ARREST SUMMARY FOR NON-INDEX OFFENSES

MANSLAUGHTER

Definition

The unlawful killing of a human being, by another, through gross negligence. Arrests relating to traffic fatalities are included.

- There were 30 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies of the state for manslaughter during the year. This represents a 17 percent decrease compared to 1993.
- Adults accounted for 80 percent and juveniles accounted for 20 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 90 percent of the arrests and females 10 percent.
- Sixty percent of the persons arrested were white, forty percent were black.
- The hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 10 percent of the arrests and 90 percent were non-hispanic.

SIMPLE ASSAULT

Definition

Simple assault, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System, is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were 41,096 simple assault arrests in 1994, representing a 1 percent decrease when compared to 1993.
- Of the total, 23 percent were juveniles and 77 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 79 percent and females 21 percent of the persons arrested for simple assault.
- Sixty percent of the persons arrested were white, thirty-nine percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Fourteen percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and eighty-six percent were not of hispanic origin.

ARSON

Definition

Under this program, arson is defined as the willful or malicious burning, or attempting to burn, with or without intent to defraud; a dwelling house, building, ship or vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft, contents of building, personal property of another, etc.

- There were 583 arrests reported for arson offenses, a 10 percent increase compared to 1993.
- Juveniles accounted for 56 percent and adults 44 percent of persons arrested for arson.
- Eighty-six percent of the total arson arrests were males while fourteen percent were females.
- Seventy-four percent of the persons arrested were white, twenty-five percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 12 percent of those arrested and non-hispanics accounted for 88 percent.

FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

Definition

The definition of forgery and counterfeiting is the making, altering, uttering or possessing or attempting to make, alter, utter or possess, with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true.

- There were 1,315 arrests reported by the law enforcement agencies of the state for forgery or counterfeiting during the year. This represents a 4 percent decrease compared to 1993.
- Adults accounted for 97 percent and juveniles accounted for 3 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 72 percent of the arrests and females 28 percent.
- Fifty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, thirty-nine percent were black, and three percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 16 percent of the arrests and 84 percent were non-hispanic.

FRAUD

Definition

In Uniform Crime Reporting, fraud is the fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. This includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were 6,122 arrests reported during the year for fraud, a 4 percent decrease compared to 1993.
- Adult arrests represented 97 percent and juveniles 3 percent of the persons arrested.
- Males accounted for 60 percent and females 40 percent of the persons arrested for fraud.
- Sixty-six percent of the persons arrested were white, thirty-one percent were black, and three percent were other races.
- Nine percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and ninety-one percent were not of hispanic origin.

EMBEZZLEMENT

Definition

The definition of embezzlement is the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

- There were 83 persons arrested for embezzlement, a 17 percent increase compared to 1993.
- Ninety-four percent of those persons arrested were adults and six percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 69 percent and females 31 percent of the persons arrested for embezzlement.
- Sixty-three percent of the persons arrested were white, thirty-five percent were black and two percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 12 percent of those arrested and non-hispanics accounted for 88 percent.

STOLEN PROPERTY (Buying, Receiving, Possessing)

Definition

Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

- In 1994, there were 9,952 arrests reported for stolen property, a decrease of 5 percent compared to 1993.
- Of the total, 66 percent were adults and 34 percent were juveniles.
- Eighty-eight percent were males and twelve percent were females.
- Forty-one percent of the persons arrested were white, fifty-eight percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 16 percent of the arrests and 84 percent were non-hispanic.

CRIMINAL/MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

Definition

Criminal/malicious mischief is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.

- There were 11,596 arrests for criminal/malicious mischief, an increase of 1 percent compared to 1993.
- Juveniles accounted for 58 percent and adults 42 percent of persons arrested for criminal/malicious mischief.
- Males accounted for 89 percent and females 11 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-nine percent of the persons arrested were white, thirty percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Twelve percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and non-hispanics accounted for 88 percent.

WEAPONS: CARRYING, POSSESSING, etc.

Definition

Under this program, this offense includes all the violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were 7,490 arrests reported for weapon offenses, a 5 percent decrease compared to 1993.
- Of the total, 65 percent were adults and 35 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 91 percent and females 9 percent of those arrested.
- Fifty-four percent of those arrested were white, forty-five percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 15 percent of those arrested and 85 percent were non-hispanic.

PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE

Definition

Prostitution and commercialized vice are sex offenses of a commercialized nature and attempts. Included in this category are prostitution, keeping a bawdy house, procuring or transporting women for immoral purposes, etc.

- There were 2,590 arrests reported for prostitution and commercialized vice during 1994, representing a decrease of 16 percent when compared to 1993.
- Ninety-nine percent of the arrests were adults with the remaining one percent being juveniles.
- Females accounted for 63 percent and males 37 percent of the arrests.
- Forty-five percent of those arrested were black, fifty-four percent were white, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 20 percent of the arrests and 80 percent were non-hispanic.

SEX OFFENSES

Definition

Sex offenses, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting Program, do not include rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Included in this class are offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like; attempts are also included.

- There were 2,325 sex offense arrests during 1994, representing a decrease of 5 percent when compared to 1993.
- Adults accounted for 79 percent, and juveniles 21 percent of the arrests.
- Ninety-seven percent were males and three percent were females.
- Sixty-five percent of the persons arrested were white, thirty-two percent were black, and two percent were other races.
- Sixteen percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and eighty-four percent were not of hispanic origin.

DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

Definition

Under the program, drug abuse violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacturing, possession/use of the below listed narcotics and drugs:

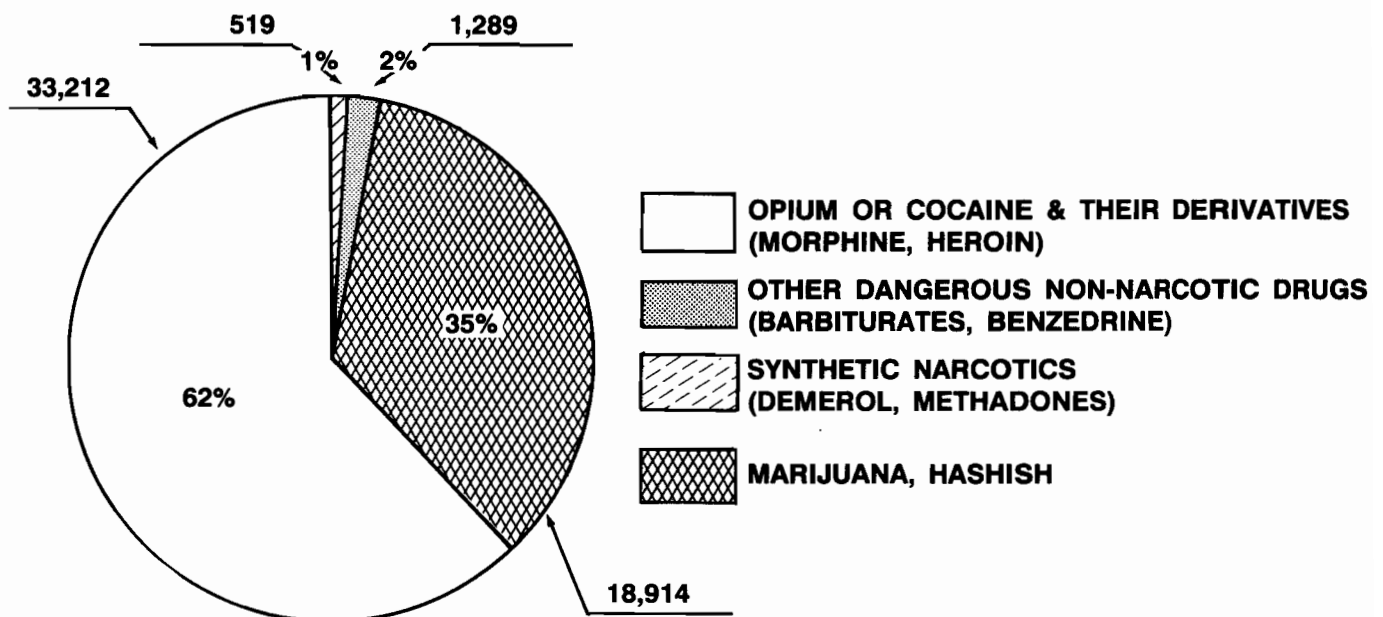
- a. Opium or Cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine).
- b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
- c. Synthetic narcotics—manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction—(demerol, methadones).
- d. Other—dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, amphetamines, hallucinogens).

