September 15, 2021

Claims Counts

- March-December 2020 1,914,014 claims filed
- January-August 2021 419,049 claims filed
- 2,333,063 total claims filed since March 2020
 - For comparison, averaged 490,000 per year prepandemic (2017-19)
- Total of \$33 Billion in payments issued since March 2020

CARES Act Stimulus Programs

- Pandemic Emergency Unemployment
 Compensation (PEUC) Federal Extension
 - 13 weeks as of 3/29/20
 - Additional 11 weeks effective 12/27/20
 - Additional 25 weeks effective 3/14/21
 - Potential of 49 additional weeks of benefits
 - Last payable week for PEUC is 9/4/21
 - 310,000 claimants currently receiving PEUC

CARES Act Stimulus Programs

- Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA)
 - Program for claimants not eligible for UI benefits
 - Self-employed, invalid UI claims, not eligible for UI for pandemic related reason
 - Last payable week for PUA is 9/4/21
 - WBR = to UI rate if monetarily eligible; in invalid UI claim, receive PUA minimum of \$230 per week
 - Have to verify labor market attachment since January 2019 to qualify
 - 573,000 PUA claims filed since March 2020
 - 240,000 current PUA claims receiving payment within past 4 weeks

CARES Act Stimulus Programs PUA verification

- Any PUA claim receiving payment after 12/26/20 has to verify labor market attachment to continue to qualify for PUA
- This includes verifying any employment since January 2019 OR if no employment documenting a job offer that was cancelled due to COVID
- Sent over 340,000 emails to PUA claims to verify
- 82,000 denied for not verifying PUA
- 127,000 have been verified
- 60,000 open with no response yet
- 70,000 to still be reviewed

CARES Act Stimulus Programs

- Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC)
 - For weeks paid between 4/4/20 and 7/25/20, additional payment of \$600 for any UI/PEUC/EB week paid
 - For weeks paid between 1/2/21 and 9/4/21, additional payment of \$300 for any UI/PEUC/EB week paid
 - Must receive at least \$1 of UI/PEUC/EB payment or if full payment goes towards offsetting an overpayment to receive FPUC
 - Last payable week for FPUC is 9/4/21

CARES Act Stimulus Programs

- State Extended Benefits (EB)
 - Extended Benefit program for claimants on UI/PEUC benefits (not eligible if on PUA)
 - Additional 13 weeks after UI/PEUC are exhausted
 - Tied to state's UI rate
 - Once PEUC ends 9/4/21, those claims will move to EB. Have to meet EB requirements to be eligible
 - Work in 20 weeks or have 40x their WBR in earnings in Base Year
 - If disqualified for MC or RSW, need to requalify with earnings of 4x their WBR after disqualification start date
 - 94,000 PEUC claimants already received and exhausted their EB entitlement

Messaging

- Email sent to 663,000 claimants that will have no eligibility after 9/4/21 advising them of end of programs
- Sent to all PUA claimants regardless of current status and all that exhausted EB and have no further eligibility
- Email blast sent four weeks prior to end of programs

Summary of Exhaustees

- 240,000 current PUA claimants
- 94,000 current PEUC claimants that already received EB
- Total of 334,000 claimants with no further eligibility after payment for week-ending 9/4/21
