Program Summary

This program will examine why attorneys are uniquely vulnerable to drug and alcohol abuse, which can sometimes start in law school and is often exacerbated by the stresses and pressures of practicing law. It will provide a primer on the signs and symptoms of drug and alcohol addiction, as well as information on access to assistance programs, some of which are specifically designed for attorneys. This course addresses substance abuse and its effects on lawyers and the practice of law and therefore qualifies for New Jersey, New York and Pennsylvania ethics credits.
