Program Summary

Human Trafficking is modern day slavery, human rights abuse, and a multibillion dollar criminal enterprise and New Jersey has been described as a prime location for this heinous activity. Although NJ had a human trafficking statute for over a decade, the enactment of the Human Trafficking Prevention, Protection & Treatment Act (HTPPTA) clearly reflected the State's resolve to address outstanding gaps in the existing law. Among its successes, the HTPPTA created new rights for victims, empowered law enforcement, and emphasized training as a valuable tool for the detection and prevention of human trafficking. This presentation will provide an overview of the HTPPTA; an update on the State's compliance with the Act; and a summary of NJ's efforts at combatting human trafficking.

Who Is the Faculty?

AAG Tracy M. Thompson has served as either a County or State prosecutor for nearly 25 years. In January 2013, she was appointed as the Human Trafficking Program Director for the New Jersey Attorney General's Office. As such, she chairs and oversees the operation of the NJ Human Trafficking Task Force. One of her major responsibilities was to create and implement an anti-trafficking strategy in advance of the State's hosting of Super Bowl 48. In April 2014, she was appointed to serve on the NJ Commission on Human Trafficking, where she represents Attorney General Christopher S. Porrino. In October 2015, AAG Thompson attended the National Human Trafficking Summit as part of the NJ delegation which included NJ Supreme Court Chief Justice Stuart J. Rabner and Judge Glenn A. Grant, J.A.D., Acting Administrative Director of the NJ Courts.

During her 16 years with the NJ Department of Law and Public Safety, AAG Thompson has served in the following capacities: Deputy Director of the Office of Government Integrity; Senior Counsel in the Prosecutor's Supervision and Coordination Bureau; Chief Counsel for the Bureau of Fiscal Oversight; Special Assistant to the DCJ Director; and Deputy Attorney General in the Financial Crimes Unit. AAG Thompson is a faculty member for the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute and the National Attorneys General Training and Research Institute. She is also an adjunct faculty member for Wilmington University and previously taught at The College of New Jersey.

Before joining the Attorney General's Office, AAG Thompson was an Assistant Prosecutor in the Mercer County Prosecutor's Office for nine years where she served as Chief of the Domestic Violence Unit and also handled an array of major crimes including child abuse and sexual assault cases. AAG Thompson received her B.A. in African-American Studies from the University of Pennsylvania in 1987, and her J.D. from Temple University School of Law in 1990. She is the 2014 recipient of the Attorney General's Award for Excellence in Advancing the Department of Law & Public Safety's Priorities and Initiatives.

Non-State Employees or State Employees not Connected to the Garden State Network

If you are not a State employee, or are otherwise unable to access the AGAI Course Registration System through the Garden State Network, kindly email the Advocacy Institute at: <u>njagai@njoag.gov</u> for an authorization code to allow you access to the AGAI Course Registration System through the My New Jersey portal. Setting up your account through the portal is a two-step process, the details of which are set forth in the next two paragraphs.

Once you receive the portal authorization code you will be prompted to go to the My New Jersey portal at <u>http://www.state.nj.us/</u> and create a portal account. Once your portal account is created you are prompted to enter your authorization code. This is Step 1 of the process, which you need only do once.

If you have already been issued an authorization code in the past you do not need to request another one. You can log into your account on the Garden State Network at http://www.state.nj.us and under the heading NJ L&PS Applications you will see the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute's Registration System. Click on that and log into your account on our system.

Upon setting up your portal account, you need to set up your AGAI Course Registration System account. This is Step 2. To do so, log on to the My New Jersey Portal <u>http://www.state.nj.us/</u>.
