Program Summary

The course is an introduction to defending civil cases against New Jersey State Police employees. It will cover employment and non-employment litigation, including civil rights cases. The presenters will discuss legal and strategic issues for defending these cases and identify helpful sources of information and documents for litigation prep.

Who Should Attend?

Attendance at this program is limited to Deputy Attorneys General in the Division of Law's State Police, Employment and Corrections Section.

Who Is the Faculty?

DAG Dianne Moratti is the Section Chief of the State Police, Employment and Corrections Section in the Division of Law. She primarily represents the Department of Corrections in federal civil rights lawsuits filed in both federal and State court. She was previously a member of the former FedCor Section of the Division of Law. DAG Moratti worked in private practice for several years before joining the Division. She completed a federal clerkship with the Hon. Jerome B. Simandle, U.S.D.J. and holds a J.D. from Rutgers Law School – Camden.

Attorney Assistant Deborah O'Rourke is a member of the State Police, Employment and Corrections Section in the Division of Law, where she exclusively handles State Police litigation.

Prior to joining the Division of Law, she was a Paralegal for the Center for Claims Resolution (formerly the Asbestos Claims Facility), where she handled asbestos litigation. She holds a B.S. in Elementary Education with a minor in Psychology from The College of New Jersey and a Paralegal Certificate from Mercer County College.
