Program Summary

This course will provide an introduction to defending inmate-filed civil appeals of Department of Corrections and State Parole Board final actions. The program will include a discussion of pertinent regulations and detail the components of defending inmate appeals, including the Statement of Items Comprising the Record, opposition briefs and appendices.

Who Should Attend?

Attendance at this program is limited to Deputy Attorneys General in the Division of Law's State Police, Employment and Corrections Section.
