Program Summary

This intensive three and a half day trial advocacy program consists of lectures and participatory workshops designed to improve students' child protection litigation skills. Experienced deputy and assistant attorneys general will conduct presentations on direct and cross examination, use of exhibits, common objections, expert witness issues and closing arguments. The participants will perform in a series of workshops, demonstrating the skills necessary for discrete phases of the trial process. The program will conclude with participants conducting a mock trial.

Who Should Attend?

This program is for Deputy Attorneys General in the Division of Children and Families Practice Group who have been selected to attend by their supervisors.

Who Is the Faculty?

The faculty consists of deputy and assistant attorneys general who have extensive trial experience.
