# ARREST SUMMARY FOR NON-INDEX OFFENSES

## MANSLAUGHTER

### Definition

The unlawful killing of a human being, by another, through gross negligence. Arrests relating to traffic fatalities are included.

- There were 39 arrests reported by law enforcement agencies for manslaughter during the year, an increase of 39 percent when compared to 2002.
- Adults accounted for 90 percent and juveniles accounted for 10 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 87 percent of the arrests and females 13 percent.
- Sixty-four percent of the persons arrested were white and 36 percent were black.
- The hispanic ethnic origin accounted for 23 percent of the arrests and 77 percent were non-hispanic.

## SIMPLE ASSAULT

### Definition

Simple assault, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting System, is an assault or an attempted assault where no weapon is used and which does not result in serious or aggravated injury to the victim.

- There were 31,229 simple assault arrests in 2003, representing a decrease of four percent when compared to 2002.
- Of the total, 20 percent were juveniles and 80 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 75 percent and females 25 percent of the persons arrested for simple assault.
- Sixty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 34 percent were black, and two percent were other races.
- Eighteen percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and 82 percent were not of hispanic origin.

## ARSON

### Definition

Under this program, arson is defined as the willful or malicious burning, or attempting to burn, with or without intent to defraud; a dwelling, house, building, ship or vessel, motor vehicle or aircraft, contents of building, personal property of another, etc..

- There were 432 arrests reported for arson offenses, a five percent decrease compared to 2002.
- Juveniles accounted for 58 percent and adults 42 percent of persons arrested for arson.
- Eighty-six percent of the total arson arrests were males while 14 percent were females.
- Seventy-six percent of the persons arrested were white, 23 percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 16 percent of those arrested and non-hispanics accounted for 84 percent.



# FORGERY AND COUNTERFEITING

## Definition

The definition of forgery and counterfeiting is the making, altering, uttering or possessing or attempting to make, alter, utter or possess, with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true.

- There were 2,181 arrests reported during the year for forgery or counterfeiting, a five percent increase compared to 2002.
- Adults accounted for 98 percent and juveniles accounted for 2 percent of the arrests.
- Males accounted for 74 percent of the arrests and females 26 percent.
- Sixty-one percent of the persons arrested were white, 36 percent were black, and three percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 26 percent of the arrests and 74 percent were non-hispanic.

# FRAUD

## Definition

In Uniform Crime Reporting, fraud is the fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses. This includes bad checks, confidence games, etc., except forgeries and counterfeiting.

- There were 6,261 arrests reported during the year for fraud, a nine percent increase compared to 2002.
- Adult arrests represented 97 percent and juveniles three percent of the persons arrested.
- Males accounted for 66 percent and females 34 percent of the persons arrested for fraud.
- Sixty-two percent of the persons arrested were white, 35 percent were black, and three percent were other races.
- Sixteen percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and 84 percent were not of hispanic origin.

# EMBEZZLEMENT

## Definition

The definition of embezzlement is the misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.

- There were 146 persons arrested for embezzlement, a 22 percent decrease compared to 2002.
- Ninety-five percent of those persons arrested were adults and five percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 62 percent and females 38 percent of the persons arrested for embezzlement.
- Sixty percent of the persons arrested were white, and 37 percent were black, and the three percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 12 percent of those arrested and non-hispanics accounted for 88 percent.

# STOLEN PROPERTY

## (Buying, Receiving, Possessing)

### Definition

Included in this class are all offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

- In 2003, there were 6,748 arrests reported for stolen property, a decrease of three percent compared to 2002.
- Of the total, 74 percent were adults and 26 percent were juveniles.
- Eighty-six percent were males and 14 percent were females.
- Fifty-six percent of the persons arrested were black, 43 percent were white, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 21 percent of the arrests and 79 percent were non-hispanic.

# CRIMINAL/MALICIOUS MISCHIEF

### Definition

Criminal/Malicious mischief is defined as the willful destruction, injury, disfigurement, or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.

- There were 7,813 arrests for criminal/malicious mischief, a decrease of five percent compared to 2002.
- Of the total, 51 percent were adults and 49 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 87 percent and females 13 percent of the arrests.
- Seventy-two percent of the persons arrested were white, 27 percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Thirteen percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and non-hispanics accounted for 87 percent.

# WEAPONS: CARRYING, POSSESSING, etc.

### Definition

Under this program, this offense includes all the violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing, and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, and attempts.

