### TRIAL ADVOCACY BASIC SKILLS PROGRAM: EXPERT WITNESSES

# **Program Summary**

This one-day program will provide attendees with an understanding of the use of expert witnesses at trial. The program will begin with a presentation on expert witnesses, including such topics as: selection of an effective expert, trial preparation, qualifications of the expert at trial, as well as strategies for the direct and cross examination of an expert witness. The presentation will be followed by "learn by doing" workshops which will focus on the use of skills and techniques for direct and cross examination. Participant performances will be observed by faculty who will provide constructive criticism and advice on the participants' performances.

Because there is not time to prepare during the program, participants must not only become thoroughly familiar with the materials, but <u>must also prepare a direct and a cross examination prior to the program.</u>

#### Who Should Attend?

This program is intended for attorneys with little or no trial experience. It is open to all government attorneys, space allowing.

# Who Is the Faculty?

The faculty consists of experienced litigators who have extensive trial experience.

# Non-State Employees or State Employees not Connected to the Garden State Network

Setting up your account through the portal is a two-step process, the details of which are set forth in the next two paragraphs.

Once you receive the portal authorization code you will be prompted to go to the My New Jersey portal at <a href="http://www.state.nj.us/">http://www.state.nj.us/</a> and create a portal account. Once your portal account is created you are prompted to enter your authorization code. This is Step 1 of the process, which you need only do once.

If you have already been issued an authorization code in the past you do not need to request another one. You can log into your account on the Garden State Network at http://www.state.nj.us and under the heading NJ L&PS Applications you will see the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute's Registration System. Click on that and log into your account on our system.

Upon setting up your portal account, you need to set up your AGAI Course Registration System account. This is Step 2.
