#### **Program Summary**

This presentation will examine executive branch ethics requirements for State House staff members. The program will cover the Conflicts of Interest Law, ethics rules, the Uniform Ethics Code and ethics-related executive orders. It will address ethics issues that uniquely affect Statehouse staff, including restrictions on acceptance of gifts, statutory provisions limiting reimbursement for out-of-state travel, requirements for documenting business meals, interaction with lobbyists and advocates, attendance at events related to State duties and precautions regarding political activity. This presentation will also cover the Code of Conduct for the Governor, comparing code provisions with ethics requirements for executive branch employees and examining the policy considerations underlying areas where the Governor's Code of Conduct diverges from the Uniform Ethics Code. Ethics requirements will be illustrated with case studies drawn from the files of the New Jersey State Ethics Commission that illustrate common ethics dilemmas faced by Statehouse staff members. This session will satisfy the mandatory ethics training requirement for State executive branch employees.

#### Who Should Attend?

Registration for this course is limited to attorneys and senior staff in the Office of the Governor. Please do not attempt to register if you have not been notified of your eligibility for this program.

## Who Is the Faculty?

AAG Margaret A. Cotoia is the Director of the New Jersey Attorney General's Advocacy Institute, which offers a broad array of high quality legal education programs that meet the needs of New Jersey government lawyers. Before working for the SEC, Margaret was a hearing officer and trainer at the New Jersey Department of Labor and a staff attorney and mediator at the Public Employment Relations Commission. Margaret holds a B.S. from Georgetown University in Washington, D.C. and a J.D. from the Penn State University Dickinson School of Law in Carlisle, Pennsylvania where she was an editor of the law review.

#### **State Employees**

#### Non-State Employees or State Employees not Connected to the Garden State Network

If you are not a State employee, or are otherwise unable to access the AGAI Course Registration System through the Garden State Network, kindly email the Advocacy Institute at: <a href="mailto:njagai@njoag.gov">njagai@njoag.gov</a> for an authorization code to allow you access to the AGAI Course Registration System through the My New Jersey portal. Setting up your account through the portal is a two-step process, the details of which are set forth in the next two paragraphs.

Once you receive the portal authorization code you will be prompted to go to the My New Jersey portal at <a href="http://www.state.nj.us/">http://www.state.nj.us/</a> and create a portal account. Once your portal account is created you are prompted to enter your authorization code. This is Step 1 of the process, which you need only do once.

If you have already been issued an authorization code in the past you do not need to request another one. You can log into your account on the Garden State Network at http://www.state.nj.us and under the heading NJ L&PS Applications you will see the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute's Registration System. Click on that and log into your account on our system.

Upon setting up your portal account, you need to set up your AGAI Course Registration System account. This is Step 2. To do so, log on to the My New Jersey Portal <a href="http://www.state.nj.us/">http://www.state.nj.us/</a>.
