Requests to State agencies for access to public records under the Open Public Records Act broke all kinds of records in the past year . . . and the hits just keep on coming! With OPRA requests growing not only in number, but in complexity and sophistication, OPRA custodians are spinning more records than Casey Kasem, Dick Clark and Cousin Brucie combined. OPRA litigation is climbing to the top of the charts, a veritable Top 40 of legal issues including such hits as privacy, surveillance, e-mail searches and improper and overbroad OPRA requests. When it comes to "improper and overbroad" and all things OPRA, we present the "Record Producer" of the Department of Law and Public Safety and the Office of the Attorney General, DAG Bruce Solomon. DAG Solomon will count down the Top Ten OPRA cases of 2015 in a fast-paced and entertaining look at the legal and practical impact of recent OPRA case law, with a special eye on the evolving boundaries of "improper and overbroad" requests.

Who Is the Faculty?

Bruce Solomon is a Deputy Attorney General in the Legal Affairs and Employee Relations section of the Office of the Attorney General. Since 2001, Bruce has served as the Custodian of Records for the Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Law and Public Safety, where he supervises divisional records custodians for the fourteen divisions and agencies which comprise L&PS, with oversight for all Department records requests and legal challenges under OPRA. Bruce has a lead role in the development and implementation of L&PS public records access rules, policies, procedures and practices. A graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Madison and Rutgers University School of Law, Bruce served as the General Counsel for the New Jersey Institute of Technology and was a partner in private practice before joining the Division of Law in 1993.

Once your portal account is created you are prompted to enter your authorization code. This is Step 1 of the process, which you need only do once.

If you have already been issued an authorization code in the past you do not need to request another one. You can log into your account on the Garden State Network at http://www.state.nj.us and under the heading NJ L&PS Applications you will see the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute's Registration System. Click on that and log into your account on our system.

Upon setting up your portal account, you need to set up your AGAI Course Registration System account. This is Step 2. To do so, log on to the My New Jersey Portal http://www.state.nj.us/.
