Program Summary

This course will provide a review of significant legislation passed by the New Jersey Legislature in 2016. The presentation will also highlight noteworthy bills that are currently pending before the legislature.

Who Is the Faculty?

Scott A. Coffina is the Senior Deputy Chief Counsel to Governor Christie. He joined the Administration from Drinker Biddle & Reath, LLP, where he was a partner in the firm's White Collar Defense and Corporate Investigations practice group. His practice focused on representing corporate, university and individual clients in internal investigations, False Claims Act litigation, political-legal controversies, and additional civil, criminal or regulatory enforcement actions. Prior to his most recent tenure in private practice, Coffina was an Associate Counsel to President George W. Bush, where he advised White House and Administration officials on a wide-range of legal matters, represented the interests of the President in Congressional oversight investigations and evaluated candidates for judicial appointments in the District of Columbia and Eleventh

Circuits. Previously, he served in the White House Office of Political Affairs for President Ronald Reagan. Coffina also was an Assistant United States Attorney in Philadelphia from 1997-2001. Coffina received his undergraduate degree from Cornell University and his law degree from the University of Pennsylvania Law School.

Lieutenant Governor Kim Guadagno, who also serves as Secretary of State, began her public service career as a federal prosecutor with the Organized Crime & Racketeering Strike Force in Brooklyn, New York. She then became an Assistant United States Attorney in Newark and was awarded the nation's highest honor for her separate prosecutions of two corrupt public officials. Guadagno next served in a high level position in the State of New Jersey Attorney General's Office, where she was a member of the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute skills program faculty. In 2001, Guadagno left the public sector to practice law closer to home and became a teacher at Rutgers University School of Law-Newark. In 2007, Guadagno was elected as the first woman sheriff in Monmouth County's history. As Sheriff, she managed a 650-member law enforcement agency encompassing the county jail, the county 911 communications center, and a law enforcement department of 100 men and women. She left both the Office of Sheriff and her position as a teacher at Rutgers Law School upon becoming Lt. Governor. Lt. Governor Guadagno is a cum laude graduate of Ursinus College in Collegeville, Pennsylvania. She received her juris doctorate degree, cum laude, from the American University Washington College of Law in Washington, DC.
