#### ***Program Summary***

Pretrial statements, whether verbal or by formal press release, are a necessary part of prosecutors' jobs. In some instances, providing public information can even result in citizens assisting detectives in solving cases. In cases with substantial public importance, the public has a right to know basic information and failure to work properly with the media can result in an inaccurate and unnecessarily negative narrative. Even in routine cases, law enforcement is legally required to provide basic information to the public. This program will examine the ethical considerations that attach to all pretrial statements made to the media by prosecutors and police officers. It will cover which statements are permissible and appropriate and, more importantly, which statements should not and cannot be made. Applicable Rules, Directives and Executive Orders will be discussed and illustrated with examples of the impact on prosecutors who failed to follow the rules.

#### ***Who Should Attend?***

This program is intended for attorneys from the Division of Criminal Justice and County Prosecutors' offices, but other attorneys are welcome to attend, space permitting.

#### ***Who Is the Faculty?***

**Erik Daab** is the Deputy Chief of the Gangs and Organized Crime Bureau of the Division of Criminal Justice, prosecuting large scale narcotics and weapons trafficking cases. He previously served in the Appellate Bureau, Corruption Bureau, and as Chief of the Medicaid Fraud Unit in the Division of Criminal Justice. Erik started his career working on death penalty cases for the Tennessee Office of the Attorney General and was the State Witness for the execution of the first inmate executed in Tennessee in forty years.

**Gregory Mueller** is the First Assistant Prosecutor in Sussex County and has served in that capacity since September, 2009. He has also served as an Assistant Prosecutor in both Sussex and Morris Counties. During the course of his career, Mr. Mueller has successfully tried numerous homicide and other high profile cases to verdict, and argued many precedent setting cases to the New Jersey Supreme Court and Appellate Division. Prior to becoming a prosecutor, Mr. Mueller was the founder and managing partner of the firm of Mueller, Russo and Warmington, P.C. in Morristown, NJ. Mr. Mueller clerked for two Superior Court Judges. He holds a Juris Doctor, *cum laude*, from Duquesne University School of Law.
