ARREST SUMMARY FOR NON-INDEX OFFENSES

MANSLAUGHTER

Definition

The unlawful killing of a human being, by another, through gross negligence. Arrests relating to traffic fatalities are included.

- There were 18 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies of the state for manslaughter during the year. This represents a 58 percent decrease compared to 1991.
- Adults accounted for 83 percent and juveniles accounted for 17 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 100 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty percent of the persons arrested were white, 50 percent were black.
- The Hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 17 percent of the arrests and 83 percent were Non-Hispanic.

SIMPLE ASSAULT

Definition

Simple assault, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System, is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were 42,176 simple assault arrests in 1992, representing an 11 percent increase when compared to 1991.
- Of the total, 23 percent were juveniles and 77 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 80 percent and females 20 percent of the persons arrested for simple assault.
- Sixty-one percent of the persons arrested were white, 38 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Thirteen percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 87 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

ARSON

Definition

Under this program, arson is defined as the willful or malicious burning, or attempting to burn, with or without intent to defraud; a dwelling house, building, ship or vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft, contents of building, personal property of another, etc.

- There were 581 arrests reported for arson offenses, a 15 percent decrease compared to 1991.
- Juveniles accounted for 59 percent and adults 41 percent of persons arrested for arson.
- Ninety percent of the total arson arrests were males while 10 percent were females.
- Seventy-six percent of the persons arrested were white, 23 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 10 percent of those arrested and Non-Hispanics accounted for 90 percent.

FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

Definition

The definition of forgery and counterfeiting is the making, altering, uttering or possessing or attempting to make, alter, utter or possess, with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true.

- There were 1,404 arrests reported by the law enforcement agencies of the state for forgery or counterfeiting during the year. This represents a 12 percent decrease compared to 1991.
- Adults accounted for 94 percent and juveniles accounted for 6 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 70 percent of the arrests and females 30 percent.
- Fifty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, 28 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 13 percent of the arrests and 75 percent were Non-Hispanic.

FRAUD

Definition

In Uniform Crime Reporting, fraud is the fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. This includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were 6,368 arrests reported during the year for fraud, a 17 percent decrease compared to 1991.
- Adult arrests represented 96 percent and juveniles 4 percent of the persons arrested.
- Males accounted for 61 percent and females 39 percent of the persons arrested for fraud.
- Sixty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, 30 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- Eight percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 92 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

EMBEZZLEMENT

Definition

The definition of embezzlement is the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

- There were 98 persons arrested for embezzlement, a 2 percent increase compared to 1991.
- Ninety-four percent of those persons arrested were adults and 6 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 61 percent and females 39 percent of the persons arrested for embezzlement.
- Sixty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, 30 percent were black and 2 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 21 percent of those arrested and Non-Hispanics accounted for 79 percent.

STOLEN PROPERTY (Buying, Receiving, Possessing)

Definition

Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

- In 1992, there were 11,558 arrests reported for stolen property, a decrease of 11 percent compared to 1991.
- Of the total, 60 percent were adults and 40 percent were juveniles.
- Eighty-eight percent were males and 12 percent were females.
- Forty-two percent of the persons arrested were white, 57 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 17 percent of the arrests and 83 percent were Non-Hispanic.

CRIMINAL/MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

Definition

Criminal/malicious mischief is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.

- There were 13,113 arrests for criminal/malicious mischief; a decrease of 2 percent compared to 1991.
- Juveniles accounted for 60 percent and adults 40 percent of persons arrested for criminal/malicious mischief.
- Males accounted for 90 percent and females 10 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-three percent of the persons arrested were white, 26 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Twelve percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and Non-Hispanics accounted for 88 percent.

WEAPONS: CARRYING, POSSESSING, etc.

Definition

Under this program, this offense includes all the violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were 7,723 arrests reported for weapon offenses; a 10 percent increase compared to 1991.
- Of the total, 67 percent were adults and 33 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 91 percent and females 9 percent of those arrested.
- Fifty-three percent of those arrested were white, 45 percent were black, and 2 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 15 percent of those arrested and 85 percent were Non-Hispanic.

PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE

Definition

Prostitution and commercialized vice are sex offenses of a commercialized nature and attempts. Included in this category are prostitution, keeping a bawdy house, procuring or transporting women for immoral purposes, etc.

- There were 2,537 arrests reported for prostitution and commercialized vice during 1992, representing an increase of 7 percent when compared to 1991.
- Ninety-nine percent of the arrests were adults with the remaining 1 percent being juveniles.
- Females accounted for 62 percent and males 38 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-three percent of those arrested were white, 47 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 20 percent of the arrests and 80 percent were Non-Hispanic.

SEX OFFENSES

Definition

Sex offenses, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting Program, do not include rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Included in this class are offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like; attempts are also included.

