Program Summary

This presentation will explore recent developments in employment law. The presenter will review New Jersey's newly enacted employment laws, provide insight on how Covid-19 continues to impact the workplace, discuss social unrest and an employer's right to police employees' off-duty conduct. The program will include facilitated discussion, with time for questions and perspectives, which will provide students with strategies for litigating employment matters, combatting bias, and navigating the workplace climate created by current events.

Eligibility

Faculty

DAG Gilchrist was a law clerk to the Hon. Thomas W. Sumners, Jr., New Jersey Superior Court, Appellate Division. He holds an undergraduate degree from Morehouse College and a J.D. from Rutgers School of Law-Newark.
