Program Summary

This program will cover the fundamentals of law and practice involving the attorney/client privilege, deliberative process privilege and the attorney work product doctrine. The presenter will address the law and issues that relate to applying these doctrines in the government context, including practical tips on how to deal with requests or demands for records which include privileged or protected materials.

Eligibility

This program is only open to Deputy and Assistant Attorneys General in the DCF practice group and DCF agency attorneys invited to attend. Registrants will receive the course materials prior to the program date.

Faculty

AAG Brian F. McDonough is an Assistant Attorney General with the Division of Law's Affirmative Civil Enforcement Practice Group. Prior to joining the Division of Law, he was in private practice with Drinker Biddle & Reath and a predecessor law firm, Shanley & Fisher for twenty-nine years where he specialized in securities and commercial litigation in the New York and New Jersey State and federal courts, as well as in arbitration tribunals throughout the country. Throughout the course of his career, he has also devoted significant amounts of time to pro bono civil rights and capital post-conviction litigation. He began his career as a law clerk to former New Jersey Supreme Court Justice Robert Wilentz. AAG McDonough holds an undergraduate degree in political science from Rutgers College and a J.D. from the New York University School of Law.
