### **Program Summary**

Rachel Wainer Apter and Jeremy Feigenbaum will provide an overview of the U.S. Supreme Court based on their experiences clerking for Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg and Justice Elena Kagan, respectively. The presenters will share their insights about Supreme Court practice, what cases the Court decides to hear, and how the Court makes its decisions. The presenters will also discuss the briefs and arguments in some major cases (civil and criminal) pending before or recently decided by the Supreme Court.

#### Who Is the Faculty?

**AAG Rachel Wainer Apter** is the Director of the New Jersey Division on Civil Rights. Prior to this appointment, she served as Counsel to the Attorney General. Before joining the OAG, she was a senior staff attorney at the American Civil Liberties Union in New York. Previously, she was an associate at Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe in New York and clerked for Judge Jed Rakoff of the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York, Judge Robert Katzmann of the U.S.

Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit, and Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg of the U.S. Supreme Court. She graduated from the University of Pennsylvania and Harvard Law School.

**AAG Jeremy Feigenbaum** is Counsel to the Attorney General. Before joining the OAG, he was an associate at Kirkland & Ellis in New York. He has also served as an adjunct professor at NYU School of Law and as a member of the New York County Independent Judicial Screening Panel. He clerked for Judge William Fletcher of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit and Justice Elena Kagan of the U.S. Supreme Court. He graduated from Brow University and Harvard Law School.
