Program Summary

Providing legal counsel to multi-member boards requires not only a sound knowledge of the substantive law guiding agency decision-making, but familiarity with the Open Public Meetings Act, quorum requirements, recusal issues, hearing procedures and the APA standards for final decision-making. This presentation will provide an overview of the relevant laws, as well as practical guidance to assist in consensus building.
