ.

What We Provide

- Incident Advance Team to assist the Incident Commander in assessment and technical support.
- 100,000 pounds of state-of-the-art search and rescue equipment.
- Self-Sufficiency for the first 72 hours with base camp, supplies and communications in order not to impact local resources.
- **Deployment** up to 10 days with a 80 member task force.
- Modular or full deployment depending on IC's needs.
