Program Summary

This is a “nuts and bolts” review of the Attorney-Client Privilege and Work Product Doctrine. The program will review the elements of these protections, identify the rules that reference them, identify some considerations of the factual context in which they may arise, and provide some points regarding preserving and applying these protections.

Who Should Attend?
