## ATLANTIC COUNTY

### VOLUME/RATE

- A total of 18,426 Crime Index offenses were reported to the police of Atlantic County during 1994, a 14 percent decrease compared to 1993.
- Violent crimes decreased 12 percent and the nonviolent crime category decreased 14 percent.
