### **LIABILITIES AND IMMUNITIES UNDER THE NEW JERSEY TORT CLAIMS ACT**

#### *Program Summary*

This program will provide an introduction to sovereign immunity in the State of New Jersey and will provide an overview of public entity defense under New Jersey's Tort Claims Act, N.J.S.A. 59:1-1 et seq. This presentation will include explanations of the statute's notice requirements, restrictions on suits and damages, as well as applications of the liabilities and immunities provided under the Act.

#### *Who Should Attend?*

This program is intended for all government attorneys.

#### *Who Is the Faculty?*

**DAG Geri Benedetto** is the Section Chief of the Division of Law's Tort Litigation Section, a litigation unit that defends the State, its agencies, and employees against personal injury, wrongful death, Federal Employer's Liability Act, and other negligence claims. DAG Benedetto joined the Division in 1992 after several years as a litigation associate at the Philadelphia office of Blank, Rome, Comisky & McCauley. She worked as a Tort Litigation deputy and was promoted to Assistant Section Chief. She also has represented the Governor's Office of Employee Relations in labor litigation. She is a graduate of Temple University School of Law and was Symposium Editor of the *Temple Law Review*. DAG Benedetto has successfully tried a number of cases in State and federal court.

**DAG Robert H. Murphy** joined the Division of Law in February 2011 as a Volunteer Associate in the Tort Litigation Section. He was hired as a deputy in the Tort Litigation Section in August 2011 wherein he is responsible for defending a full docket of civil cases brought under the New Jersey Tort Claims Act, the Mistaken Imprisonment Act, the New Jersey Civil Rights Act and 42

U.S.C. §1983 in State and Federal Court. Prior to coming to the Division of Law, DAG Murphy clerked for the Honorable Melvin R. Wright in Washington, D.C. He received his Juris Doctorate, in May 2008 from American University, Washington College of Law. He received a Master of Arts in Philosophy and Social Theory from the University of Warwick and a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology and Anthropology from Saint Mary's College of Maryland.