- There were 6,034 arrests reported for weapon offenses, an increase of five percent when compared to 2002.
- Of the total, 66 percent were adults and 34 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 91 percent and females nine percent of those arrested.
- Fifty-two percent of the persons arrested were black, 47 percent were white, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 19 percent of those arrested and 81 percent were non-hispanic.

# PROSTITUTION AND COMMERCIALIZED VICE

## Definition

Prostitution and commercialized vice are sex offenses of a commercialized nature and attempts. Included in this category are prostitution, keeping a bawdy house, procuring or transporting women for immoral purposes, etc..

- There were 2,182 prostitution and commercialized vice arrests during 2003, representing a decrease of 20 percent when compared to 2002.
- Adults accounted for 99 percent, and juveniles one percent of the arrests.
- Thirty-five percent were males and 65 percent were females.
- Sixty percent of the persons arrested were white, 36 percent were black, and four percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 27 percent of those arrested and 73 percent were non-hispanic.

# SEX OFFENSES

## Definition

Sex offenses, as defined under the New Jersey Uniform Crime Reporting Program, do not include rape, prostitution and commercialized vice. Included in this class are offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, and the like; attempts are also included.

- There were 2,094 sex offense arrests during 2003, representing a decrease of one percent when compared to 2002.
- Adults accounted for 79 percent, and juveniles 21 percent of the arrests.
- Ninety-six percent were males and four percent were females.
- Sixty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, 29 percent were black, and three percent were other races.
- Twenty-four percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and 76 percent were not of hispanic origin.

# DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

## Definition

Under the program, drug abuse violations are defined as the unlawful sale/manufacturing/possession/use of the below listed narcotics and drugs:

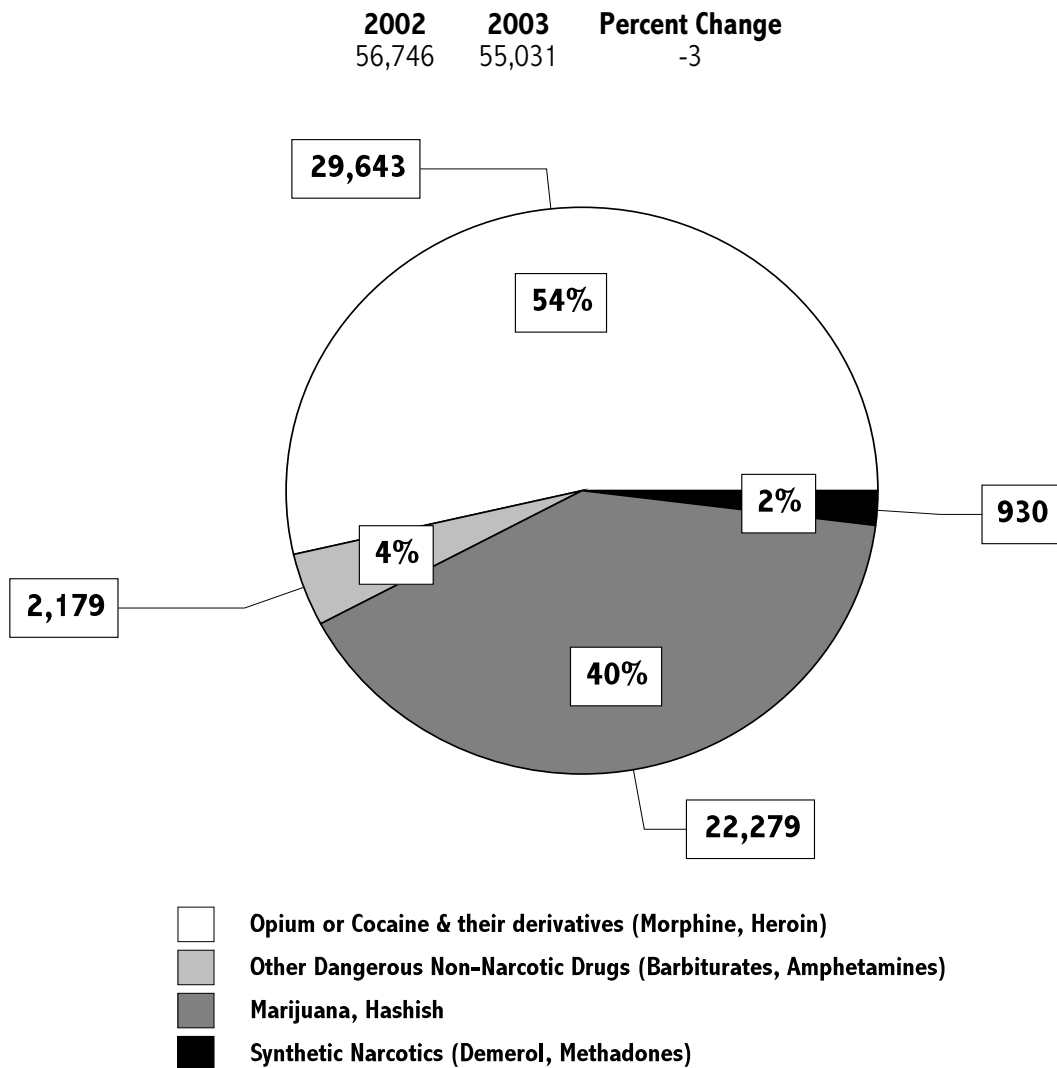
- a. Opium or Cocaine and their derivatives (morphine, heroin, codeine.)
- b. Marijuana, hashish, etc.
- c. Synthetic narcotics—manufactured narcotics which can cause true drug addiction—(demerol, methadones.)
- d. Other—dangerous non-narcotic drugs (barbiturates, amphetamines, hallucinogens.)

