Program Summary

This program is a "whirlwind tour" of New Jersey search and seizure law, starting with the fundamentals for prosecutors and officers when addressing stop, frisk, arrest, and search issues under both the Fourth Amendment and Article 1, paragraph 7 of the New Jersey Constitution. The presentation will also provide guidance on handling suppression motions and recent developments and trends in the law, and employ hypothetical exercises to apply the concepts discussed.

Who Should Attend?

Registration for this program is limited to Hunterdon County Assistant Prosecutors and law enforcement officers who have been invited to attend.

Who Is the Faculty?

DAG Jennifer Kmieciak is a Deputy Chief in the Division of Criminal Justice's Appellate Bureau. She handles criminal matters before the Law Division, Appellate Division and Supreme Court and filed a United States Supreme Court amicus brief on behalf of New Jersey and 17 other states in <u>Birchfield v. North Dakota</u>, a case implicating the constitutionality of DUI implied-consent laws. DAG Kmieciak is a PTC certified instructor and regularly teaches programs on the Fourth Amendment to law enforcement officers and prosecutors. She received an Attorney General's Award for Excellence in Appeals in 2016 and for Trial Assistance in 2012. DAG Kmieciak clerked in the Appellate Division for the Honorable Victor Ashrafi,

J.A.D. She received a B.A. from The College of New Jersey, summa cum laude, and a J.D. from the Rutgers School of Law-Camden, magna cum laude.

DAG Jane Schuster serves in the Division of Criminal Justice's Appellate Bureau. She litigates criminal appellate cases in the Appellate Division and Supreme Court. DAG Schuster has filed many briefs with New Jersey courts and three briefs with the United States Supreme Court. She also has worked on numerous special projects for the Division. DAG Schuster is a PTC certified instructor and regularly teaches programs on the Fourth Amendment to law enforcement officers and prosecutors. Prior to joining DCJ, DAG Schuster was an associate at Paul Weiss. DAG Schuster clerked in the New Jersey Supreme Court for Justice Helen Hoens. She received a B.F.A. and a Master's Degree from New York University and a J.D. from Cardozo School of Law, where she was a member of the law review.
