COVID Analytics: Assessing the Damage

▶ Economic Triage

- ▶ Identify your strengths (strong state leadership, Heldrich Center, One Stop system, public and private colleges, Workforce Consortium, HESSA, BIONJ, Einstein's Alley, CTE network, well established non-profits)
- ▶ Identify the populations most negatively impacted by the pandemic economy (nationally women, disproportionately young women of color, men 18-30 of color, Class of 2020)
- ▶ Identify the sectoral and regional pain points (beach economies, agricultural seasons, commercial real estate, Class of 2021, Class of 2025)

Recovery Basics

- ▶ Think Regionally
 - ▶ New York and Eastern Pennsylvania
 - ▶ Countywide approaches
 - ▶ Communicate labor market data
- ▶ Design Partnerships that put work at the center
 - ▶ Communication
 - ▶ Shared services that minimize duplication
 - ▶ Facilitate work-based learning—OJT, paid Internships, registered apprenticeships

Defining the new normal

- ▶ Safe work places, vaccinated workers
- ▶ Lifeboat jobs, gateway jobs, destination jobs, career pathways for retail workers,
- ▶ Investing in front line One-Stop workers, navigators, career coaches
- ▶ Reading, mathematics and digital skills
- ▶ Entrepreneurs and small business
- ▶ Continuous improvement of the system and approaches—assess, intervene, assess, pivot