- There were 55,031 arrests reported by the law enforcement agencies of the state for drug abuse violations, a decrease of three percent when compared to 2002.
- Adults accounted for 88 percent and juveniles 12 percent of the arrests.

- Thirty-four percent of persons arrested for drug abuse violations were under the age of 21.
- Males accounted for 85 percent of all the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 15 percent.
- Fifty-two percent of the persons arrested were white, 48 percent were black, and less than one-half of one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 13 percent of those arrested and 87 percent were non-hispanic.
- Arrests for possession/use of drugs accounted for 70 percent of the arrests, and the remaining 30 percent were for the sale/manufacturing of drugs.
- Arrests for opium or cocaine and their derivatives represented 45 percent of the possession/use category and 76 percent of the sale/manufacturing category. Overall, they accounted for 54 percent of the total drug abuse violation arrests.

# TOTAL ARRESTS FOR ALL DRUG ABUSE VIOLATIONS

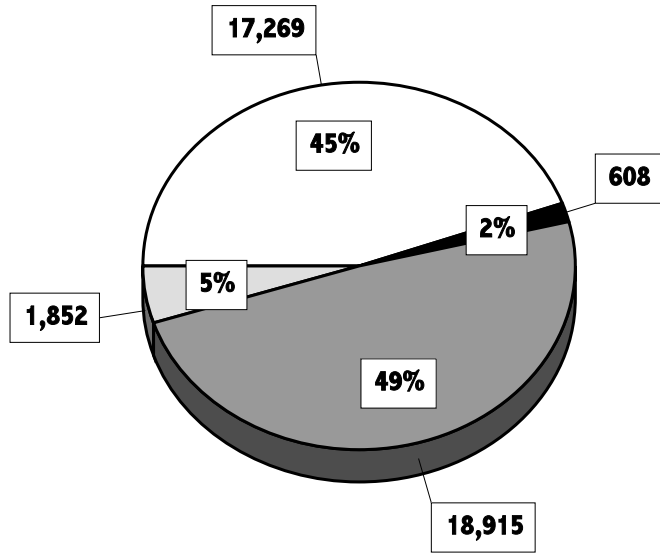

## POSSESSION/USE ARRESTS

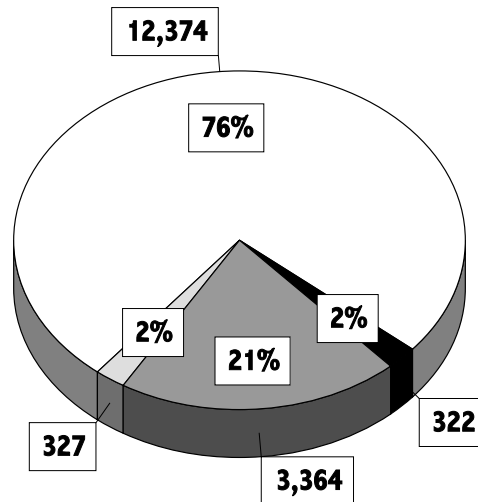

# GAMBLING

## Definition

Gambling violations are defined as the promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling.