- There were 53,934 arrests reported by the law enforcement agencies of the state for drug abuse violations, a 13 percent increase compared to 1993.
- Adults accounted for 84 percent and juveniles 16 percent of the arrests.

- Thirty-six percent of persons arrested for drug abuse violations were under the age of 21.
- Males accounted for 87 percent of all the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 13 percent.
- Forty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, fifty-two percent were black, and less than one-half of one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 13 percent of those arrested and 87 percent were non-hispanic.
- Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted for 69 percent of the arrests, and the remaining 31 percent were for the sale/manufacturing of drugs.
- Arrests for opium or cocaine and their derivatives represented 53 percent of the possession/use category and 80 percent of the sale/manufacturing category. Overall, they accounted for 62 percent of the total drug abuse violation arrests.

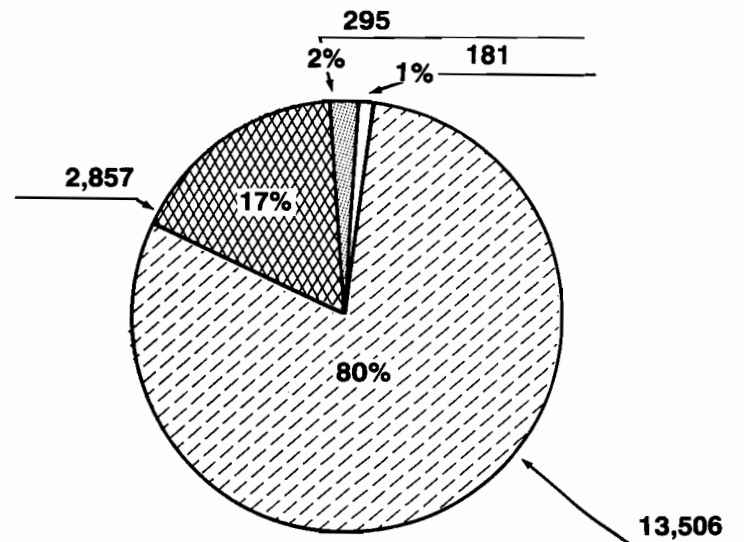
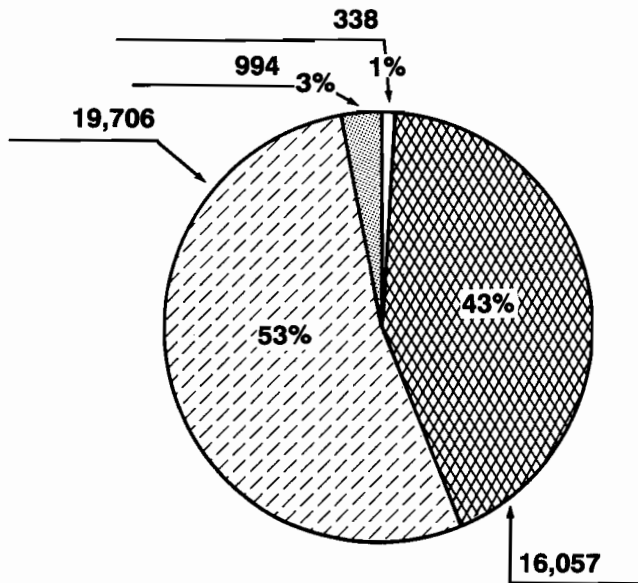
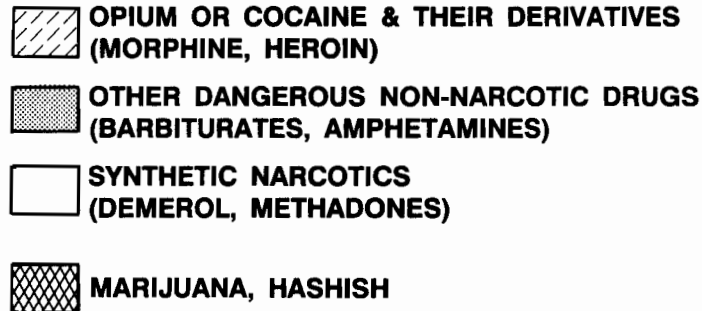

GAMBLING

Definition

Gambling violations are defined as the promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.

