# CIVIL RIGHTS LAW: AN OVERVIEW OF THE NEW JERSEY LAW AGAINST DISCRIMINATION

## **Program Summary**

This presentation will cover the basic concepts behind the Law Against Discrimination (LAD) and identifies what the law covers (employment, housing, access to places of public accommodation, etc.) as well as who is covered (people who are subject to discrimination based on race, religion, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, etc.). This presentation will also include a discussion of the elements of an LAD claim and examples of direct and indirect evidence needed to prove it. Examples will be given of the issues unique to disability claims, including what constitutes a "reasonable accommodation." There will also be a discussion of what constitutes a hostile work environment and sexual harassment.

#### Who Is the Faculty?

Charles S. Cohen began his career with the State in January 1982. After over six years on the Central Appellate Research staff of the Appellate Division, he became a DAG in the Division of Law in 1988. Originally representing the Board of Public Utilities, he moved to the Civil Rights section in 1992 and became Assistant Section Chief in 1995. He works closely with the management and staff of the Division on Civil Rights and has represented the agency in numerous administrative hearings, Superior Court actions and state and federal appeals.