- There were 2,458 sex offense arrests during 1992, representing an increase of 3 percent when compared to 1991.
- Adults accounted for 80 percent, and juveniles 20 percent of the arrests.
- Ninety-five percent were males and 5 percent were females.
- Sixty-seven percent of the persons arrested were white, 31 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Fourteen percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 86 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

Definition

Under the program, drug abuse violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacturing, possession/use of the below listed narcotics and drugs:

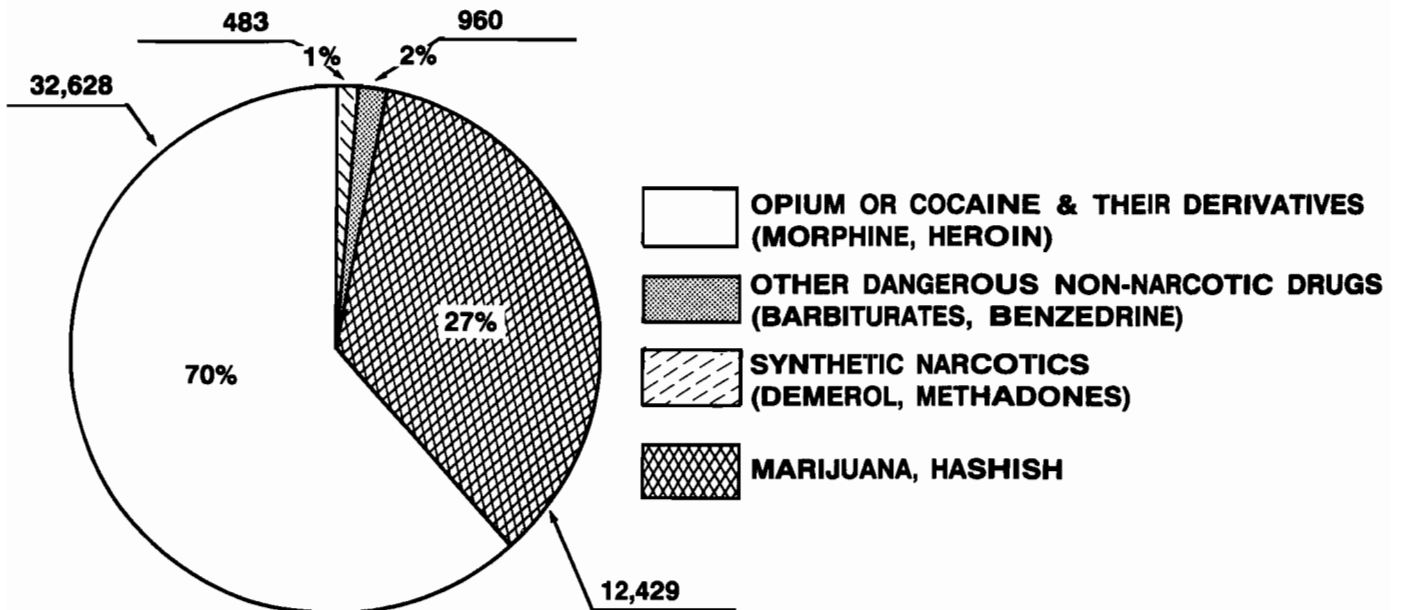
- a. Opium or Cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine).
- b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
- c. Synthetic narcotics—manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction—(demerol, methadones).
- d. Other—dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, amphetamines, hallucinogens).

- There were 46,500 arrests reported by the law enforcement agencies of the state for drug abuse violations; a 1 percent increase compared to 1991.
- Adults accounted for 89 percent and juveniles 11 percent of the arrests.





- Twenty-eight percent of persons arrested for drug abuse violations were under the age of 21.
- Males accounted for 86 percent of all the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 14 percent.
- Fifty-three percent of the persons arrested were black, 47 percent were white, and less than one-half of one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 15 percent of those arrested and 85 percent were not Hispanic.
- Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted for 64 percent of the arrests, and the remaining 36 percent were for the sale/manufacturing of drugs.
- Arrests for opium or cocaine and their derivatives represented 62 percent of the possession/use category and 85 percent of the sale/manufacturing category. Overall, they accounted for 70 percent of the total drug abuse violation arrests.