- There were 628 gambling arrests reported during 2003, resulting in a decrease of 12 percent compared to 2002.
- Eighty-four percent of the arrests were adults and 16 percent were juveniles.
- Males represented 78 percent and females 22 percent of the gambling arrests.
- Fifty-two percent of the persons arrested were white, 43 percent were black, and five percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 23 percent of the arrests and 77 percent were non-hispanic.

# OFFENSES AGAINST FAMILY AND CHILDREN

## Definition

The definition of offenses against family and children is the nonsupport, neglect, desertion or abuse of family and children.

- There were 15,355 arrests for offenses against family and children during 2003, representing a decrease of six percent from 2002.
- Less than one-half of one percent of the arrests were juveniles, and nearly 100 percent were adults.
- Males accounted for 90 percent and females 10 percent of the arrests.
- Fifty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 46 percent were black, and less than one-half of one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 12 percent of the arrests and 88 percent were not of hispanic origin.

# DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE

## Definition

Under the New Jersey Crime Reporting Program, the offense of driving under the influence is defined as the driving or operating of any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of alcohol or narcotics.

- There were 28,054 arrests reported for driving under the influence in 2003, a decrease of less than one-half of one percent compared to 2002.
- Ninety-nine percent of the arrests were adults and only one percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 83 percent of the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 17 percent.
- Eighty-eight percent of the persons arrested were white, 10 percent were black, and two percent were other races.
- Sixteen percent of the persons arrested were hispanic and 84 percent were non-hispanic.



# LIQUOR LAWS

## Definition

Included in this category are state or local liquor law violations, with the exception of “driving under the influence.”

- There were 9,505 arrests reported for liquor law violations, a decrease of 13 percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 71 percent of the arrests while the remaining 29 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 76 percent of the liquor law arrests while females accounted for the remaining 24 percent.
- Ninety-two percent of the persons arrested were white, six percent were black, and two percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for nine percent of those arrested and 91 percent were not of hispanic origin.

# DISORDERLY CONDUCT

## Definition

In this category are placed all charges of committing a breach of the peace (disorderly person).

- There were 22,667 arrests reported for disorderly conduct, a decrease of five percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 73 percent of the arrests while the remaining 27 percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 80 percent of the disorderly conduct arrests while females accounted for the remaining 20 percent.
- Sixty-four percent of the persons arrested were white, 35 percent were black, and the balance were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 17 percent of those arrested and 83 percent were not of hispanic origin.

# VAGRANCY

## Definition

In this category are persons charged with vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc..

- There were 2,736 arrests in this category, an increase of 22 percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 91 percent of the arrests while the remaining nine percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 58 percent and females accounted for the remaining 42 percent of arrests in this category.
- Sixty-three percent of the persons arrested were black, 36 percent were white, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 14 percent of those arrested and 86 percent were not of hispanic origin.

# ALL OTHER OFFENSES

## Definition

Included in this category are all violations of state and local laws, except those offenses that can be categorized into one of the specific crime classifications previously mentioned.

- There were 137,496 arrests reported for all other offenses, an increase of two percent from the previous year.
- Adults were responsible for 93 percent of the arrests while the remaining seven percent were juveniles.
- Males accounted for 80 percent of the arrests while females accounted for the remaining 20 percent.
- Fifty-three percent of the persons arrested were white, 46 percent were black, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 15 percent of those arrested and 85 percent were not of hispanic origin.

# CURFEW AND LOITERING LAW VIOLATIONS

## Definition

In this category are juvenile arrests made for violations of local curfew or loitering ordinances.

- There were 5,211 arrests reported for curfew and loitering law violations, a decrease of eight percent from the previous year.
- Males accounted for 73 percent and females accounted for the remaining 27 percent.
- Fifty-five percent of the persons arrested were black, 44 percent were white, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 27 percent of those arrested and 73 percent were not of hispanic origin.

# RUNAWAYS

## Definition

For Uniform Crime Reporting purposes, this category is limited to juveniles taken into protective custody, under provisions of local statutes, as runaways.

- There were 4,988 runaway arrests reported, an increase of nine percent from the previous year.
- Females accounted for 58 percent of the arrests while males accounted for the remaining 42 percent.
- Fifty-three percent of the persons arrested were black, 46 percent were white, and one percent were other races.
- Hispanics accounted for 25 percent of those arrested and 75 percent were not of hispanic origin.
