MUNICIPAL BONDS - AN OVERVIEW INCLUDING FEDERAL AND STATE LAW IMPLICATIONS

Program Summary

This class will provide students with a general overview of municipal bonds - what they are, why they exist, which entities can issue them, how they are issued, and who buys them. Different types of municipal bonds will be discussed, including general obligation bonds, State contract bonds, moral obligation bonds and revenue bonds. An emphasis will be placed on the conduit type of revenue bonds issued by New Jersey's State-wide bond issuing authorities. A brief introduction to the documentation required for bonds will be provided, including security provisions. The class will explore the Internal Revenue Code provisions that permit the interest on certain municipal bonds to be exempt from federal income tax, including the Code sections and related rules and regulations that set limits on tax-exempt municipal bonds.

also examine federal securities laws and regulations regarding tax-exempt municipal bonds. The course will conclude with a discussion of New Jersey constitutional provisions and statutes impacting the issuance of tax-exempt bonds within the State. This class requires no prior experience with or knowledge of municipal bonds.

Who Should Attend?

Who Is the Faculty?

Mark E. Hopkins has served as the Executive Director of the New Jersey Health Care Facilities Financing Authority ("NJHCFFA") since 2004, where he has overseen the issuance of bonds with a value of over ten billion dollars on behalf of New Jersey hospitals and other health care organizations. Mr. Hopkins has also worked with the New Jersey Department of Health to create the financial early warning system for hospitals and recommendations for hospital financial transparency. He is an Adjunct Professor of Health Care Finance at the Rutgers Newark School of Public Affairs and Administration and is also an instructor for the New Jersey Attorney General's Advocacy Institute. Prior to joining the Authority, Mr. Hopkins served as a Deputy Attorney General, representing the New Jersey Educational Facilities Authority and the New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency as issuer counsel on public financing transactions. Before joining the Attorney General's office, Mr. Hopkins was an attorney in the Public Finance Practice Group of McCarter & English. Immediately following law school, Mr. Hopkins clerked for the Honorable Eduardo C. Robreno in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania. Mr. Hopkins earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from Rutgers College in New Brunswick. He earned his Juris Doctor Degree with high honors from Rutgers University Law School at Camden, where he was also Editor-in-Chief of the Rutgers Law Journal.

Non-State Employees or State Employees not Connected to the Garden State Network

If you are not a State employee, or are otherwise unable to access the AGAI Course Registration System through the Garden State Network, kindly email the Advocacy Institute at: <u>AdvocacyInstitute@lps.state.nj.us</u> for an authorization code to allow you access to the AGAI Course Registration System through the My New Jersey portal. **Setting up your account through the portal is a two-step process, the details of which are set forth in the next two paragraphs.**

Once you receive the portal authorization code you will be prompted to go to the My New Jersey portal at <u>http://www.state.nj.us/</u> and create a portal account. Once your portal account is created you are prompted to enter your authorization code. This is Step 1 of the process, which you need only do once.

If you have already been issued an authorization code in the past you do not need to request another one. You can log into your account on the Garden State Network at http://www.state.nj.us and under the heading NJ L&PS Applications you will see the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute's Registration System. Click on that and log into your account on our system.

Upon setting up your portal account, you need to set up your AGAI Course Registration System account. This is Step 2. To do so, log on to the My New Jersey Portal <u>http://www.state.nj.us/</u>.
