Course Goal:

This 2-day course (16 hours) explores the role, design, and functions of the Emergency Operations Centers and their relationships in disaster recovery for the local community. It is intended to increase local community awareness of issues involved in disaster recovery by providing a forum for discussion of “lessons learned” in disaster recovery and promote the development of a pre-disaster recovery plan at the county or local levels of government.

Course Description:

The revised course introduces disaster recovery principles and includes current recovery practices and policies. Activities are included in the course to support engaged and participatory learning. A variety of resources for recovery planning are provided and taught in the course, including a FEMA online Community Recovery Management Toolkit (CRMT) and a resource section associated with the Pre-Disaster Recovery Planning Guide for Local Governments (PDRPG-L) that contains links to model plans, templates, tools, lessons learned, best practices, and a range of supplemental reference materials and related pre-disaster planning and disaster recovery resources.

Course Objectives:

After completing this course, participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate an increased knowledge of local government responsibilities and challenges associated with disaster recovery.
- Explain the need to develop, revise, and/or implement a pre-disaster recovery plan.
- Apply an increased understanding of recent “lessons learned” in disaster recovery at the local level recovery.

- IS-2900.a: National Disaster Recovery Framework (NDRF) Overview is a required prerequisite.
- IS 100.c: Introduction to the Incident Command System is a recommended prerequisite.

Additional Information:

G0205 is a **required** course for the Advanced Professional Series (APS) certificate. *Enrollment is limited to 30 students.*

Selection Criteria:

Applicants will be selected based on properly completed applications, completed prerequisites, and whole community representation.
