The National Attorneys General Training & Research Institute (NAGTRI) of the National Association of Attorneys General (NAAG) and the Upper Midwest Community Policing Institute (UMCPI) are pleased to announce that they are conducting a <u>tuition-free</u> one and one-half day training for New Jersey prosecutors and investigators on **Human Trafficking**. The training will be limited to 20 state prosecutors and 20 investigators with whom they work as well as up to 10 attorneys from the Attorneys General office. The first day will include an overview of human trafficking, an introduction to the legal framework – international, national, and state – regarding trafficking in persons, partnership models, victim issues, investigatory and interviewing techniques, and prosecutorial theories and practices. The second day will be a workshop for prosecutors only and will include an ethics discussion based on a human trafficking case study. Funding for this program has been generously provided by the Bureau of Justice Assistance, Department of Justice.

The training will take place on October 4-5 at the New Jersey Law Center, One Constitution Square, New Brunswick, NJ 08910. A light breakfast will be provided on both days and a working lunch will be provided on October 4. Please see the attached draft agenda for more details.
