Program Summary

This program is an introduction to State Grand Jury practice. The presentation will discuss strategies and procedures for presenting a case to the State Grand Jury and methods for responding to typical issues and avoiding common problems.

Who Should Attend?

This program is mandatory for all Division of Criminal Justice Deputy Attorneys General hired after January 1, 2015. The Division of Criminal Justice has notified those attorneys who are required to attend this program. Other attorneys within the Department of Law and Public Safety are welcome to attend; space permitting. Please do not attempt to register for this program if you are not an attorney in the Department of Law and Public Safety.

Who Is the Faculty?

DAG Jeffrey J. Barile is a Deputy Attorney General with the New Jersey Division of Criminal Justice and is assigned to the Specialized Crimes Bureau. DAG Barile joined the Division in 2013. He has successfully prosecuted crimes involving: racketeering, narcotics trafficking, human trafficking, money laundering, labor fraud, tax fraud, identity theft, and environmental

pollution. This work often included the extensive use of electronic surveillance. He is a member of the Witness Relocation Unit, the Officer Involved Shooting review panel for the Attorney General's Shooting Response Team, and the Bias Crimes Response Team. Prior to joining the Division, DAG Barile was an Assistant Prosecutor with the Cumberland County Prosecutor's Office in Bridgeton, NJ. He also worked for a private firm where he represented clients in civil and criminal matters. DAG Barile was a law clerk in the Salem and Cumberland County Superior Court – Civil Division for the Honorable Timothy G. Farrell, J.S.C. DAG Barile received his J.D. from Catholic University – Columbus School of Law in Washington, D.C. and his B.A. from Drew University in Madison, N.J.

Non-State Employees or State Employees not Connected to the Garden State Network

If you are not a State employee, or are otherwise unable to access the AGAI Course Registration System through the Garden State Network, kindly email the Advocacy Institute at: njagai@njoag.gov for an authorization code to allow you access to the AGAI Course Registration System through the My New Jersey portal. Setting up your account through the portal is a two-step process, the details of which are set forth in the next two paragraphs.

Once you receive the portal authorization code you will be prompted to go to the My New Jersey portal at http://www.state.nj.us/ and create a portal account. Once your portal account is created you are prompted to enter your authorization code. This is Step 1 of the process, which you need only do once.

If you have already been issued an authorization code in the past you do not need to request another one. You can log into your account on the Garden State Network at http://www.state.nj.us and under the heading NJ L&PS Applications you will see the Attorney General's Advocacy Institute's Registration System. Click on that and log into your account on our system.

Upon setting up your portal account, you need to set up your AGAI Course Registration System account. This is Step 2. To do so, log on to the My New Jersey Portal http://www.state.nj.us/. Upon opening the AGAI Course Registration System home page, you will see the Create Account link in the Login Box. Click on it and create your account, which will include you selecting a new user name and password.