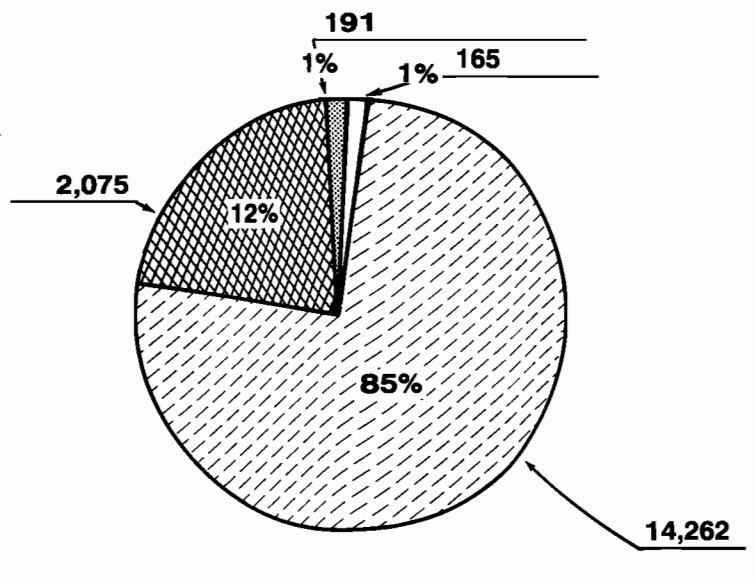
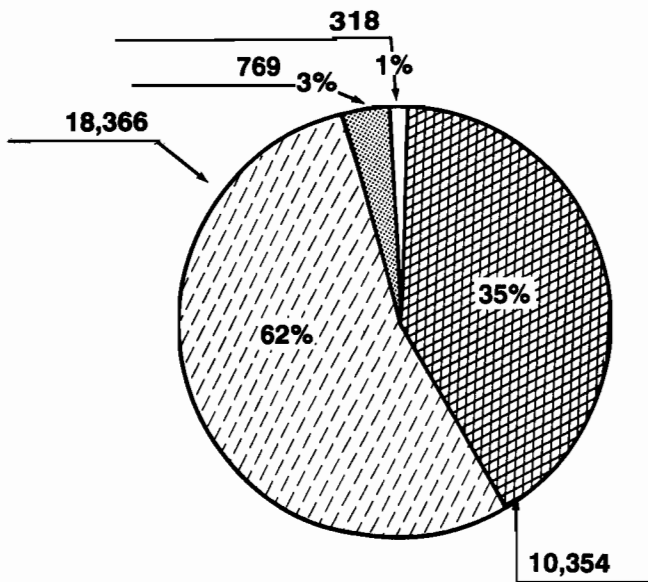

GAMBLING

Definition

Gambling violations are defined as the promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.

- There were 595 gambling arrests reported during 1992, resulting in a decrease of 33 percent compared to 1991.
- Eighty-seven percent of the arrests were adults and 13 percent were juveniles.
- Males represented 82 percent and females 18 percent of the gambling arrests.
- Seventy-three percent of the persons arrested were white, 19 percent were black, and 8 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 22 percent of the arrests and 78 percent were not Hispanic.

OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN

Definition

The definition of offenses against family and children is the nonsupport, neglect, desertion or abuse of family and children.

- There were 14,901 arrests for offenses against family and children during 1992, representing an increase of 2 percent from the previous year.
- Less than one-half of one percent of the arrests were juveniles, and nearly 100 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 95 percent and females 5 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 46 percent were black, and less than one-half of one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 13 percent of the arrests and 87 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

Definition

Under the New Jersey Crime Reporting Program, the offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were 35,967 arrests reported for driving under the influence in 1992, a decrease of 8 percent compared to 1991.
- Ninety-nine percent of the arrests were adults and only 1 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 88 percent of the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 12 percent.
- Eighty-seven percent of the persons arrested were white, 12 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Twelve percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 88 percent were not Hispanic.

LIQUOR LAWS

Definition

Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of "driving under the influence."

- There were 10,949 arrests reported for liquor law violations, a decrease of 20 percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 68 percent of the arrests while the remaining 32 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 81 percent of the liquor law arrests while females accounted for the remaining 19 percent.
- Ninety percent of the persons arrested were white, 9 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 6 percent of those arrested and 94 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Definition

In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were 39,299 arrests for disorderly conduct in 1992, a decrease of 2 percent compared to 1991.
- Seventy-four percent of the arrests were adults while the remaining 26 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 81 percent and females 19 percent of the disorderly conduct arrests.
- Sixty-one percent of the persons arrested were white, 38 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 11 percent of the arrests and 89 percent of those arrested were not Hispanic.

VAGRANCY

Definition

In this category are persons charged with vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc.

- There were 166 arrests in this category during the year, a 4 percent increase compared to 1991.
- Juveniles accounted for 27 percent of the arrests while adults accounted for the remaining 73 percent.
- Males represented 76 percent and females 24 percent of the arrests in this category.
- Fifty-five percent of the persons arrested were white, 45 percent were black.
- Sixteen percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 84 percent were Non-Hispanic.

ALL OTHER OFFENSES

Definition

Included in this category are all violations of state and local laws, except those offenses that can be categorized into one of the specific crime classifications previously mentioned.

- There were 83,304 arrests reported for all other offenses during 1992, a 2 percent decrease compared to 1991.
- Adults accounted for 87 percent and juveniles 13 percent of persons arrested for all other offenses.
- Eighty-two percent of the arrests were males while 18 percent were females.
- Sixty-two percent of the persons arrested were white, 37 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 11 percent of those arrested and 89 percent were not of Hispanic origin.

CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS

Definition

In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

- There were 1,950 arrests reported for curfew and loitering law violations during 1992; this represents an 8 percent decrease compared to 1991.
- Males represented 81 percent and females 19 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-five percent of the persons arrested were white, 34 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 14 percent of the arrests and non-Hispanics accounted for 86 percent of those arrested.

RUNAWAYS

Definition

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, this category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provisions of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were 5,642 runaway arrests reported in 1992, an 8 percent increase compared to 1991.
- Females accounted for 58 percent and males accounted for 42 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, 41 percent were black, and 1 percent were other races.
- Seventeen percent of the persons arrested were Hispanic and 83 percent were not of Hispanic origin.