- There were 325 gambling arrests reported during 1994, resulting in a decrease of 39 percent compared to 1993.
- Eighty-four percent of the arrests were adults and sixteen percent were juveniles.
- Males represented 84 percent and females 16 percent of the gambling arrests.
- Sixty-six percent of the persons arrested were white, twenty-five percent were black, and nine percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 21 percent of the arrests and 79 percent were non-hispanic.

OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN

Definition

The definition of offenses against family and children is the nonsupport, neglect, desertion or abuse of family and children.

- There were 16,141 arrests for offenses against family and children during 1994, representing an increase of 4 percent from the previous year.
- Less than one-half of one percent of the arrests were juveniles, and nearly 100 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 94 percent and females 6 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-one percent of the persons arrested were white, forty-nine percent were black, and less than one-half of one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 14 percent of the arrests and 86 percent were not of hispanic origin.

DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

Definition

Under the New Jersey Crime Reporting Program, the offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were 32,176 arrests reported for driving under the influence in 1994, a decrease of 5 percent compared to 1993.
- Ninety-nine percent of the arrests were adults and only one percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 90 percent of the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 10 percent.
- Eighty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, eleven percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Thirteen percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and 87 percent were non-hispanic.

LIQUOR LAWS

Definition

Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of "driving under the influence."

- There were 10,148 arrests reported for liquor law violations, an increase of 3 percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 70 percent of the arrests while the remaining 30 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 80 percent of the liquor law arrests while females accounted for the remaining 20 percent.
- Ninety percent of the persons arrested were white, nine percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 6 percent of those arrested and 94 percent were not of hispanic origin.

DISORDERLY CONDUCT

Definition

In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were 38,737 arrests for disorderly conduct in 1994, an increase of 2 percent compared to 1993.
- Seventy-three percent of the arrests were adults while the remaining twenty-seven percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 80 percent and females 20 percent of the disorderly conduct arrests.
- Sixty percent of the persons arrested were white, forty percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 12 percent of the arrests and 88 percent of those arrested were non-hispanic.

VAGRANCY

Definition

In this category are persons charged with vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc.

- There were 1,566 arrests in this category during the year, a 276 percent increase compared to 1993.
- Juveniles accounted for 9 percent of the arrests while adults accounted for the remaining 91 percent.
- Males represented 32 percent and females 68 percent of the arrests in this category.
- Thirty-three percent of the persons arrested were white and sixty-six percent were black.
- Twenty percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and eighty percent were non-hispanic.

Percent may not add to 100 due to rounding.

ALL OTHER OFFENSES

Definition

Included in this category are all violations of state and local laws, except those offenses that can be categorized into one of the specific crime classifications previously mentioned.

- There were 88,781 arrests reported for all other offenses during 1994, a 6 percent increase compared to 1993.
- Adults accounted for 87 percent and juveniles 13 percent of persons arrested for all other offenses.
- Eighty-two percent of the arrests were males while eighteen percent were females.
- Sixty percent of the persons arrested were white, thirty-nine percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 12 percent of those arrested and 88 percent were not of hispanic origin.

CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS

Definition

In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

- There were 2,853 arrests reported for curfew and loitering law violations during 1994; this represents a 32 percent increase compared to 1993.
- Males represented 80 percent and females 20 percent of the arrests.
- Sixty-nine percent of the persons arrested were white, thirty-one percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 18 percent of the arrests and non-hispanics accounted for 82 percent of those arrested.

RUNAWAYS

Definition

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, this category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provisions of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were 6,529 runaway arrests reported in 1994, a 12 percent increase compared to 1993.
- Females accounted for 60 percent and males accounted for 40 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, forty-five percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Sixteen percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and eighty-four percent were not of hispanic origin.

Percent may not add to 100 due to rounding.
