Program Summary

This program will present a review of significant opinions from the New Jersey Supreme Court during the 2019 -2020 court term.

Eligibility

Registration for this program is limited to deputy and assistant attorneys general in the Divisions of Criminal Justice and Law, and assistant prosecutors.

Faculty

DAG Lauren Bonfiglio serves in the Appellate Bureau of the Division of Criminal Justice, where she litigates criminal appeals in the Appellate Division and Supreme Court. She is a member of the Bureau's working groups on Identification, Evidence, and Forfeiture, and manages all forfeitures of office and pension stemming from federal convictions for the Attorney General's Office. Prior to joining the Division, DAG Bonfiglio clerked in the Law Division for the Honorable Robert P. Becker, Jr., J.S.C., a criminal trial judge in Gloucester County. She received a B.A. from Rowan University, magna cum laude, and a J.D. from Widener University School of Law - Delaware, magna cum laude, where she graduated in the top ten students of her class.

DAG Adam Klein serves in the Division of Criminal Justice's Appellate Bureau. He handles matters before the Law Division, Appellate Division, and Supreme Court of New Jersey, and has briefed cases in the United States Courts of Appeals. He is a member of the Bureau's Search-and-Seizure, Evidence, Juvenile, and Wiretap Law Working Groups. Before joining the Division, DAG Klein was an Assistant Prosecutor at the Camden County Prosecutor's Office and taught at the Camden County College Police Academy. DAG Klein clerked for the Honorable Michele M. Fox, J.S.C., in Camden County. He holds a B.A. from West Chester University and a J.D. from Rutgers Law School-Camden, where he was a staff editor of the Rutgers Journal of Law & Religion.
